SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 18 By Senator BEYER -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to an education support fund.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution directing Legislative Assembly to establish education support fund consisting of revenues from sales tax imposed at rate not to exceed ___ percent.

SJR 19 By Senator HANSELL; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, KNOPP, KRUSE, OLSEN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to declarations of emergency in legislation.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require bills declaring emergency to receive at least two-thirds vote of all members elected to each house for passage.

SENATE BILLS

SB 643 By Senator GELSER; Senator HASS -- Relating to early reading programs; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Kindergarten Through Grade Three Reading Initiative Program to assist school districts in implementing early reading literacy programs.

SB 644 By Senator GELSER -- Relating to amounts reserved from appropriations for capital construction; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires public body, except special district, to reserve one percent of appropriation for constructing, reconstructing or renovating park or public building for purpose of renovating or improving existing park or public building to meet current accessibility standards for persons with disabilities that are promulgated under Americans with Disabilities Act and regulations adopted under Act.

SB 645 By Senator GELSER; Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS -- Relating to juveniles.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates defense to charge of prostitution for person under 18 years of age.

SB 646 By Senator GELSER; Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS -- Relating to juveniles.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates defense to charge of prostitution for person under 18 years of age.

SB 647 By Senator OLSEN, Representative OLSON; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, JOHNSON, KNOPP, KRUSE, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BARRETO, BUEHLER, DAVIS, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, MCLANE, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Community College Support Fund for distribution to community colleges and community college service districts.

SB 648 By Senator KNOPP, Representative BUEHLER; Senator STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives HOYLE, MCLANE, WHISNANT, WILLIAMSON -- Relating to Central Oregon Health Council.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands duties of Central Oregon Health Council.

SB 649 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION -- Relating to compensability of workers' compensation claims.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies definitions of "compensable injury" and "preexisting condition" for purposes of workers' compensation claims.

SB 650 By Senator KNOPP; Senator BAERTSCHIGER JR -- Relating to savings accounts.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Oregon Universal Savings Account Board to create and maintain Oregon Universal Savings Account Program.

SB 651 By Senators FERRIOLI, WINTERS; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, GIROD, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, OLSEN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT -- Relating to elections for members of Legislative Assembly; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that candidate for state Senate or state Representative receive majority of votes cast in general election to be elected.

SB 652 By Senator KNOPP; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, KRUSE, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS -- Relating to a tax credit for dependent children; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes personal income tax credit of \$250 per dependent child.

SB 653 By Senators GIROD, WINTERS; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, KNOPP, KRUSE, OLSEN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT -- Relating to a paid sick leave tax credit; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates income tax credit for certain employers that provide paid sick leave, with restrictions.

SB 654 By Senators KNOPP, WINTERS; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, KRUSE, OLSEN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT – Relating to a paid family leave tax credit; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates income tax credit for certain employers that provide paid family leave, with restrictions.

SB 655 By Senator KNOPP; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WINTERS – Relating to amount of working family child care credit; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases amount of working family child care credit by doubling applicable percentage of taxpayer's child care expenses allowed as credit.

SB 656 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Richard P. Burke) – Relating to organizational documents of political parties; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires political parties to file organizational documents with Secretary of State setting forth organizational procedures.

SB 657 By Senator ROBLAN, Representatives KOMP, HACK; Senators BOQUIST, DEMBROW, GIROD, HANSELL, JOHNSON, KRUSE, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BARKER, BENTZ, CLEM, DAVIS, DOHERTY, GOMBERG, HOYLE, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KRIEGER, MCKEOWN, PARRISH, RAYFIELD, REARDON, SMITH, SPRENGER, WHITSETT, WITT – Relating to state finance.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for 2015 biennium for agricultural experiment station and branch station, Oregon State University Extension Service and Forest Research Laboratory programs of Oregon State University.

SB 658 By Senator JOHNSON, Representatives WITT, GREENLICK; Senator STEINER HAYWARD (at the request of Jerry Grossnickle) – Relating to wildlife habitat special assessment for certain land disqualified from western Oregon forestland special assessment; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows owners of land in Portland that was disqualified from western Oregon forestland special assessment for property tax year beginning on July 1, 2011, to request directly from State Fish and Wildlife Commission designation of land as eligible for wildlife habitat special assessment.

