## SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

**SJR 26** By Senator THATCHER; Senator KNOPP, Representative HACK – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution to modify gender-specific language and correct grammatical errors.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to modify gender-specific language and correct grammatical errors.

## SENATE BILLS

**SB 804** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to timber sales from state forestlands.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Forester to manage state forestlands to provide for timber sales each year in amounts that equal or exceed 125 percent of 2014 timber sales amount.

**SB 805** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to the Tillamook State Forest; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies authority of State Forester relating to Tillamook State Forest.

**SB 806** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to lands in the Elliott State Forest; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Instructs State Forester to manage, control and protect lands in Elliott State Forest in manner designed to generate, after payment of State Forester administrative expenses, sustainable revenue from forest operations of \$40 million or more per year.

**SB 807** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to job creation; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that cities and counties that meet certain criteria are job creation zones.

**SB 808** By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representative BOONE – Relating to seismic resilience planning.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Human Services to coordinate and facilitate state and local community resilience planning to prepare for and respond to catastrophic consequences and mass displacement that may result from naturally occurring seismic events.

**SB 809** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative MCKEOWN – Relating to apprenticeship utilization on public works projects; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires bidder that submits bid for contract for public works with estimated contract price of \$1 million or more to demonstrate responsibility by belonging to local joint committee whose training agents, in aggregate, employed apprentices for 10 percent or more of hours that training agents' employees worked on contracts in previous calendar year or by showing that bidder employed apprentices for 10 percent or more of hours that bidder's employees worked on contracts during previous calendar y

**SB 810** By Senators FERRIOLI, OLSEN – Relating to Oregon highway expansion project.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates Oregon highway expansion project.

**SB 811** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to bonuses paid to educators who improve student outcomes.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Education to create grant program to award grants to school districts and public charter schools to provide bonuses to educators who improve student outcomes.

**SB 812** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to the beneficial use of Columbia River Basin waters.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Classifies certain waters of Columbia River to be used for specific purposes.

**SB 813** By Senator FERRIOLI (at the request of Don Pucket) – Relating to liens for deferred amounts of property taxes arising under the homestead property tax deferral program; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Repeals requirement that Department of Revenue estimate future amounts of deferred taxes, interest on taxes and fees to be paid by department for homestead granted property tax deferral.

**SB 814** By Senator THATCHER – Relating to state preemption of authority to mandate employment benefits for employees of private employers; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes state preemption of authority to require mandatory provision of employment benefits to employees of private employers.

**SB 815** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to use of hydroelectric electricity to comply with a renewable portfolio standard.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes restrictions on hydroelectricity, including restriction that hydroelectric electricity be generated by facility that became operational on or after January 1, 1995, for purpose of complying with renewable portfolio standard.

**SB 816** By Senators THATCHER, JOHNSON; Senators STEINER HAYWARD, WINTERS – Relating to sex trafficking of children.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates crime of patronizing a trafficked child.

**SB 817** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to educator mentorship program funding; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for grants-in-aid to school districts for beginning teacher and administrator mentorship programs.

**SB 818** By Senator FERRIOLI; Senators KNOPP, OLSEN – Relating to the hours of operation at Department of Transportation field offices; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to open field offices to public on Saturdays.

**SB 819** By Senators ROBLAN, KRUSE, Representative KOMP; Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies percentage of amounts school districts must pay from State School Fund to public charter schools that are not virtual public charter schools.

**SB 820** By Senators ROBLAN, HASS, KRUSE; Representatives HUFFMAN, KOMP – Relating to admission to public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows public charter school to give priority to students who are from historically underserved student groups.

**SB 821** By Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to the Oregon Tort Claims Act.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts claims based on conduct that constitutes child abuse, or conduct that constitutes knowingly allowing, permitting or encouraging child abuse, from notice requirement of Oregon Tort Claims Act.

**SB 822** By Senators KRUSE, BOQUIST, GELSER, Representative WILLIAMSON; Representative KRIEGER – Relating to the verbatim recording of grand jury proceedings.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs presiding judge of each judicial district to ensure all grand jury proceedings except for deliberations and voting are recorded verbatim.

**SB 823** By Senator DEMBROW, Representative GREENLICK; Representative VEGA PEDERSON – Relating to vehicle idling.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Restricts vehicle idling and expands types of vehicles that are required to comply with idling restrictions.

