SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 16 By Senator DEMBROW; Senators MONROE, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, Representatives FREDERICK, GALLEGOS, KENY-GUYER, NOSSE (at the request of Jim Howell) – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the use of motor vehicle-related revenue.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to authorize use of motor vehicle-related revenue for infrastructure that reduces traffic burden of, or pollution from, motor vehicles on public roads in this state.

SR 1 By Senator SHIELDS, Representative FREDERICK – In memoriam: Christine Poole-Jones, 1944-2014.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

SENATE BILLS

SB 599 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to marijuana; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Justice to study and report on laws of this state impacted by vote on initiative measures relating to marijuana.

SB 600 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Approves adoption of and modifications to rules of Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.

SB 601 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to enforcement of notification requirements for breaches of security involving personal information.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands definition of "personal information" for purposes of Oregon Consumer Identity Theft Protection Act.

SB 602 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to criminal records checks for professions that involve essential services; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Criminal Records Checks for Professions that Involve Essential Services.

SB 603 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to provisions required in insurance policies; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that insurer may not offer or issue policy, contract or certificate of insurance that provides that insurer has sole right or right that is superior to right of insured to interpret terms and conditions of policy, contract or certificate or that specifies standard of interpretation or review that is inconsistent with laws of this state.

SB 604 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Repeals former provisions of Uniform Interstate Family Support Act.

SB 605 By COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Department of Administrative Services to set schedule for allocation of lottery moneys to pay lottery bond principal, interest and premium due.

SB 606 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representative KENY-GUYER – Relating to dental pilot project; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Extends dental pilot project by five years.

SB 607 By COMMITTEE ON RULES – Relating to election petitions; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires signature gatherers or organizers of county, city or district initiative, referendum or recall petitions to register with Secretary of State in same manner as signature gatherers of state measures, unless otherwise provided by county ordinance, city ordinance or district ordinance.

SB 608 By Senators STEINER HAYWARD, KRUSE; Senators KNOPP, MONNES ANDERSON, SHIELDS, Representatives GREENLICK, NOSSE (at the request of American Cancer Society-Cancer Action Network) – Relating to palliative care.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council in Oregon Health Authority.

SB 609 By Senator STEINER HAYWARD; Senators BEYER, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, Representatives LIVELY, NOSSE – Relating to payments for health care; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to convene learning collaborative to develop payment method to support provision of care through patient centered primary care homes.

SB 610 By Senator SHIELDS, Representative GORSEK; Senators BATES, DEMBROW, RILEY, ROSENBAUM, STEINER, HAYWARD, Representatives BARNHART, BUCKLEY, FREDERICK, GREENLICK, KENY-GUYER, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER, VEGA PEDERSON (at the request of Jobs with Justice and 15 NOW Oregon) – Relating to minimum wage rate; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases Oregon minimum wage rate in graduated steps to \$15 per hour by 2018.

SB 611 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to central assessment.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Revenue to study issue of central assessment.

SB 612 By Senators HASS, ROBLAN, Representatives TAYLOR, HOYLE; Senators BATES, GELSER, Representatives KENY-GUYER, NOSSE, READ – Relating to dyslexia.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires school districts to screen students for risk factors for dyslexia and to ensure specified staff members receive training related to dyslexia.

SB 613 By Senator DEMBROW, Representative LININGER; Senators BATES, GELSER, PROZANSKI, Representatives BARNHART, BUCKLEY, HELM, HOLVEY – Relating to activities with potential adverse effects on health; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires filing notice with State Forestry Department of proposed aerial application of pesticide or proposed use of fire as planned forest management activity on privately owned forestland.

SB 614 By Senators KNOPP, COURTNEY – Relating to animals in motor vehicles.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that peace officer may enter motor vehicle and impound animal when peace officer is authorized by law and has probable cause to believe animal is being subjected to certain criminal offenses.

SB 615 By Senators BEYER, ROBLAN, ROSENBAUM, Representatives WILLIAMSON, READ – Relating to retirement investments; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Oregon Retirement Savings Board in office of State Treasurer.

