SB 953 By Senators ROBLAN, WHITSETT – Relating to the extinguishment of future interests in property; declaring an emergency.

Establishes process by which future interests in specified properties in Klamath County may be extinguished.

SB 954 By Senator DEMBROW – Relating to oversight of programs offering academic degrees; declaring an emergency.

Requires each school obtaining approval from Higher Education Coordinating Commission to offer academic degree to biennially obtain bond or letter of credit demonstrating school is financially sound and capable of fulfilling commitments to students.

SB 955 By Senator THATCHER – Relating to residency of students who attended public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

Provides that student whose legal residency is not in school district is considered resident of school district if student attended public charter school located in school district for at least four years and completed highest grade offered by public charter school located in school district.
