SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 17 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Richard P. Burke) – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to a right of individual privacy.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to recognize right to privacy.

SENATE BILLS

SB 625 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to pharmacy benefit managers; declaring an emergency.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Regulates pharmacy benefit manager practices with respect to filling and refilling prescriptions.

SB 626 By Senators KRUSE, BATES, MONNES ANDERSON – Relating to prescription drugs; declaring an emergency.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows additional persons to access information from prescription monitoring program.

SB 627 By Senator JOHNSON (at the request of City of Rainier) – Relating to the export of unprocessed timber.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts timber from city-owned lands of limited acreage from prohibition against export of unprocessed timber.

SB 628 By Senator HANSELL, Representative BARRETO – Relating to U.S. Highway 395.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Designates portion of U.S. Highway 395, known as Pendleton-John Day Highway, as Don Kendall Memorial Highway.

SB 629 By Senator SHIELDS, Representative GALLEGOS; Senators DEMBROW, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives FREDERICK, GREENLICK, KOMP, MCLAIN, REARDON (at the request of Western Regional Advocacy Project) – Relating to rights of persons experiencing homelessness.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Oregon Right to Rest Act.

SB 630 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to intangible property; prescribing an effective date.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides, for purposes of central assessment, that property of company subject to central assessment does not include intangible property.

SB 631 By Senators DEMBROW, SHIELDS, Representatives SMITH WARNER, WILLIAMSON; Senators MONROE, PROZANSKI, RILEY, Representatives BARKER, BARNHART, BUCKLEY, DOHERTY, FREDERICK, GALLEGOS, GOMBERG, GORSEK, HELM, HOLVEY, HOYLE, KENY-GUYER, LININGER, LIVELY, NATHANSON, NOSSE, RAYFIELD, REARDON, VEGA PEDERSON, WITT – Relating to statewide health care coverage; declaring an emergency.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Health Care for All Oregon Board to develop, implement and have oversight of Health Care for All Oregon Plan to be administered by Oregon Health Authority.

SB 632 By Senators SHIELDS, BAERTSCHIGER JR, Representative STARK; Senators RILEY, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BUEHLER, KENY-GUYER, OLSON – Relating to pilot programs to improve foster care; declaring an emergency.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to establish two pilot programs in rural and urban regions of this state to improve quality and effectiveness of foster care for children and wards placed in legal custody of department for care, placement and supervision.

SB 633 By Senator SHIELDS, Representative FREDERICK – Relating to racial and ethnic impact statements.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands Oregon Criminal Justice Commission requirement to create racial and ethnic impact statement to include proposed legislation relating to education policy.

SB 634 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BENTZ, DAVIS, ESQUIVEL, HACK, HAYDEN, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, MCLANE, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WEIDNER, WHITSETT, WILSON – Relating to the sunset of the homestead property tax deferral program; prescribing an effective date.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates sunset date of homestead property tax deferral program.

SB 635 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives WHISNANT, WEIDNER, HACK; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HAYDEN, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, MCLANE, NEARMAN, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WHITSETT, WILSON – Relating to estate tax.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that Oregon estate tax is not due unless value of Oregon taxable estate equals or exceeds \$5 million.

SB 636 By Senators KNOPP, BOQUIST, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT, MCLANE; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HACK, HAYDEN, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WEIDNER, WHITSETT, WILSON – Relating to concealed handgun licenses for servicemembers.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Reduces required age for concealed handgun license applicant to 18 years of age if applicant is servicemember.

SB 637 By Senator KNOPP, Representatives BUEHLER, WHISNANT; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BENTZ, DAVIS, ESQUIVEL, HACK, HAYDEN, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, MCLANE, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WEIDNER, WHITSETT, WILSON – Relating to the property tax exemption for personal property; prescribing an effective date.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases ceiling amount of total assessed value of taxable personal property for purposes of exemption from property taxation.

SB 638 By Senators KNOPP, BOQUIST; Senators HANSELL, HASS – Relating to county volunteer veterans' ombudsmen.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes county governing bodies to appoint county volunteer veterans' ombudsmen to provide support services and assistance to veterans and their spouses, dependents and survivors that are not provided by county veterans' service officers.

SB 639 By Senators SHIELDS, KNOPP, Representatives WILLIAMSON, HUFFMAN (at the request of ACLU) – Relating to motor vehicle registration plate surveillance cameras.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Restricts use of motor vehicle registration plate surveillance cameras.

SB 640 By Senators SHIELDS, KNOPP, Representatives WILLIAMSON, HUFFMAN (at the request of ACLU) – Relating to privacy.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits public body from obtaining location information of electronic device without warrant except in certain circumstances.

SB 641 By Senators SHIELDS, KNOPP, Representatives WILLIAMSON, HUFFMAN (at the request of ACLU) – Relating to privacy.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits public body from obtaining information from portable electronic device without warrant except when imminent threat to public safety exists.

SB 642 By Senators KNOPP, OLSEN, THOMSEN; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, FERRIOLI, KRUSE – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for State School Fund.

HOUSE BILLS

HB 2047 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Rural Communities) – Relating to adjustments to reserve boundaries established in Washington County by the Legislative Assembly.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
1-16 Referred to Rural Communities, Land Use and Water.

2-3 Public Hearing held.

2-5 Work Session held.

2-6 Recommendation: Do pass.

2-9 Second reading.

HB 2173 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Secretary of State Kate Brown) – Relating to audits; declaring an emergency.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

1-16 Referred to Judiciary.

2-3 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

2-6 Recommendation: Do pass.

2-9 Second reading.

2-11 Third reading. Carried by Barton. Passed.

Requires Secretary of State, as State Auditor, to report fraud or other violations of criminal law to appropriate law enforcement agency, regardless of source of moneys involved in fraud or violation.

HB 2227 By Representatives HOYLE, GILLIAM (at the request of Oregon Elder Abuse Prevention Work Group) (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to abuse of elderly persons.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

1-16 Referred to Judiciary.

2-3 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

2-6 Recommendation: Do pass.

2-9 Second reading.

2-11 Third reading. Carried by Gilliam. Passed.

Exempts from definition of "sexual abuse" consensual sexual contact between elderly person and facility employee who is also spouse of elderly person.

HB2339 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary for Judicial Department) -- Relating to the interpretation of adjudicatory proceedings; declaring an emergency.

1-16 Referred to Judiciary.
2-2 Public Hearing and Work Session held.
2-6 Recommendation: Do pass.
Second reading.
2-9 Rules suspended. Carried over to February 11, 2015 Calendar.

Requires court to appoint interpreter and provide appropriate assistive communication device when necessary for crime victim who seeks to exercise certain constitutional rights in open court.
