SENATE JOINT MEMORIALS

SJM 7 By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP, Representatives STARK, WILSON – Urging President and Congress to transfer federal lands within Oregon to State of Oregon.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Urges President and Congress to transfer federal lands within Oregon to State of Oregon.

SJM 8 By Senator GIROD – Urging United States Army Corps of Engineers to adopt Preferred Alternative/Management Plan to reduce population of double-crested cormorants in Columbia River Estuary.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Urges United States Army Corps of Engineers to adopt Preferred Alternative/Management Plan described in draft Environmental Impact Statement to reduce double-crested cormorant population and to protect juvenile salmonids in Columbia River Estuary.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 10 By Senator WINTERS – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to administrative rules.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to administrative rules.

SJR 11 By Senators GIROD, BOQUIST – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to noneconomic damages.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to limit awards of noneconomic damages against nonprofit corporations to \$1 million.

SJR 12 By Senators GIROD, BOQUIST – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to noneconomic damages.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to limit awards of noneconomic damages against religious organizations to \$1 million.

SJR 13 By Senators GIROD, BOQUIST – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to legislative review of administrative rules.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require Legislative Assembly to approve each administrative rule or amendment of administrative rule adopted by executive branch agency before taking effect.

SENATE BILLS

SB 1 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representative GREENLICK (at the request of Joint Interim Committee on Health Insurance Transition) – Relating to the health insurance exchange; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Abolishes Oregon Health Insurance Exchange Corporation and board of directors of corporation and transfers functions and duties to Department of Consumer and Business Services.

SB 6 By Senator COURTNEY – Relating to the Commission for the Blind; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Extends terms of office of members of Commission for the Blind.

SB 7 By Senator COURTNEY – Relating to procurement authority for the Oregon Health Authority; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to exercise procurement authority under Public Contracting Code and under supervision of Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for specified purposes.

SB 500 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives GORSEK, PILUSO – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for construction of Boys & Girls Club in Rockwood neighborhood of Gresham.

SB 501 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives GORSEK, PILUSO – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Youth Authority for East Metro Gang Enforcement Team gang intervention services in east Multnomah County.

SB 502 By Senator MONROE – Relating to vehicle headlight use.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires use of headlights when windshield wipers are on.

SB 503 By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS; Senators BOQUIST, GELSER, STEINER HAYWARD, THOMSEN, Representatives HUFFMAN, NATHANSON, WILLIAMSON – Relating to assistance for victims of sexual assault.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services to identify applicants for and recipients of assistance under temporary assistance for needy families program who are victims of sexual assault or at risk for being victims of sexual assault.

SB 504 By Senators KNOPP, GIROD – Relating to testing requirements for children not taught in public school; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates authority of superintendent of education service district to take action involving student not taught in public school if student receives low test score.

SB 505 By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, BATES – Relating to the influenza virus.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires, from October 1 through March 1 of each year, each hospital in this state to make offer to each patient of hospital who is 65 years of age or older to immunize patient against influenza virus.

SB 506 By Senator KNOPP – Relating to the need for buildable land for housing.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies process for determining need for buildable land to meet estimated need for housing.

SB 507 By Senator KNOPP – Relating to needed housing in urbanizable areas.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions related to inclusion of needed housing within urban growth boundaries.

SB 508 By Senator KNOPP – Relating to expedited land divisions.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions authorizing expedited land divisions.

SB 509 By Senator KNOPP – Relating to review of land use decisions.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies review process for post-acknowledgment land use decisions.

SB 510 By Senator ROSENBAUM – Relating to actions for unfair claim settlement practices; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits plaintiff to file action against insurer or other person for committing or performing unfair claim settlement practice.

SB 511 By Senator THATCHER – Relating to collection of data regarding offense of driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to conduct study of data collection methods relating to driving while under influence of intoxicants and to report findings to Legislative Assembly.

SB 512 By Senator THATCHER – Relating to the period of time that an ignition interlock device is required to be installed.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Continues ignition interlock device requirement under certain circumstances.

SB 513 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT – Relating to the crime of trafficking in persons; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands crime of trafficking in persons to increase age limit of persons trafficked for purpose of engaging in commercial sex act and to include advertising for trafficking activities.

SB 514 By Senator KNOPP, Representative BUEHLER – Relating to privacy.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires public body to have warrant to obtain, from provider of electronic communication service or remote computing service, contents of communication stored or transmitted by provider or any information pertaining to subscriber or customer of provider.

SB 515 By Senators THATCHER, ROBLAN, Representatives WHISNANT, BARNHART; Representative STARK – Relating to the Oregon transparency website.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires provision of method for users to offer suggestions on form and content of Oregon transparency website.

SB 516 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT – Relating to use of fees charged by counties for certain housing programs.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Housing and Community Services Department to dedicate and use portion of moneys deposited in certain housing accounts from County Assessment and Taxation Fund for benefit of county from which fees deposited into fund were charged and collected.

