SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 27 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Proposing revision of Oregon Constitution relating to taxation; and requiring approval by a two-thirds majority.

3-16(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes revision of Oregon Constitution repealing ad valorem property tax system created by Ballot Measure 50 (1997), eliminating equalization grant system established with respect to local option taxes approved pursuant to Ballot Measure 50 and directing Legislative Assembly to provide for exemption from ad valorem property taxes for owner-occupied primary residences.

SENATE BILLS

SB 925 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to taxation; prescribing an effective date.

3-16(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to report to Legislative Assembly on options for tax reform and make recommendations for legislation intended to reform current tax system.

SB 926 By Senator WINTERS, Representative HACK; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, FERRIOLI, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, OLSEN, THATCHER, WHITSETT, Representative WHITSETT – Relating to adverse possession.

3-16(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows court to award attorney fees to prevailing party in action to acquire fee simple title to real property by adverse possession in which adverse possessor is not prevailing party.

SB 927 By Senators MONROE, HANSELL – Relating to authority of metropolitan service district to finance visitor-oriented facilities; declaring an emergency.

3-16(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies authority of metropolitan service district to acquire or construct visitor-oriented facilities.
