**SJM 10** By Senators OLSEN, DEVLIN; Senator THATCHER, Representatives BARTON, KENNEMER, LININGER, PARRISH, POST -- Urging Congress to designate Willamette Falls and surrounding communities as National Heritage Area.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Urges Congress to designate Willamette Falls and surrounding communities as National Heritage Area.

**SJM 11** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS -- Urging Congress to improve and support efforts to bring health care to veterans in rural communities.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Urges Congress to improve and support efforts to bring health care to veterans in rural communities.

## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

**SJR 20** By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP -- Urging Governor and executive branch state agencies to reduce programs and services in least harmful manner possible.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Urges Governor and executive branch state agencies, when directed by Legislative Assembly to make unspecified reductions in state agency budgets or when responding to allotment reductions directed by Governor, to make reductions to programs and services in manner that causes least harm and inconvenience to persons agencies serve.

**SJR 21** By Senator KNOPP -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to establishing independent redistricting commission.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing independent redistricting commission to adopt redistricting plans for state Senate, state House of Representatives and United States House of Representatives.

**SJR 22** By Senator FERRIOLI -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to legislative approval of major administrative rules.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to allow Legislative Assembly by law to prohibit agency rule, policy or procedure from taking effect until after Legislative Assembly has adopted joint resolution approving rule, policy or procedure.

**SJR 23** By Senator FERRIOLI -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to formation of counties.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution authorizing large cities to unilaterally form consolidated city-county government separate from remainder of county, authorizing certain cities in large counties to form new counties separate from remainder of county and providing for disposition of remaining noncontiguous portions of county divided by foregoing provisions.

**SJR 24** By Senator FERRIOLI -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to awards of noneconomic damages.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to limit awards of noneconomic damages in civil actions to \$1 million.

**SJR 25** By Senators KNOPP, BAERTSCHIGER JR -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the Oregon Budget Reserve Fund.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to establish Oregon Budget Reserve Fund.

## SENATE BILLS

**SB 721** By Senators SHIELDS, GIROD – Relating to vegetation within the highway right-of-way; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to create Livable Roadway Program for purpose of allowing volunteer groups to plant trees and shrubs along roadside.

**SB 722** By Senator HANSELL; Senators BOQUIST, GIROD, KRUSE, OLSEN, THOMSEN – Relating to Oregon Project Independence; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Human Services for deposit in Oregon Project Independence Fund.

**SB 723** By Senator OLSEN; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST – Relating to criminal history record check exemption for concealed handgun licensees.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts certain transferors of firearms from requesting criminal history record check if purchaser or recipient has concealed handgun license.

**SB 724** By Senator OLSEN; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST – Relating to persons with concealed handgun licenses from other states.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides persons licensed to carry concealed handgun in another state with protections provided to persons with Oregon concealed handgun license if other state has no less stringent requirements for obtaining license than Oregon.

**SB 725** By Senator OLSEN – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for purpose of awarding grants under Career and Technical Education Revitalization Grant Program.

**SB 726** By Senator OLSEN; Senator BOQUIST – Relating to arson caused by the manufacture of controlled substances.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that person commits crime of arson in the second degree or arson in the first degree if person manufactures controlled substance and causes fire or explosion that damages property.

**SB 727** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to the taxation of commissions received by a domestic international sales corporation; prescribing an effective date.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Extends favorable tax treatment for domestic international sales corporations to corporations formed after January 1, 2014.

**SB 728** By Senators BOQUIST, KNOPP – Relating to the qualified production activities income deduction; prescribing an effective date.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Discontinues provisions requiring taxpayers, for Oregon tax purposes, to add to federal taxable income amount equal to federal deduction for qualified production activities income.

**SB 729** By Senator BOQUIST – Relating to a tax credit for adoption of children from foster system; prescribing an effective date.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates income tax credit for adopting children from foster system.

**SB 730** By Senator GIROD, Representative WITT; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, JOHNSON, Representative CLEM – Relating to energy.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Biomass Heat for Rural Schools Fund.

**SB 731** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to mandatory immunizations for employment.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes that decisions related to immunizations are personal health care decisions and that immunizations may not be mandated as condition of employment unless required by federal law.

**SB 732** By Senators STEINER HAYWARD, BATES, Representative KENY-GUYER; Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives GREENLICK, TAYLOR – Relating to age requirement for use of inhalants; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates offense of selling tobacco products or tobacco product devices to person under 21 years of age.

**SB 733** By Senator STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to the state agency that regulates adult substances.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes name of "Oregon Liquor Control Commission" to "Adult Substances Control Commission." Changes name of "Oregon Liquor Control Commission Account" to "Oregon Liquor Control Account."

**SB 734** By Senators SHIELDS, THATCHER – Relating to jury instructions.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires trial judge to inform jury of power to acquit even if guilt of defendant proven beyond reasonable doubt.

