## SENATE BILLS

**SB 907** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to the offense of failure to perform the duties of a driver when property is damaged.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires driver of vehicle involved in accident resulting only in damage to fixtures or property legally upon or adjacent to highway to provide notice to owner of property within one business day of accident.

**SB 908** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to order setting aside conviction.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Removes prohibition of filing motion to set aside conviction for person committing certain offenses within previous 10 years.

**SB 909** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to direct care providers; declaring an emergency.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that fitness determination be conducted before hiring individuals with specified criminal history if individual will have direct contact with resident of residential facility or adult foster home or persons who receive in-home services or supports.

**SB 910** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to use of deadly physical force by police officers.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs law enforcement agency to notify Attorney General when police officer's use of deadly physical force causes death of person.

**SB 911** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to deadly use of force by police.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Justice to conduct study on deadly use of force by police and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2016.

**SB 912** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to land that was formerly submerged or submersible land; declaring an emergency.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates temporal distinction between "historically filled lands" and "new lands" for purposes of determining ownership and transfer of ownership of lands created upon submersible or submerged lands by artificial fill or deposit.

**SB 913** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to trafficking in animal parts.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates offense of trafficking in animal parts.

**SB 914** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to juvenile sex offenders.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Eliminates automatic reporting of person found to have committed act that would constitute felony sex crime if committed by adult.

**SB 915** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to juvenile sex offender reporting.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Authorizes persons adjudicated for sex crime as juvenile in Oregon to file petition for relief from reporting requirements when person does not reside, attend school or work in Oregon.

**SB 916** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Oregon Lyme Disease Network) -- Relating to Lyme disease; declaring an emergency.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Medical Board and Oregon State Board of Nursing to adopt rules regarding diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease.

**SB 917** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Aflac) -- Relating to disability income insurance; declaring an emergency.

3-4(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Excludes disability income insurance from definition of health insurance in Insurance Code.
