SENATE BILLS

SB 939 By Senators SHIELDS, KRUSE; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BATES, GELSER, GIROD, HANSELL, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, OLSEN, ROBLAN, THOMSEN, Representatives FREDERICK, GOMBERG, KENNEMER, OLSON, PILUSO, SMITH WARNER, SPRENGER, WHISNANT – Relating to programs for children of incarcerated parents.

3-26(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Department of Corrections to enter into contracts with nonprofit entities to create programs to assist children of incarcerated parents.

Creates crime of receiving quid-pro-quo bribe.

Requires private person to complete transfer of firearm by appearing with transferee before gun dealer to request criminal background check.
