SENATE BILLS

SB 687 By Senator BOQUIST – Relating to percentage of vote required to win elected office; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that candidate for United States Senator, Representative in Congress, Secretary of State, State Treasurer, Attorney General, Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries, judge, state Senator or state Representative receive majority of votes cast in general election to be elected.

SB 688 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Building Excellent Schools Together) – Relating to sponsorship of public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes sunset on authority of institution of higher education to sponsor public charter school.

SB 689 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Building Excellent Schools Together) – Relating to school attendance by nonresident students; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes sunset on provisions that allow students whose legal residence is not within school district to attend school in district as resident if student receives written consent.

SB 690 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Linda Lambert) – Relating to daylight saving time.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates daylight saving time adjustment to standard of time for State of Oregon.

SB 691 By Senator GELSER, Representative NOSSE; Senator ROBLAN, Representative KOTEK – Relating to dishonorable discharges from the Armed Forces of the United States; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts, for purposes of state law, dishonorable discharges from Armed Forces of the United States that are based solely on sexual orientation.

SB 692 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representative KENY-GUYER – Relating to dental pilot projects.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes sunset on ability of Oregon Health Authority to approve dental pilot projects.

SB 693 By Senators PROZANSKI, MONROE, Representatives OLSON, BARKER; Senators BURDICK, KNOPP, KRUSE, THATCHER, Representatives BARTON, KRIEGER, LININGER,

- POST, WILLIAMSON – Relating to scrap metal businesses.**
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Authorizes scrap metal business to make payment by electronic funds transfer or stored value device.
- SB 694** By Senator KRUSE; Senators HANSELL, THOMSEN, Representatives HUFFMAN, LIVELY, WEIDNER, WILSON – Relating to unlawful passing.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Allows operators of motorcycles and mopeds to pass vehicles in same lane during traffic jams or slowdowns.
- SB 695** By Senator BATES – Relating to health care providers paid by the medical assistance program; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Repeals sunset on authorization for Oregon Health Authority to contract with prepaid managed care health services organization to provide care to medical assistance recipients.
- SB 696** By Senator BATES – Relating to autism spectrum disorders; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Directs Oregon Health Authority to study need for changes in licensure of health care practitioners that treat individuals diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health care on or before September 15, 2015.
- SB 697** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Deborah and David Morris) – Relating to the State Highway Fund.

- Prohibits Department of Transportation, counties and cities from using more than five percent of moneys appropriated from State Highway Fund to cover administrative costs.

- Creates position of State School Nursing Consultant in Oregon Health Authority and specifies duties.
- SB 699** By Senator BURDICK, Representative WILLIAMSON; Senator STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to cosmetology disciplines; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Broadens exemption to provisions regulating cosmetology disciplines for persons who prepare individual's hair solely for professional photograph or theatrical performance.

- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Modifies process for independent medical examinations of injured workers to provide for random selection of qualified physicians to conduct independent medical examinations in workers' compensation claims.
- SB 702** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative GORSEK; Senators MONNES ANDERSON, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BARTON, FREDERICK, HOLVEY, MCLAIN, NOSSE, PILUSO, REARDON, SMITH WARNER – Relating to health care coverage for faculty members at public institutions of higher education.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Specifies that aggregate total of hours worked by part-time faculty member at more than one public institution of higher education shall be considered in determination of full-time status of faculty member for health care coverage.
- SB 703** By Senator HASS, Representative WHISNANT; Representatives JOHNSON, KOMP, REARDON – Relating to State School Fund distributions; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Adjusts methods by which State School Fund distributions are made to school districts for students enrolled in English as a second language program.
- SB 704** By Senator HASS, Representative WHISNANT; Representatives JOHNSON, KOMP – Relating to State School Fund distributions for students in the ninth grade; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Allows for additional weights in state school fund distributions for historically underserved students who have made specified progress in ninth grade.
- SB 705** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative KENY-GUYER; Senator SHIELDS, Representatives FREDERICK, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER – Relating to demolition of residential structures; declaring an emergency.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Directs Oregon Health Authority to study and report on demolition of residential structures that have been painted with lead-based paint or insulated with asbestos and risks to public health associated with such demolitions.
- SB 706** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Joseph Gall) – Relating to penalties for frivolous position in tax proceedings; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
- Repeals provision for award of damages to Department of Revenue for frivolous claim, defense or argument made by taxpayer.

SB 707 By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Richard P. Burke) – Relating to elections.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates primary election as nominating election for major political party candidates.

SB 708 By Senator RILEY – Relating to phonics.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs State Board of Education to include textbooks and other instructional materials on explicit phonics on statewide list of textbooks and other instructional materials.

SB 709 By Senator GELSER – Relating to school attendance by students who are not residents of school district.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions to allow students who are not residents of school district to attend school of school district.

SB 710 By Senator GELSER – Relating to health records requested to obtain Social Security benefits; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires state health plans, health insurers, health care providers or health care clearinghouses to provide, upon request, one copy of individually identifiable health information free of charge to individual, or to specified representative, when individual is requesting Social Security disability benefits or contesting denial of Social Security disability benefits.

SB 711 By Senator GELSER – Relating to electronic devices.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that public bodies develop and implement policies for securely removing personal information from digital data storage devices and other electronic data storage devices owned by public body, leased by public body or otherwise under control of public body before selling, donating, recycling or otherwise disposing of device.

SB 712 By Senators ROBLAN, HANSELL; Senators JOHNSON, THOMSEN, Representatives BOONE, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, MCKEOWN – Relating to time frames affecting the undeveloped portion of municipal water use permits in extensions of time.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes water management and conservation plan approval condition for extension of time to develop permit for municipal use of water.

SB 713 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to motor vehicle dealerships.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor or importer from requiring dealer to advertise, promote, offer or sell extended service contracts, extended maintenance plans, or similar products or services that manufacturer, distributor or importer provides, originates, sponsors or endorses.

SB 714 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to motor vehicle dealerships.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prevents motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor or importer from taking certain adverse actions against motor vehicle dealer because dealer sold motor vehicle to customer that exported motor vehicle or resold motor vehicle for export.

SB 715 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to travel insurance; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits travel retailers that are not licensed insurance producers to offer travel insurance at direction of licensed insurance producers, subject to certain restrictions.

SB 716 By Senators ROBLAN, JOHNSON, Representative READ; Senators BEYER, EDWARDS, GIROD, MONROE, OLSEN, RILEY, THOMSEN, Representatives DAVIS, GOMBERG, HOYLE, KENNEMER, PARRISH, POST, WITT – Relating to reservation of land for industrial use.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties each to designate one large-lot industrial reserve of 150 to 500 acres.

SB 717 By Senator STEINER HAYWARD; Representative HELM (at the request of Wendall and Dawn Pelham) – Relating to Fallen Hero roadside memorial signs; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to erect and maintain Fallen Hero roadside memorial sign for John Pelham.

SB 718 By COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE – Relating to regulation of employment.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Defines "wages" for certain wage claims.

SB 719 By COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE – Relating to payment of wages for certain accrued paid leave.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Includes payments due for accrued vacation time and personal time off in meaning of wages for purposes of wage claim.

SB 720 By COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE – Relating to youth employment incentives for small businesses; declaring an emergency.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes county governing bodies and small business employers to enter into agreements for reimbursement of portion of wages paid to youth employees.

SB 777 By Senator GELSER – Relating to savings accounts for disability-related expenses; prescribing an effective date.

2-24(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs State Treasurer to establish by rule qualified state program as described in federal Stephen Beck, Jr., Achieving a Better Life Experience Act of 2014.
