## HOUSE BILLS

**HB4008** Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Education) -- Relating to distributions of state funds for the education of youths in confinement; prescribing an effective date.

Allows Oregon State Lottery to use moneys allocated for payment of costs of administration of state lottery to pay expenses incurred to implement policies related to problem gambling, to collect data

related to problem gambling and to advertise availability of programs for treatment of problem gambling.

Allows person that uses natural gas or propane in motor vehicle to pay annual special use fuel license fee in lieu of per-gallon tax.