SB 517 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT – Relating to resident uniformed services appreciation licenses; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes free resident uniformed services appreciation hunting and angling licenses for persons who are residents of state and who are members of uniformed services.

SB 518 By Senator DEMBROW – Relating to associate degrees at public universities; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to convene work group of representatives from public universities and community colleges to determine whether 40-40-20 mission would be enhanced by enabling universities to award associate degrees.

SB 519 By Senator DEMBROW – Relating to fiscal systems for community colleges; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs community college districts to use uniform budget and accounting system.

SB 520 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to vaccinations administered by pharmacists; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits pharmacists to administer vaccines to individuals at least seven years of age.

SB 521 By Senator STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives KENY-GUYER, DAVIS; Senators BEYER, GELSER, HASS, ROBLAN, Representatives BUCKLEY, HOYLE – Relating to concussions; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits coach to allow member of school athletic team and nonschool athletic team to participate in athletic event or training at any time after athletic trainer determines that member has not suffered concussion.

SB 522 By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP, Representative STARK – Relating to short-term transitional leave; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study of efficacy of short-term transitional leave program.

SB 523 By Senators STEINER HAYWARD, KRUSE; Senators BATES, KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, HOLVEY, KENY-GUYER, LIVELY, OLSON, WEIDNER – Relating to obligations of insurers offering qualified health plans through a health insurance exchange.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires insurer to provide specified notifications to health care providers regarding coverage under qualified health plan offered by insurer through health insurance exchange.

SB 524 By Senators KNOPP, MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS – Relating to life-sustaining procedures.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires health care facility to provide to patient or resident, in writing and within 12 hours of admission, facility's policy, if any,

concerning provision of life-sustaining procedures that are not likely to benefit patient's or resident's medical condition.

SB 525 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives WILLIAMSON, VEGA PEDERSON, LININGER, PILUSO; Senators DEVLIN, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives HUFFMAN, SMITH WARNER – Relating to possession of firearms by certain persons.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits possession of firearm or ammunition by person who is subject to restraining order issued by court under Family Abuse Prevention Act or who has been convicted of certain misdemeanor crimes involving domestic violence.

SB 526 By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS, Representative PILUSO; Senators BOQUIST, DEVLIN, GELSER, KNOPP, STEINER HAYWARD, THOMSEN, Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to crime.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies definition of "physical injury" for purposes of criminal code.

SB 527 By Senators GIROD, BOQUIST – Relating to administrative rules.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies existing administrative rule review process to require legislative approval of newly adopted administrative rules in order for rules to take effect.

SB 528 By Senator GIROD – Relating to firearms.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides persons licensed to carry concealed handgun in another state with protections provided to persons with Oregon concealed handgun license.

SB 529 By Senator GIROD – Relating to Oregon Opportunity Grants.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that at least 25 percent of Oregon Opportunity Grant moneys be awarded to students committed to majoring in science, technology, engineering or mathematics fields.

SB 530 By Senator GIROD – Relating to tax credits for interest paid on qualified education loans; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates credit against income taxes for amounts paid as interest on qualified education loans.

SB 531 By Senators GIROD, BOQUIST – Relating to compensation received during performance of military duty; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes provision that public officer or employee who leaves position to perform military duty may not, while performing military duty, receive amount of pay entitled to before leave of absence.

SB 532 By Senators GIROD, BATES; Senators MONROE, ROBLAN, Representatives KOMP, SPRENGER,

WITT – Relating to scholarships for health care practitioners; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Transfers administration of Scholars for a Healthy Oregon Initiative from Oregon Health and Science University to Office of Rural Health.

SB 533 By Senator EDWARDS, Representative WHISNANT; Senator HANSELL, Representatives BARKER, HUFFMAN, LIVELY – Relating to authority to proceed at a stop light.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits motorcycle driver to proceed at stop light under certain conditions.

SB 534 By Senators GIROD, JOHNSON – Relating to the provision of city services to an airport; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes city and airport to enter into agreement pursuant to which city provides sewer and water services to airport without requiring annexation, or consent to eventual annexation, to city of territory on which airport is situated.

SB 535 By Senators GIROD, ROBLAN, KRUSE, JOHNSON - - Relating to the liability of public bodies for injuries related to the ocean; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that public body has no responsibility to post warnings related to dangers of ocean.

SB 536 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to the regional service delivery systems for public educational entities; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Education to assist public educational entities with developing regional service delivery systems for purpose of providing efficient and effective services for public educational entities.

SB 537 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to standing in proceedings regarding water; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Standing in Proceedings Regarding Water.

SB 538 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to school-based health centers; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Education to conduct evaluation on methods to improve effectiveness of school-based health centers.

