SUMMARY

Expands definition of physical injury in Oregon Criminal Code to include physical trauma when injured person is vulnerable victim.

- 2 Relating to physical injury; amending ORS 161.015.
- 3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
- 4 **SECTION 1.** ORS 161.015 is amended to read:
- 5 161.015. As used in chapter 743, Oregon Laws 1971, and ORS 166.635, un-
- 6 less the context requires otherwise:
- 7 (1) "Dangerous weapon" means any weapon, device, instrument, material
- 8 or substance which under the circumstances in which it is used, attempted
- 9 to be used or threatened to be used, is readily capable of causing death or
- 10 serious physical injury.
- 11 (2) "Deadly weapon" means any instrument, article or substance specif-
- 12 ically designed for and presently capable of causing death or serious physical
- 13 injury.
- 14 (3) "Deadly physical force" means physical force that under the circum-
- 15 stances in which it is used is readily capable of causing death or serious
- 16 physical injury.
- 17 (4) "Peace officer" means:
- 18 (a) A member of the Oregon State Police;
- 19 (b) A sheriff, constable, marshal, municipal police officer or reserve offi-
- 20 cer as defined in ORS 133.005, or a police officer commissioned by a univer-
- 21 sity under ORS 352.121 or 353.125;

- 1 (c) An investigator of the Criminal Justice Division of the Department 2 of Justice or investigator of a district attorney's office;
- 3 (d) A humane special agent as defined in ORS 181A.345;
- 4 (e) A regulatory specialist exercising authority described in ORS 471.775 5 (2);
- 6 (f) An authorized tribal police officer as defined in ORS 181A.680; and
- 7 (g) Any other person designated by law as a peace officer.
- 8 (5) "Person" means a human being and, where appropriate, a public or 9 private corporation, an unincorporated association, a partnership, a govern-10 ment or a governmental instrumentality.
- 11 (6) "Physical force" includes, but is not limited to, the use of an electrical 12 stun gun, tear gas or mace.
- 13 (7) "Physical injury" means:

- (a) Impairment of physical condition or substantial pain.
- 15 (b) If the injured person is a vulnerable victim, impairment of 16 physical condition, substantial pain or physical trauma.
- 17 (8) "Physical trauma" includes but is not limited to fractures, cuts, 18 punctures, bruises, burns or other wounds.
- [(8)] (9) "Serious physical injury" means physical injury which creates a substantial risk of death or which causes serious and protracted disfigurement, protracted impairment of health or protracted loss or impairment of the function of any bodily organ.
- [(9)] (10) "Possess" means to have physical possession or otherwise to exercise dominion or control over property.
- [(10)] (11) "Public place" means a place to which the general public has access and includes, but is not limited to, hallways, lobbies and other parts of apartment houses and hotels not constituting rooms or apartments designed for actual residence, and highways, streets, schools, places of amusement, parks, playgrounds and premises used in connection with public passenger transportation.
 - (12) "Vulnerable victim" means a dependent person or an elderly
