Provides that city or county may not require precious metal secondhand dealer that is also pawnbroker to provide photograph of item of precious metal acquired in transaction.

HB4021 By Representative MATTHEWS, Senators BOQUIST, OLSEN; Representatives FAGAN, PARRISH, WHISNANT, Senator MONNES ANDERSON (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to veterans' educational benefits; declaring an emergency.