**SB 735** By Senator SHIELDS – Relating to insurance; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Insurance Fraud for purpose of studying causes of and methods employed in insurance fraud, examining methods for preventing and punishing insurance fraud and evaluating costs and consequences of insurance fraud.

**SB 736** By Senator SHIELDS – Relating to juvenile mental health treatment; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to submit report to interim legislative committees regarding status of juvenile mental health treatment in Oregon no later than July 1, 2016.

**SB 737** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Jay Hutchins) – Relating to dwellings in areas with high risk of seismic activity.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires home inspector conducting inspection of single-family dwelling in high-risk location for seismic activity and constructed before 1994 to provide potential purchaser of dwelling with certain information concerning seismic hazards and seismic retrofitting of dwellings.

**SB 738** By Senator SHIELDS – Relating to voting by incarcerated persons.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that criminal defendants do not lose right to vote as result of incarceration.

**SB 739** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Disability Rights Oregon) – Relating to Department of Corrections inmates with serious mental illness.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes standards of care for Department of Corrections inmates with serious mental illness.

**SB 740** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Disability Rights Oregon) – Relating to interpreters for persons with disabilities.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes requirement that arrested person with disability provide proof of inability to obtain qualified interpreter in order for public employer of arresting officer to pay for interpreter.

**SB 741** By Senators SHIELDS, OLSEN; Senators GELSER, MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives STARK, WILLIAMSON – Relating to placement of children.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to adopt administrative rules for home studies and placement reports in adoption proceedings that require that equal consideration be given to relatives and current caretakers as prospective adoptive parents, and that greater consideration be given to relatives and current caretakers as compared to other persons who are not relatives or current caretakers.

**SB 742** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Tim Kirkman) – Relating to assistance animals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt procedures for issuance of assistance animal certificates.

**SB 743** By Senator BOQUIST (at the request of Daniel E. Thenell for Fraternal Order of Police) – Relating to investigations of public safety officers.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Revises definitions.

**SB 744** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to administrative rules.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires agencies to estimate costs borne by businesses and industrial sectors to comply with proposed rules.

**SB 745** By Senator BOQUIST – Relating to grants to establish Internet access in small counties.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes Oregon Business Development Department to make grants to small counties to provide assistance in obtaining affordable Internet access.

**SB 746** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to a tax credit for workforce expansion; prescribing an effective date.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates income tax credit for taxpayers that expand workforce with positions that pay above average wage by 10 percent or more in tax year.

**SB 747** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to exception to land use goals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes local government to adopt exception to statewide land use goal without demonstrating that certain statutory standards for exception have been met for employment use that will create five or more new, full-time jobs for which salary or wage compensation is 400 percent or more of federal poverty level for family of four.

**SB 748** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to exception to land use goals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes local government to adopt exception to statewide land use goal without demonstrating that certain statutory standards for exception have been met for employment use that will create 10 or more new, full-time jobs for which salary or wage compensation is 400 percent or more of federal poverty level for family of four.

**SB 749** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to exception to land use goals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes local government to adopt exception to statewide land use goal without demonstrating that statutory standards for exception have been met for use that is necessary for employer of 10 or more employees under specified circumstance.

**SB 750** By COMMITTEE ON IMPLEMENTING MEASURE 91 – Relating to marijuana.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Adjusts references in findings section of chapter 1, Oregon Laws 2015.

**SB 751** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative KENY-GUYER (at the request of Donate Life Northwest) – Relating to the Organ Donor Registry and Public Awareness Fund.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Organ Donor Registry and Public Awareness Fund.

**SB 752** By Senators KNOPP, EDWARDS – Relating to air quality regulation of biomass; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Conditionally exempts from regulation under certain air pollution laws carbon dioxide emissions from combustion or decomposition of biomass.

**SB 753** By Senator THATCHER – Relating to dangerous sexual offenders.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases penalties for certain sex crimes when specified criteria are proven.

**SB 754** By Senator BAERTSCHIGER JR – Relating to moneys for local law enforcement purposes in certain counties; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to counties with population of less than 100,000 for local law enforcement purposes.

**SB 755** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to restricting the amount of cannabinoid products that may be transferred; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Restricts amount of cannabinoid products that medical marijuana facility may transfer during 24-hour period to registry identification cardholder or cardholder's designated primary caregiver.

**SB 756** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to marijuana; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies offense of smoking in motor vehicle to clarify that offense applies to smoking marijuana and use of electronic cigarette to vaporize cannabinoid solutions.

**SB 757** By Senators BATES, KRUSE; Senators EDWARDS, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BENTZ, BUEHLER, NOSSE, RAYFIELD – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for Oregon Healthcare Workforce Institute and Oregon Center for Nursing for analysis of effectiveness of state programs designed to encourage practice of healthcare providers with underserved populations or in rural areas.

**SB 758** By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to students with behavioral needs; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Students with Intensive Behavioral Needs.

