2	Whereas Specialist Cody James Patterson was born on April 12, 1989, in
3	Corvallis, to Randall Lee Patterson and Nancy Patterson Wilson; and
4	Whereas apart from his time in the military, Spc. Patterson was a lifelong
5	resident of Oregon, living primarily in Philomath and Benton County, and
6	grew up on Powder House Hill in Philomath as an active and happy little
7	boy; and
8	Whereas Spc. Patterson attended Clemens Primary School, Philomath
9	Middle School and Philomath High School and was an active member of the
10	Peace Lutheran Church; and
11	Whereas while in high school, Spc. Patterson was captain of the football
12	team, was honored as "Mr. PHS" for his community service activities and
13	athletic achievements, and went out of his way to connect with his class-
14	mates and make friends; and
15	Whereas after graduating from high school in 2007, Spc. Patterson held
16	several jobs while attending Linn-Benton Community College, where he
17	studied such subjects as business, psychology, music and ultimate frisbee;
18	and
19	Whereas Spc. Patterson enlisted in the United States Army in 2011 and
20	shipped out for basic training on January 3, 2012, after celebrating what
21	would be his last Christmas with his family in 2011; and

- Whereas Spc. Patterson's military education included the Basic Airborne
- 2 Course and the Ranger Assessment and Selection Program (RASP); and
- 3 Whereas after graduating from RASP, Spc. Patterson was assigned in
- 4 November 2012 to Company B, 3rd Battalion, 75th Ranger Regiment, where
- 5 he served as a rifleman for both of his deployments to Afghanistan; and
- 6 Whereas Spc. Patterson was killed in action by an improvised explosive
- 7 device that detonated while Spc. Patterson was conducting combat oper-
- 8 ations in support of Operation Enduring Freedom on October 6, 2013, in
- 9 Kandahar Province, Afghanistan; and
- 10 Whereas when word broke of Spc. Patterson's fate, his hometown re-
- 11 sponded by lowering all flags to half-staff, and crowds lined the street the
- 12 day he returned to Oregon for the last time; and
- Whereas Spc. Patterson knew that serving his country is what he was
- meant to do and ultimately sacrificed his life to uphold his mission; and
- Whereas Spc. Patterson was a role model for many in both civilian and
- 16 military life, exhibiting intelligence, kindness and fearlessness; and
- 17 Whereas Spc. Patterson's awards and decorations include the National
- 18 Defense Service Medal, the Afghanistan Campaign Medal with Campaign
- 19 Star, the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, the Army Service Ribbon
- 20 and the Overseas Service Ribbon, and he was posthumously promoted to the
- 21 rank of Specialist and awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge, the Bronze
- 22 Star Medal with "V" Device, the Army Commendation Medal, the Purple
- 23 Heart and the NATO Medal; and
- Whereas Spc. Patterson will be remembered for his great sense of humor
- 25 and as an individual who was humble, kind, generous and driven and who
- 26 was loved by his family, his friends and his country; and
- Whereas Spc. Patterson is survived by his mother, Nancy Wilson, his
- 28 sisters, Nicole Patterson, Letitia Williams, Taylor Patterson and Mara
- 29 Wilson, his brothers, Elijah Williams and Kapriel Wilson, his grandparents,
- 30 Lucy and John Leach, and numerous aunts, uncles, cousins, nieces and
- 31 nephews and the legions of friends he made wherever he went; now, there-
