SENATE BILLS

SB 932 By Senators DEMBROW, COURTNEY – Relating to cost of attending public universities; declaring an emergency.

3-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Extends eligibility for receiving Oregon financial aid scholarships and grants to certain students who qualify for exemption from paying nonresident tuition.

SB 933 By Senator MONROE, Representative GILLIAM; Senator HASS, Representatives BARKER, GALLEGOS, OLSON – Relating to restrictions on retail sales prices for prescription contact lenses.

3-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits person that manufactures or distributes prescription contact lenses from preventing retailer from advertising or selling prescription contact lenses at price for consumers that is less than price that person sets or specifies.

SB 934 By Senator ROBLAN – Relating to the State Fair Council.

3-19(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes limitation on state liability for nonproperty claims applicable to State Fair Council.

Provides that public body and its officers, employees and agents are not immune from liability for wrongful death of person who is covered by workers' compensation law if death occurred in course and scope of decedent's employment, death occurred as result of conduct of another person who is subsequently convicted of murder or found guilty except for insanity of murder and decedent was not employed by public body at time of death.

HB3041 By Representatives GREENLICK, BUEHLER, KENY-GUYER, JOHNSON, Senators MONNES ANDERSON, STEINER HAYWARD; Representatives BUCKLEY, HAYDEN, KENNEMER, KOMP, LIVELY, NOSSE, REARDON, Senators BURDICK, GELSER, ROBLAN – Relating to sun protection for students; declaring an emergency.