SB 539 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to service animals.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Bureau of Labor and Industries to study issues surrounding use of service animals in Oregon and to report findings to Legislative Assembly.

SB 540 By Senator WINTERS – Relating to marijuana; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits retail sellers of marijuana for recreational use and medical marijuana facilities from being located within 1,000 feet of certified child care facility or preschool recorded program.

SB 541 By Senator WINTERS – Relating to the Sunset Advisory Committee; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Sunset Advisory Committee.

SB 542 By Senator WINTERS (at the request of League of Oregon Cities) – Relating to local governments' regulation of marijuana; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Repeals sections of Ballot Measure 91 (2014) that prescribe manner in which local governments may regulate production, processing, wholesale sale, retail sale and taxation of marijuana.

SB 543 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON – Relating to treatments for patients with terminal diseases.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates method by which health care practitioner may offer to treat patient who has terminal disease with drug, biological product or device not approved by United States Food and Drug Administration.

SB 544 By Senator JOHNSON (at the request of Chad Allen) – Relating to liability for damages resulting from habitat or water quality improvement projects.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates limitation on liability for damages resulting from certain fish and wildlife habitat improvement projects and watershed or stream restoration or enhancement programs.

SB 545 By Senator RILEY – Relating to offenses committed in a motor vehicle when a person under 18 years of age is in the motor vehicle.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes offense of smoking in motor vehicle primary offense.

SB 546 By Senator RILEY – Relating to vehicle headlight use.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires use of headlights when windshield wipers are on.

SB 547 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON – Relating to nurse emeritus licenses; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates nurse emeritus license to permit certain retired nurses to engage in volunteer practice of nursing.

SB 548 By Senator JOHNSON (at the request of Tillamook County) – Relating to the transfer of property by a county to an Indian tribe; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes county to sell or donate real property to certain federally recognized Indian tribes.

SB 549 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Mark Hazelton) – Relating to nonconforming schools in exclusive farm use zones; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows nonconforming public or private school on land zoned for exclusive farm use to expand on contiguous land acquired by school after school became nonconforming.

SB 550 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Tom Phelps) – Relating to reemployment of retired public employees; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts retired member of Public Employees Retirement System from limitations on reemployment if member is reemployed by fire department or rural fire protection district that serves population of fewer than 15,000 residents.

SB 551 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Dale Burlison) – Relating to bicycle registration.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires registration of bicycles.

SB 552 By Senator GELSER, Representative VEGA PEDERSON – Relating to employment of domestic workers.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes certain workplace protections for domestic workers.

SB 553 By Senator GELSER; Senators ROBLAN, ROSENBAUM, Representative KOMP – Relating to school disciplinary policies; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Imposes limits on instances when student under 12 years of age may be suspended or expelled from school.

SB 554 By Senator GELSER; Senator ROBLAN – Relating to school discipline; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Education to assist school districts in achieving specified goals related to school discipline.

SB 555 By Senator GELSER – Relating to working conditions for individuals with disabilities in qualified nonprofit agencies; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities to pay at least minimum wage or prevailing rate of wage set forth in state or federal law to individuals with disabilities.

SB 556 By Senator GELSER; Senators ROBLAN, ROSENBAUM, Representatives HUFFMAN, KOMP, SPRENGER – Relating to truancy; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits use of expulsion to address truancy.

SB 557 By Senator GELSER – Relating to the use of physical force; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies scope of justifiable use of physical force for purposes of criminal prosecution.

SB 558 By Senator GELSER – Relating to pharmacists.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires health benefit plan to reimburse cost of pharmacist consultation that meets specified criteria.

SB 559 By Senator GELSER; Senators DEMBROW, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS – Relating to telephone services provided to inmates of correctional facilities.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Department of Corrections to adopt rules that prohibit department's correctional facilities from having contract with provider of telephone services under which department or facility receives payment for telephone services provided to inmates of facility.

SB 560 By Senator GELSER – Relating to special education evaluations; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes timelines by which evaluations must be completed to determine eligibility for special education.

SB 561 By Senator GELSER – Relating to suicide; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to submit report to interim legislative committees no later than July 1, 2016, regarding occurrences of suicide and status of suicide prevention efforts in Oregon.

SB 562 By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP – Relating to funding for educational options; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Oregon Empowerment Scholarship Program for purpose of providing options in education to students of this state.

SB 563 By Senators KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON – Relating to untested evidence collection kits; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires law enforcement agencies to submit to Attorney General report stating number of untested sexual assault evidence collection kits in possession of law enforcement agency and date on which evidence was collected.

SB 564 By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, KRUSE – Relating to the registry system for the collection of information related to cancer; declaring an emergency.

2-2(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Specifies that personally identifiable information may not be reported to Oregon Health Authority for purposes related to collecting data related to cancer and benign tumors of brain and central nervous system.
