## SENATE BILLS

**SB 5701** By COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

Adjusts biennial allocations of lottery moneys to Oregon Business Development Department.

Limits expenditures from federal funds collected or received by Department of Transportation for public safety broadband planning for six-year period beginning July 1, 2013.

Requires providers of radio communications service for cellular devices to provide, at request of law enforcement agency, call location information of cellular device used to place 9-1-1 call requesting emergency assistance or reasonably believed to be in possession of individual in emergency situation that involves risk of death or serious physical harm to individual.

**HB 4029** By Representative KENNEMER, Senator ROBLAN; Representative FAGAN, Senators OLSEN, THOMSEN (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to the withdrawal of property from a city; declaring an emergency.
