SENATE BILLS

SB 929 By COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND REVENUE – Relating to state finance; declaring an emergency; providing for revenue estimate modification that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

Increases amount of estimate of revenues that will be received from General Fund revenue sources other than corporate income and excise taxes for biennium beginning July 1, 2013.

SB 930 By Senator KRUSE – Relating to funding for education service districts; declaring an emergency.

Modifies method by which minimum amount distributed for education service districts is calculated.

SB 931 By Senator BATES, Representative ESQUIVEL; Representatives STARK, WILSON – Relating to annexation of industrial land.

Repeals sunset on provisions that prohibit annexation of specified land without written consent of owner of land.
