SENATE RESOLUTIONS

SR 2 By Senator SHIELDS, Representative FREDERICK – In memoriam: Geneva Knauls, 1935-2014.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

SENATE BILLS

SB 672 By Senators GIROD, STEINER HAYWARD; Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives HAYDEN, KENY-GUYER (at the request of Oregon Dental Association) – Relating to state dental director.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes office of oral health within Oregon Health Authority to study and support oral health of citizens of this state.

SB 673 By Senators GIROD, STEINER HAYWARD; Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives HELM, KENY-GUYER (at the request of Oregon Dental Association) – Relating to administration of immunizations by dentists.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits licensed dentists to administer certain immunizations.

SB 674 By Senators ROSENBAUM, BEYER, DEMBROW, GELSER, Representatives JOHNSON, REARDON, ESQUIVEL; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BATES, BOQUIST, BURDICK, COURTNEY, DEVLIN, EDWARDS, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, HASS, JOHNSON, KNOPP, KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, OLSEN, PROZANSKI, RILEY, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS, Representatives BARKER, BARNHART, BARRETO, BARTON, BENTZ, BOONE, BUCKLEY, BUEHLER, CLEM, DAVIS, DOHERTY, EVANS, FAGAN, FREDERICK, GALLEGOS, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, GORSEK, GREENLICK, HACK, HAYDEN, HEARD, HELM, HOLVEY, HOYLE, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, KENY-GUYER, KOMP, KOTEK, KRIEGER, LININGER, LIVELY, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, MCLANE, NATHANSON, NEARMAN, NOSSE, OLSON, PARRISH, PILUSO, POST, RAYFIELD, READ, SMITH, SMITH WARNER, SPRENGER, TAYLOR, VEGA, PEDERSON, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILLIAMSON, WILSON, WITT (at the request of Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries Brad Avakian) - - Relating to the Career and Technical Education Revitalization Grant Program; declaring an emergency.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys to Department of Education to be expended for purpose of awarding grants under Career and Technical Education Revitalization Grant Program.

SB 675 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to requirements for responsibility determinations in public contracting; declaring an emergency.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes requirement that bidder or proposer for public contract demonstrate responsibility by submitting signed affidavit that attests that bidder or proposer complied with tax laws of this state.

SB 676 By Senator KNOPP; Senators FERRIOLI, HANSELL, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, Representatives DAVIS, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, POST, WHITSETT – Relating to treatment of human fetuses.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires human fetuses in infectious waste stream to be incinerated, cremated or buried.

SB 677 By Senator JOHNSON (at the request of Tim O'Callaghan) – Relating to the designation of land use reserves.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires county and metropolitan service district, when considering land for designation as urban reserve, to give highest priority to land containing sewer line that is located pursuant to goal exception and that serves land within urban growth boundary.

SB 678 By Senator BATES – Relating to hospitals.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes exemption from mandated noncontracting hospital reimbursement rate for type A and B hospitals.

SB 679 By Senator BATES – Relating to Oregon Health Authority information systems; declaring an emergency.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Medicaid Management Information System Oversight Committee to monitor progress of improvements to Oregon's mechanized claim processing system for Medicaid claims.

SB 680 By Senator BATES – Relating to Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Enacts Interstate Compact for Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.

SB 681 By Senator BATES – Relating to public employee benefit plans.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Revises definition of "local government" for purpose of public employee benefit plans.

SB 682 By Senator BATES – Relating to minimum wage rate.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases Oregon minimum wage rate to \$10.75 on January 1, 2016.

SB 683 By Senator BATES -- Relating to pesticides.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires pesticide operator engaged in pest control or pesticide application business to designate pesticide applicator responsible for overseeing pesticide application activities of business.

SB 684 By Senator DEVLIN -- Relating to limited license to practice medicine; declaring an emergency.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits Oregon Medical Board to issue limited license to practice medicine to physician licensed in another state or country who holds full-time professor appointment at school of medicine in this state.

SB 685 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION -- Relating to transportation of persons by for-hire carriers.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Deregulates oversight of for-hire carriers of persons.

SB 686 By COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE -- Relating to eligibility under federal workforce development law.

2-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Considers individual enrolled in alternative education program to be out-of-school youth for purposes of Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act.

Allows substituted service of certain investigative demands on natural persons to be accomplished in manner provided for service of summons in action or suit.

HB2603 By Representative SMITH WARNER; Representative KENY-GUYER (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to citation of ORS 30.868.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

 2-12 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

 2-18 Third reading. Carried by Smith Warner. Passed.

Provides that ORS 30.868, regarding civil damages for custodial interference, shall be known and may be cited as "Aaron's Law."

HB2763 By Representatives FAGAN, EVANS, Senators MONNES ANDERSON, BOQUIST; Representatives CLEM, DOHERTY, HOYLE, KENY-GUYER, MCKEOWN, PILUSO, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, VEGA PEDERSON (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to compensation received during performance of military duty; declaring an emergency.

1-12(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
 1-16 Referred to Veterans and Emergency Preparedness.
 2-10 Public Hearing held.
 2-12 Work Session held.
 2-13 Recommendation: Do pass.
 2-16 Second reading.

This measure has a fiscal impact statement.

Removes provision that public officer or employee who leaves position to perform military duty may not, while performing military duty, receive amount of pay entitled to before leave of absence.