**SB 824** By Senator DEMBROW, Representatives VEGA PEDERSON, GREENLICK – Relating to engine emissions.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires certain public improvement contracts to contain and reserve one percent of total contract price for performing repowers or retrofits of certain diesel engines used in course of performing contract.

**SB 825** By Senator THATCHER – Relating to grand jury proceedings.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that defendant has right to appear as witness before grand jury.

**SB 826** By Senator ROBLAN, Representative BARTON; Representatives DOHERTY, EVANS, WITT – Relating to the construction industry; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates task force to study potential for merging two or more agencies or agency divisions that regulate construction contracting, building trades, building codes or other matters impacting construction industry.

**SB 827** By Senator ROBLAN – Relating to outdoor schools; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates income or corporate excise tax credit for contributions for funding outdoor school programs for students.

**SB 828** By Senator ROBLAN – Relating to funding outdoor education; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes grant program for outdoor school programs to be administered by Oregon State University Extension Service.

**SB 829** By COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES – Relating to methodology for assessing quality of waters of the state.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule methodology for Department of Environmental Quality to apply certain water quality standards in assessing waters of state.

**SB 830** By COMMITTEE ON ENVIRONMENT AND NATURAL RESOURCES – Relating to mining; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule consolidated permitting program for motorized in-stream placer mining and motorized upland placer mining.

**SB 831** By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS, BATES; Senators GELSER, KNOPP, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BUEHLER, KENNEMER, NATHANSON, WHISNANT – Relating to mental health care.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires coordinated care organization to employ or contract with clinical mental health professionals to provide mental health care and treatment to members of organization.

**SB 832** By Senators MONNES ANDERSON, WINTERS, BATES; Senators GELSER, KNOPP, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BUEHLER, KENNEMER, WHISNANT – Relating to integrated health care; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide grants for integrating mental health and physical health services to coordinated care organizations that meet standards prescribed by authority.

**SB 833** By Senator BATES – Relating to coordinated care organization contracts; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to give coordinated care organization at least 30 days' advance notice of proposed amendments to contracts.

**SB 834** By Senator BATES – Relating to mental health; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Effective Mental Health Treatment for purpose of studying effectiveness of mental health treatment available in Oregon.

**SB 835** By Senator BATES – Relating to hospital emergency departments.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires hospital emergency department to refer for primary care person who presents at emergency department but does not have condition requiring emergency medical services.

**SB 836** By Senator BATES – Relating to the homestead property tax deferral program.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Department of Revenue to study homestead property tax deferral program.

**SB 837** By Senator BATES – Relating to pesticides.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes requirements for displaying information and posting notices regarding pesticide applicator, pesticide trainee, public applicator and public trainee application activities.

**SB 838** By Senator BATES – Relating to prescription drugs.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Health Evidence Review Commission to develop prioritized list of prescription drugs.

**SB 839** By Senators BATES, KRUSE, Representatives WILLIAMSON, FAGAN; Senator STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives PILUSO, TAYLOR, WILSON – Relating to immunity from prosecution.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts specified persons from arrest and prosecution for certain offenses and for violation of terms of release or supervision if evidence of offense was obtained because emergency medical services or law enforcement agency was contacted to obtain necessary medical assistance due to drug-related overdose.

**SB 840** By Senator BATES; Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives FREDERICK, GREENLICK (at the request of Oregon Association of Hospitals and Health Systems) – Relating to persons with chronic mental illness; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes licensed independent practitioner to initiate or approve prehearing detention in hospital or nonhospital facility of person who is subject of civil commitment proceedings.

**SB 841** By Senators BATES, STEINER HAYWARD, KRUSE; Senators MONNES ANDERSON, SHIELDS – Relating to prescription drug refills.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies requirements for health plan coverage of prescription drugs dispensed in accordance with synchronization policy.

**SB 842** By Senator BURDICK – Relating to marijuana.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Specifies amount of civil penalty that Oregon Liquor Control Commission may impose on licensee for violating law or rule related to regulation of marijuana.

**SB 843** By Senator BURDICK – Relating to marijuana.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Liquor Control Commission to develop and maintain system for tracking marijuana items offered for retail sale in this state.

