## **SUMMARY**

Revises provisions relating to liability arising out of skiing. Establishes duties for ski area operators.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## 1 A BILL FOR AN ACT

- 2 Relating to skiing; creating new provisions; amending ORS 30.970, 30.975,
- 3 30.985 and 30.990; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 30.970 is amended to read:
- 6 30.970. As used in ORS 30.970 to 30.990:
- 7 (1) "Freestyle terrain" means terrain parks and terrain features
- 8 including jumps, hits, ramps, banks, funboxes, jibs, rails, half-pipes,
- 9 quarter-pipes and other natural or constructed features.
- 10 [(1)] (2) "Inherent risks of skiing" includes, but is not limited to, those
- 11 dangers or conditions [which] that are an integral part of the sport, such
- 12 as changing weather conditions, variations or steepness in terrain, snow or
- 13 ice conditions, surface or subsurface conditions, bare spots, creeks and
- 14 gullies, forest growth, rocks, stumps, freestyle terrain, snow immersion,
- 15 movement of snow, lift towers and other structures and their components,
- 16 collisions with other skiers and a skier's failure to ski within the skier's own
- 17 ability.

- [(2)] (3) "Injury" means [any] personal injury or property damage or loss.
- 19 (4) "Movement of snow" means:
  - (a) Slides, sloughs or avalanches;

- (b) Natural or constructed depressions in snow, including tree wells;
  or
- 3 (c) Natural or constructed accumulations of snow, including 4 snowmaking mounds.
- [(3) "Skier" means any person who is in a ski area for the purpose of engaging in the sport of skiing or who rides as a passenger on any ski lift
- 7 device.]
- 8 [(4)] (5) "Ski area" means [any] an area designated and maintained by a 9 ski area operator for skiing.
- [(5)] (6) "Ski area operator" means those persons, and their agents, officers, employees or representatives, who operate a ski area.
- 12 (7) "Skier" means a person who is in a ski area for the purpose of 13 engaging in the sport of skiing or who rides as a passenger on an up-14 hill conveyance.
- 15 (8) "Skiing" means sliding or jumping on any form of snow or ice 16 on skis, a snowboard or any other sliding device.
- 17 (9) "Uphill conveyance" means aerial tramways, aerial lifts, surface 18 lifts, tows and conveyors.
- 19 **SECTION 2.** ORS 30.975 is amended to read:
- 30.975. (1) In accordance with ORS 31.600 and notwithstanding ORS 31.620
- 21 (2), an individual who engages in the sport of skiing, alpine or nordic, ac-
- 22 cepts and assumes the inherent risks of skiing [insofar as they are reasonably
- 23 obvious, expected or necessary].
- 24 (2) A skier may not bring an action against a ski area operator for 25 any injury arising out of the inherent risks of skiing.
- 26 **SECTION 3.** ORS 30.985 is amended to read:
- 30.985. (1) Skiers [*shall*] have duties [*which*] **that** include but are not limited to the following:
- [(a) Skiers who ski in any area not designated for skiing within the permit area assume the inherent risks thereof.]
- [(b)] (a) Skiers [shall be] are the sole judges of the limits of their skills

- 1 and of their ability to meet and overcome the inherent risks of skiing [and].2
- (b) Skiers shall maintain reasonable control of speed, [and] course, 3 maneuvers and actions.
- (c) Skiers shall abide by the directions, [and instructions of the ski area 5 operator] instructions, signs, markings and warnings given or present 6 at a ski area. 7
- (d) Skiers shall familiarize themselves with [posted] information on the 8 location and degree of difficulty of [trails and slopes to the extent reasonably 9 possible] a run, slope, trail or terrain before skiing on [any slope or trail] 10 the run, slope, trail or terrain. 11
- 12 (e) Skiers [shall] **may** not cross the uphill track of any surface lift except at points clearly designated by the ski area operator. 13
- (f) Skiers [shall] may not overtake [any other] another skier except in 14 such a manner as to avoid contact and shall grant the right of way to the 15 overtaken skier. Any resulting contact or collision is the sole responsi-16 bility of the overtaking skier and not the ski area operator. 17
- (g) Skiers shall yield to other skiers when entering a trail or starting 18 downhill. 19
- (h) Skiers may not stop in a place that creates a hazard or where 20 the skier is not visible from above. 21
- [(h)] (i) Skiers [must wear retention straps or other] shall use devices to 22prevent runaway skis. 23
- [(i)] (j) Skiers [shall not board rope tows, wire rope tows, j-bars, t-bars, ski 24 lifts or other similar devices may not use an uphill conveyance unless 25 they have sufficient ability to use the [devices, and] conveyance, including, 26 but not limited to, sufficient ability to embark and disembark from the 27 conveyance. Skiers shall follow [any written or verbal] instructions, signs, 28 markings or warnings that are given or present regarding the [devices]
- 29 uphill conveyance. 30
  - [(j) Skiers, when involved in a skiing accident, shall not depart from the

