## SENATE BILLS

**SB 943** By Senator OLSEN; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, FERRIOLI, HANSELL, JOHNSON, KNOPP, MONROE, SHIELDS, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, Representatives BARRETO, KENNEMER, NEARMAN, PARRISH – Relating to motor vehicle registration.

4-1(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits counties and districts from imposing vehicle registration fee on vehicles registered to employment address when registered owner's residence address is not in same county as employment address.

**SB 944** By Senator KNOPP, Representative WHISNANT; Representative BUEHLER – Relating to behavior rehabilitation services programs.

4-1(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits Department of Human Services, Oregon Health Authority or Oregon Youth Authority from contracting with behavior rehabilitation services providers that permit, or authorizing behavior rehabilitation services providers to allow, children or youth who are not sex offenders or who do not have inappropriate sexual behaviors to reside in same home or residential facility as children or youth who are sex offenders or who have inappropriate sexual behaviors.

**SB 945** By Senator STEINER HAYWARD, Representative SMITH WARNER; Senator BURDICK, Representatives EVANS, FREDERICK, GREENLICK, HELM, KENY-GUYER – Relating to preventing minors from accessing firearms; declaring an emergency.

4-1(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates crime of endangering a minor by allowing access to a firearm.