**SB 844** By Senator BURDICK – Relating to marijuana.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Specifies that premises licensed by Oregon Liquor Control Commission may receive marijuana items only from marijuana producer, marijuana processor or marijuana wholesaler operating as business at licensed premises.

**SB 845** By COMMITTEE ON WORKFORCE – Relating to health care for low-income workers; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes penalty to be imposed by Employment Department on large employers whose employees receive health care coverage through medical assistance program.

**SB 846** By Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, OLSEN, JOHNSON, Representative WITT; Senators BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, GIROD, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, ROBLAN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT – Relating to man-made water channels; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes task force to study essential indigenous anadromous salmonid habitat and its relationship to ditches and other man-made water conveyance channels.

**SB 847** By Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, JOHNSON; Senators HANSELL, OLSEN, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representative WITT – Relating to wetlands.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts prior converted croplands from definition of "waters of this state" for purposes of removal fill program.

**SB 848** By Senator BURDICK, Representatives BUCKLEY, LININGER – Relating to shared service funds; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

For purposes of transfer to Shared Services Fund, limits personal income tax revenue to revenue due to jobs that did not exist on date property of eligible project was granted exemption.

**SB 849** By Senator KNOPP, Representative BUEHLER; Senator THOMSEN, Representatives HUFFMAN, JOHNSON – Relating to skiing; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Revises provisions relating to liability arising out of skiing.

**SB 850** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to verification of legal status for employment; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires state agencies to use federal E-Verify employment verification program to verify employment eligibility of job applicants.

**SB 851** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to post-acknowledgment changes to the urban growth boundary of the City of Bend.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Land Conservation and Development, in cooperation with City of Bend, to report status of current, or most recent, legislative review of urban growth boundary of City of Bend.

**SB 852** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to voters' pamphlet statements.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires all information provided as part of candidate's statement for voters' pamphlet to be true.

**SB 853** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to statements before legislative committees.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that statements made by certain witnesses to committee of Legislative Assembly be made under oath and therefore subject to crime of false swearing.

**SB 854** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to unsworn falsification.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Includes false statements made to legislative committee by certain persons in crime of unsworn falsification.

**SB 855** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to the Oregon Tort Claims Act; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Clarifies that governing body of public body is required to indemnify school district board members for tort claims arising out of performance of duty.

**SB 856** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to a child sexual abuse prevention instructional program in public schools; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes child sexual abuse prevention instructional program for public schools.

**SB 857** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to a system to register personal information for protected consumers; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services, by contract with vendor or service provider or otherwise, to develop system by means of which representative may register personal information of protected consumer with consumer reporting agency that meets certain qualifications.

**SB 858** By Senator KNOPP – Relating to green energy technology; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies types of green energy technology for which at least 1.5 percent of total contract price of certain public improvement contracts for construction of public building, or certain reconstruction or major renovation of public building, must be spent.

**SB 859** By Senator KNOPP; Senator BEYER – Relating to state-required reports for education; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires school districts to be reimbursed for number of staff hours required to prepare state-required report.

**SB 860** By Senators EDWARDS, GELSER – Relating to university pilot programs; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to select University of Oregon or Oregon State University to design and develop career advising and mentorship pilot program.

**SB 861** By Senator EDWARDS – Relating to search warrants.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs court to consider electronic location information that shows stolen bicycle is located in place to be searched as probable cause when issuing search warrant.

**SB 862** By Senator GIROD – Relating to dental care organizations; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires governing body of coordinated care organization to include representative from at least one dental care organization that contracts with coordinated care organization.

**SB 863** By Senator GIROD – Relating to information captured through law enforcement use of body cameras.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes law enforcement units to adopt additional public records request fees designed to recoup costs of storage, storage technology, indexing and retrieval of information captured through use by law enforcement of body cameras to capture daily duties of police officers.

**SB 864** By Senator GIROD; Senators JOHNSON, WHITSETT, Representatives BOONE, CLEM, KRIEGER – Relating to the estate tax credit for natural resource property; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands definition of "real property," for purposes of natural resource credit against estate tax, to include real property in neighboring states.

