## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

**SJR 14** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to state finance.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution providing that surpluses of personal income tax revenues in excess of two percent of forecast revenues are equally deposited in reserve fund established by law and returned to personal income taxpayers.

**SJR 15** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Common Ground OR-WA) – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to establishment of land-value lease fee.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to establish land-value lease fee imposed on real market value of land with proceeds distributed pro rata to residents of state.

## SENATE BILLS

**SB 565** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to a tax credit for historic property rehabilitation contributions; prescribing an effective date.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates tax credit for certified historic property rehabilitation contributions.

**SB 566** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to data centers; declaring an emergency.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Data Centers.

**SB 567** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to state finance.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires interest on moneys in General Fund to be deposited into Oregon Rainy Day Fund.

**SB 568** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to the taxation of intangible property; declaring an emergency.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on the Taxation of Intangible Property.

**SB 569** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to privilege taxation of communications services; prescribing an effective date.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Broadens types of communications services on which municipalities may impose privilege tax.

**SB 570** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to intangible property; prescribing an effective date.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that, for purposes of central assessment, Department of Revenue may not assign value to company's intangible property greater than \_\_\_ percent of historical or original cost of company's real and tangible personal property.

**SB 571** By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to data centers; prescribing an effective date.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

For purposes of exclusion from central assessment, removes requirement that data center company have tax abatement agreement with sponsors of enterprise zone.

**SB 572** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative HOYLE – Relating to postage for ballots.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires state to pay for postage prepaid return identification envelopes provided to electors for each primary, general or statewide special election.

**SB 573** By Senator DEMBROW (at the request of Common Ground OR-WA) – Relating to land value taxation; prescribing an effective date.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Land Value Taxation to compare methods of property taxation.

**SB 574** By Senators SHIELDS, OLSEN; Representatives BOONE, OLSON – Relating to restoration work on structures following a disaster.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires person providing restoration work on residential or small commercial structure following man-made or natural disaster to have appropriate license endorsement issued by Construction Contractors Board.

**SB 575** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Center for Intercultural Organizing) – Relating to consent to search; declaring an emergency.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires police officer to inform person stopped for traffic violation or upon suspicion of criminal activity that person has right to refuse request to search.

**SB 576** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Richard Sharp) – Relating to the placement of wards in the custody of the Department of Human Services.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes case planning and placement decisions for wards in custody of Department of Human Services responsibility of case planning committee convened by department and composed of relevant parties and stakeholders with interest in ward's welfare, case planning and placement.

**SB 577** By Senator BOQUIST -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Justice for various public safety purposes in support of rural or fiscally distressed counties.