SB 616 By Senators GELSER, WINTERS – Relating to the Community Housing Trust Account within the Developmental Disabilities Community Housing Fund; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Treasurer to conduct investigation of Community Housing Trust Account, within Developmental Disabilities

Community Housing Fund, and to recommend investment strategy to maximize interest and income in account.

SB 617 By Senator GELSER – Relating to persons with developmental disabilities; declaring an emergency.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Housing for Persons with Intellectual or Developmental Disabilities.

SB 618 By Senator GELSER; Representatives OLSON, RAYFIELD – Relating to identification cards for homeless youth.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to identify and enter into agreements with nonprofit organizations to assist homeless youth in obtaining identification cards from Department of Transportation.

SB 619 By Senators GELSER, DEMBROW – Relating to discrimination in higher education.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits public universities from adopting school policies with respect to noncredit academic activities, or from refusing student application to, or enrollment or participation in, noncredit academic activity, solely on basis that student was not awarded standard high school diploma or General Educational Development (GED) certificate, or because student received modified or extended diploma.

SB 620 By Senator GELSER; Representatives BARNHART, NEARMAN – Relating to autonomous vehicles.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes process for certifying manufacturers for purposes of testing, selling or operating autonomous vehicles on highways of state.

SB 621 By Senator GELSER, Representative GREENLICK - - Relating to anatomical gifts.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits eye bank, tissue bank, procurement organization, hospital or physician from considering any disability of potential recipient of anatomical gift except to extent that disability makes potential recipient medically unsuitable to receive anatomical gift.

SB 622 By Senator GELSER, Representative BARTON; Representative KENY-GUYER – Relating to mandatory reporting of abuse.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Adds legislative staff and personal support workers to list of mandatory reporters of abuse of children, elderly persons and other vulnerable persons.

SB 623 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to alcohol.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates malt beverage and wine production restriction on winery licensee, or person having interest in winery licensee, that acquires full on-premises sales license.

SB 624 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to student housing at public universities.

2-10(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires agreements for student housing to permit students who pay all costs of housing for entire academic or calendar year but leave before agreement period is completed to receive pro rata refund of student housing costs.

2-10(S) First reading. Referred to President's desk.

This measure has a fiscal impact statement.

Authorizes court, as part of settlement or judgment in class action, to approve process for payment of damages.

HB2296 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Health Care) -- Relating to the names of state boards.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
 1-16 Referred to Health Care.
 2-2 Public Hearing and Work Session held.
 2-3 Recommendation: Do pass.
 2-4 Second reading.
 2-6 Third reading. Carried by Nosse. Passed.

 2-10(S) First reading. Referred to President's desk.

This measure has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

Changes name of Board of Body Art Practitioners to Board of Electrologists and Body Art Practitioners.

HB2306 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Health Care) -- Relating to prescription drugs; declaring an emergency.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
 1-16 Referred to Health Care.
 2-2 Public Hearing and Work Session held.
 2-3 Recommendation: Do pass.
 2-4 Second reading.
 2-6 Third reading. Carried by Hayden. Passed.
 Ayes, 57; Excused, 3--Hoyle, Krieger, Sprenger.
 2-10(S) First reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes Oregon Health Authority to limit providers from which medical assistance recipient may obtain prescription drugs if recipient meets specified criteria.

HB2700 By Representatives READ, WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARNHART, BUCKLEY, DOHERTY, FAGAN, FREDERICK, GALLEGOS, GOMBERG, GORSEK, GREENLICK, HELM, HOLVEY, HOYLE, KENY-GUYER, KOMP, KOTEK, LININGER, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NATHANSON, NOSSE, PILUSO, RAYFIELD, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, TAYLOR, VEGA PEDERSON, WITT (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to lawsuits; declaring an emergency.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
 1-16 Referred to Judiciary.
 2-2 Public Hearing held.
 2-3 Public Hearing and Work Session held.
 2-6 Recommendation: Do pass.
 Minority Recommendation: Do pass with amendments and be printed A-Engrossed.
 Second reading.
 2-9 Motion to substitute Minority Report for Committee Report failed.