**SB 865** By Senators GIROD, COURTNEY; Senator BOQUIST – Relating to county property taxes; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes county to exempt homestead of surviving spouse of fire service professional or police officer killed in line of duty from property taxes imposed by county.

**SB 866** By Senator GIROD – Relating to state finance; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Limits state governmental appropriations for general governmental purposes in biennium to lesser of percentage increase in projected personal income, percentage increase in projected population growth plus inflation or percentage increase in projected gross domestic product of Oregon for biennium.

**SB 867** By Senator GIROD; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, KNOPP – Relating to forest products on state-owned forestland damaged by wildfire.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Forester to carry out appraisal and sale of forest products on state-owned forestland damaged by wildfire.

**SB 868** By Senator GIROD; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, KNOPP – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to State Department of Fish and Wildlife for biennial expenses.

**SB 869** By Senator GIROD – Relating to a school floor plan database; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Department of State Police to create and maintain database of physical information of all schools.

**SB 870** By Senator SHIELDS (at the request of Corinne Fletcher) – Relating to incarceration of juvenile offenders; providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to hold hearing when inmate who was under 18 years of age at time of offense completes 26 years of prison sentence.

**SB 871** By Senator SHIELDS – Relating to use of deadly physical force by police officers.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs law enforcement agency to notify Attorney General when police officer's use of deadly physical force causes death of person.

**SB 872** By Senator BURDICK, Representatives WILLIAMSON, READ; Senators BATES, ROSENBAUM, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to certified film production development contributions; prescribing an effective date.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases amount of maximum total tax credits for certified film production development contributions for fiscal year.

**SB 873** By Senator HANSELL; Senator FERRIOLI, Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ – Relating to utility facilities on land zoned for exclusive farm use; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies authority to site or modify certain utility facilities on land zoned for exclusive farm use.

**SB 874** By Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Jennifer Knapp) – Relating to adrenal insufficiency; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide or contract for provision of training on adrenal insufficiency for certain health care professionals.

**SB 875** By Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Jennifer Knapp) – Relating to adrenal insufficiency; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Board of Education to adopt rules under which school personnel may administer medications that treat adrenal insufficiency to students experiencing adrenal crisis.

**SB 876** By Senator PROZANSKI, Representative HOLVEY - Relating to pesticide application reporting; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires reporting certain information regarding commercial or governmental pesticide applications to Department of Environmental Quality or to state database designated by department.

**SB 877** By Senator PROZANSKI, Representative FAGAN; Senators COURTNEY, DEMBROW, STEINER HAYWARD, Representatives BARNHART, FREDERICK, HELM – Relating to ballots; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires ballots returned by mail to be postmarked not later than date of election.

**SB 878** By Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Ethan Ludwig) – Relating to the offense of unlawful moped or motorcycle operation.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes requirements for operating moped or motorcycle.

**SB 879** By Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Dean Kaufman) – Relating to mortgage loan origination.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts attorneys and real estate licensees from requirement to obtain mortgage loan originator's license in order to perform activities of mortgage loan originator.

**SB 880** By Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Orchid Health Clinic) – Relating to professional corporations organized for the purpose of practicing medicine.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Exempts for-profit or nonprofit business entity, if business entity provides only palliative care or operates rural health clinic, from requirement that licensed physicians hold majority of voting stock in professional corporation organized for purpose of practicing medicine or be majority of directors of professional corporation.

**SB 881** By Senator PROZANSKI – Relating to industrial hemp.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that seed not intended for planting but remaining capable of germination is agricultural hemp seed.

**SB 882** By Senator PROZANSKI, Representative HOLVEY - Relating to preventing environmental harm from neonicotinoids; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires State Department of Agriculture to adopt rules prohibiting application of pesticide products containing nitro-group neonicotinoids.

**SB 883** By Senators PROZANSKI, THATCHER (at the request of Jerry Valencia) – Relating to funding for school capital construction costs; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes pilot project designed to assist small school districts in identifying and using diverse funding sources for capital construction costs.

**SB 884** By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to civil rights; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Transfers civil rights programs and functions from Department of Transportation to Bureau of Labor and Industries.

**SB 885** By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND TRANSPORTATION – Relating to workforce development in Lane County; declaring an emergency.

3-3(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that moneys received by Lane County from federal forest reserves shall be used to fund career and technical education in county.