- 1 ski area without leaving their names and addresses if reasonably possible.]
- 2 (k) Skiers involved in an accident at a ski area shall leave contact 3 information with the ski area operator before departing the ski area.
- 4 A skier who is injured [should, if reasonably possible,] shall give notice of
- 5 the injury to the ski area operator before leaving the ski area unless the
- 6 ski area operator already has notice of the injury.
- 7 (L) Skiers [shall] **may** not embark or disembark from [a ski lift] **an uphill** 8 **conveyance** except at designated areas or by the authority of the ski area 9 operator.
- 10 (m) Skiers shall inspect freestyle terrain before use.
- 11 (2) Ski area operators have no duty to judge the limits of a skier's skills or to judge a skier's ability to meet and overcome the inherent risks of skiing.
- 14 (3) Ski area operators have no duty to judge a skier's ability to use 15 an uphill conveyance.
- [(2)] (4) Violation of any of the duties of skiers set forth in subsection (1) of this section entitles the ski area operator to withdraw the violator's
- 19 **SECTION 4.** ORS 30.990 is amended to read:

privilege of skiing.

- 20 30.990. (1) A ski area operator has the following duties:
- (a) A ski area [operators] operator shall give notice to skiers of their duties under ORS 30.985 in a manner reasonably calculated to inform skiers of those duties, but skiers are presumed to know their duties under ORS 30.985.
- (b) A ski area operator shall construct, operate, maintain and repair uphill conveyances in accordance with nationally recognized safety standards for uphill conveyances.
- (c) A ski area operator shall post a sign at the bottom of each uphill conveyance that advises passengers to seek advice if the passenger is not familiar with using the conveyance.
  - (d) A ski area operator shall maintain at least one trail board at a

- 1 prominent location at each ski area displaying that area's network of ski trails and slopes with each trail and slope rated by its degree of 2 difficulty. 3
- (e) A ski area operator shall place a sign at or near the beginning 4 of a named trail or slope containing the appropriate symbol of the 5 degree of difficulty of the trail or slope. 6
- (f) A ski area operator shall mark designated freestyle terrain with 7 a symbol recognized by the National Ski Areas Association.
- (g) A ski area operator shall provide notice of which trails and 9 slopes are open and closed. 10
- (h) A ski area operator shall provide notice when snow grooming 11 or snowmaking operations are occurring in an area open to the public.
- (i) A ski area operator shall post a notice requiring the use of de-13 vices to prevent runaway skis. 14
- (j) A ski area operator shall post a sign marking the location of 15 16 hydrants and other equipment used in snowmaking operations in the ski area. 17
- (k) A ski area operator shall provide a qualified ski patrol meeting 18 the standards of the National Ski Patrol system. 19
- (2) This section does not create any duty owed by a ski area oper-20 ator to a trespasser in the ski area or an unauthorized user of the ski 2122 area.
- SECTION 5. The amendments to ORS 30.970, 30.975, 30.985 and 30.990 23 by sections 1 to 4 of this 2016 Act apply only to skiing occurring on 24 or after the effective date of this 2016 Act. 25
- SECTION 6. This 2016 Act being necessary for the immediate pres-26 ervation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is de-27 clared to exist, and this 2016 Act takes effect on its passage. 28
