SENATE BILLS

SB 8 By Senators COURTNEY, KRUSE – Relating to statute of limitations.

3-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Increases statute of limitations for certain sex crimes to within 20 years after commission of crime.

SB 919 By Senator JOHNSON – Relating to disorderly conduct.

3-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that person who falsely reports hazardous substance, fire, explosion, catastrophe or other emergency in court facility or public building commits crime of disorderly conduct in the first degree.

SB 920 By Senator MONNES ANDERSON, Representatives GREENLICK, BUCKLEY – Relating to protecting antibiotics for human public health; declaring an emergency.

3-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes legislative findings regarding provision of antibiotics and its relation to public health.

SB 921 By Senators HANSELL, COURTNEY, Representative KOTEK; Senator KRUSE, Representative PARRISH – Relating to interstate highway median barriers.

3-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to make efforts to complete installation of median barriers between opposing lanes of travel on interstate highways in certain circumstances.

SB 922 By Senator THOMSEN – Relating to legal expense organizations.

Provides that reimbursement to member of legal expense organization for charges that member incurs for legal services does not include nominal fee for operating expenses that legal expense organization incurs or pays to providing attorney.
