## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

**SCR 14** By COMMITTEE ON VETERANS AND EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS – Recognizing and honoring Corporal Keaton Grant Coffey (1989-2012) for his service to his country.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Recognizes and honors Corporal Keaton Grant Coffey (1989-2012) for his service to his country.

## SENATE BILLS

**SB 956** By Senator JOHNSON – Relating to wetlands.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires that creation, restoration or enhancement of wetlands in any area zoned for exclusive farm use be subject to certain standards of approval by local governing body.

**SB 957** By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to instructional time; declaring an emergency.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits State Board of Education from establishing certain standards for instructional time unless moneys available for state's system of kindergarten through grade 12 public education meet specified percentage of amount of moneys determined to be sufficient by Quality Education Commission.

**SB 958** By Senators PROZANSKI, BEYER, Representatives HAYDEN, LIVELY (at the request of Blackberry Jam Festival) – Relating to fishing; declaring an emergency.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Creates free license for organizers of certain fishing derbies to take and sell fish taken during duration of derby.

**SB 959** By Senator THOMSEN – Relating to motor vehicle pollution control; declaring an emergency.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Environmental Quality Commission to prepare certain revisions to Oregon's State Implementation Plan under federal Clean Air Act.

**SB 960** By Senator THOMSEN – Relating to emergency medical services.

4-9(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Enacts Emergency Medical Services Personnel Licensure Interstate Compact.

Authorizes court to order defendant to pay extradition costs when defendant is found in violation of probation in certain circumstances.

**HB2394** By Representatives OLSON, WHITSETT; Representatives BOONE, BUCKLEY, ESQUIVEL, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, KRIEGER, MCLANE, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senators DEMBROW, KRUSE, ROBLAN (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to public benefits of lottery prize winners; declaring an emergency.