**SB 759** By Senators GELSER, WINTERS, Representatives GALLEGOS, SPRENGER; Senators BOQUIST, GIROD, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON, OLSEN, ROSENBAUM, THOMSEN, Representatives BARTON, KENY-GUYER, OLSON, PILUSO, SMITH WARNER, VEGA PEDERSON –

Relating to sexual assault at post-secondary institutions of education.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires four-year post-secondary institutions that enroll students who receive Oregon Opportunity Grant to adopt written protocol to ensure that students who report sexual assault receive necessary services and assistance.

**SB 760** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to tax credits for crop donation; prescribing an effective date.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases, for purposes of tax credit allowed for crop donation, percentage of wholesale price allowed as amount of credit.

**SB 761** By Senator THOMSEN – Relating to funding for students in English as a second language program; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases amount distributed to school districts from State School Fund for each student enrolled in English as a second language program.

**SB 762** By Senator BOQUIST – Relating to disclosure of political contributions; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires filing of identifying information for all persons, political committees and petition committees making political contributions, regardless of amount.

**SB 763** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for mental health programs.

**SB 764** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to administrative rules.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires agency to include comparative analysis of costs and benefits of rule in notice of proposed rulemaking.

**SB 765** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to moratorium on administrative rules for land use planning; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits Land Conservation and Development Commission from adopting land use planning rules except for land use planning rules relating to Columbia River Gorge and Oregon Territorial Sea.

**SB 766** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to the provision of health care.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits health care providers from denying patient health care necessary to prevent death based on certain factors.

**SB 767** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to domestic violence programs; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Human Services for domestic violence prevention, awareness and support programs.

**SB 768** By Senator OLSEN – Relating to degree programs at public universities; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires public universities to offer at least one bachelor's degree in fields of science, technology, engineering or mathematics at cost of \$15,000 or less.

**SB 769** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to shovel-ready employment sites.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows local governments planning for employment sites required by statewide land use goals to waive requirements of goals to establish and maintain five-year supply of shovel-ready employment sites.

**SB 770** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to exception to land use goals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes local government to adopt exception to statewide land use goal without demonstrating that certain statutory standards for exception have been met for employment use that will create 50 or fewer new, full-time jobs.

**SB 771** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to exception to land use goals.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes local government to adopt exception to statewide land use goal without demonstrating that statutory standards for exception have been met for use that is necessary for employer of 10 or more employees under specified circumstance.

**SB 772** By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND EARLY CHILDHOOD – Relating to closed captioning of state government video transmissions.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires video transmissions of executive department and legislative department to be closed-captioned for access by hearing-impaired persons.

**SB 773** By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND EARLY CHILDHOOD – Relating to medical assistance for children; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires coordinated care organization to continue to provide health services to child meeting specified criteria who moves outside of geographic area served by coordinated care organization.

**SB 774** By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND EARLY CHILDHOOD – Relating to the Home Care Commission; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates task force to investigate expanding authority of Home Care Commission to provide services to home care workers.

**SB 775** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to natural disasters; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that evidence of measures taken before natural disaster occurs that were intended to minimize impact of natural disaster is not admissible to prove negligence or culpable conduct in connection with natural disaster.

**SB 776** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to access of broadcasters to geographic area subject to declaration of emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes individuals acting under authority of broadcasters to enter geographic area subject to declaration of emergency to report news or public safety information or to maintain essential broadcast equipment.

**SB 778** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to reviews for planned construction vulnerability to hazards from seismic activity.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to require use of risk mitigation methods in, or to prohibit construction of, certain facilities and structures in tsunami inundation zone.

**SB 779** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to the State Department of Fish and Wildlife.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to study expanding application of laws that consider members of uniformed services residents for licensing purposes and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before September 15, 2016.

**SB 780** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to inmates with post-traumatic stress disorder.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Corrections to establish pilot program for mental health treatment for inmates engaged in intensive alternative incarceration addiction program who are servicemembers and who have been diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder.

**SB 781** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Relating to exemptions from the operation of the Insurance Code for certain associations.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to exempt association with membership composed of current or former members of Armed Forces of United States from operation of Insurance Code and to require association to submit certain information to director.

**SB 782** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to public employee retirement; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions relating to public employee retirement.

**SB 783** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to the final average salary of members of the Public Employees Retirement System who served in the Legislative Assembly; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies calculation of final average salary for purposes of calculating retirement benefits of certain members of Public Employees Retirement System who were members of Legislative Assembly and earned larger salaries in public employment after service in Legislative Assembly.

**SB 784** By Senator KNOPP; Senator KRUSE, Representative WHITSETT – Relating to capping final average salary for purposes of the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Public Employees Retirement Board to exclude amounts exceeding \$100,000 of salary paid or earned in any year in computing final average salary for purposes of retirement benefits.

**SB 785** By Senator KNOPP; Senators KRUSE, WHITSETT, Representative WHITSETT – Relating to a defined contribution retirement plan for public employees; declaring an emergency.

2-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.