SB 659 By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND EARLY CHILDHOOD – Relating to community-based care for children.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that minor child be considered resident in determining eligibility for home and community-based care if child lives at least six weeks each year with parent residing in this state.

SB 660 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to providing dental services to children; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop program for screening students in this state who are susceptible to tooth decay and providing dental sealants for those students.

SB 661 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to opioid analgesic drug products.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires health benefit plan that covers opioid analgesic drug products to cover abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug products, at no greater cost to insured than other preferred drugs under plan, and specifies other requirements regarding coverage.

SB 662 By Senator GIROD – Relating to dental instructor licensing.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that dental instructor's license issued to specialist be restricted to specialty for which applicant completed advanced dental education program.

SB 663 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives GREENLICK, WHISNANT; Senators BATES, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BUEHLER, HAYDEN, KENNEMER, KENY-GUYER, LIVELY, NATHANSON, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER, WEIDNER – Relating to public health; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes governmental framework for conducting public health activities in this state and for providing public health services to residents of this state.

SB 664 By Senator DEMBROW, Representative REARDON – Relating to State School Fund distributions for students in career and technical education; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows for additional weights in State School Fund distributions for students who are enrolled in and earn three or more credits for courses that are part of approved career and technical education program.

SB 665 By Senator BEYER, Representative NOSSE – Relating to hospital charges.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Hospital Rate Commission in Oregon Health Authority to review hospital charges billed by certain hospitals and recommend to Oregon Health Authority whether to approve charges as reasonable based on prescribed criteria.

SB 666 By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP – Relating to eminent domain; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that offer of just compensation for condemned property may not be less than real market value of property as determined by county assessor or Department of Revenue.

SB 667 By Senators KRUSE, GELSER – Relating to small school districts; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes sunset related to grants distributed to small school districts with one or more small high schools.

SB 668 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to construction of facilities along public roads; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that right and privilege to construct, maintain or operate water, gas, electric or communication service line, fixture or other facility along public roads, free of charge, does not extend to county roads.

SB 669 By Senator KNOPP – Relating to a tax credit for contribution to charitable organization; prescribing an effective date.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes personal income tax credit for contributions to charitable organizations.

SB 670 By Senators STEINER HAYWARD, WINTERS; Senators BATES, BURDICK, DEVLIN, MONNES ANDERSON, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, Representative REARDON – Relating to the sharing of information between public bodies; declaring an emergency.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Justice to develop training curriculum and provide training to public employees, community providers and others on confidentiality requirements, privacy laws and sharing of information in order to consistently facilitate sharing of information between programs and entities wherever feasible.

SB 671 By Senator HANSELL, Representative BARRETO; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BATES, BOQUIST, GIROD, JOHNSON, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS, Representatives HUFFMAN, MCLANE, RAYFIELD, SMITH – Relating to property conveyances to the City of Pendleton.

2-17(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to transfer ownership of certain real property to City of Pendleton.

HB2036 By Representative HUFFMAN; Representatives BENTZ, BUEHLER, MCLANE, WHISNANT, WHITSETT (Presession filed.) – Relating to veterans memorial highways; declaring an emergency.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
 1-16 Referred to Veterans and Emergency Preparedness with subsequent referral to Ways and Means.
 2-5 Public Hearing held.
 2-10 Work Session held.
 2-11 Recommendation: Do pass and subsequent referral to Ways and Means be rescinded.
 Subsequent referral to Ways and Means rescinded by order of the Speaker.

Provides that U.S. Highway 395 shall be known as World War I Veterans Memorial Highway.

This measure has minimal fiscal impact, no statement issued.

Expands definition of "victim" to include estate, successor in interest, trust and other specified parties for purpose of ordering restitution in criminal case.

HB2335 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary) – Relating to the definition of :q2.enter or remain unlawfully;q2e.

HB2372 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of House Interim Committee on Judiciary) – Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants; declaring an emergency.

Requires that police officer be certified by Department of Public Safety Standards and Training rather than Board on Public Safety Standards and Training before officer may request urine test of person arrested for offense of driving while under influence of intoxicants.

HB2380 Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Presession filed (at the request of Attorney General Ellen F. Rosenblum) – Relating to post-conviction relief.

Authorizes court in post-conviction relief proceeding, upon joint motion of parties, to vacate judgment or order and remand proceeding to circuit court to reconsider judgment or order.
