**SB 961** By Senators KRUSE, FERRIOLI, BOQUIST; Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, GIROD, HANSELL, KNOPP, OLSEN, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS, Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, OLSON, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WHITSETT – Relating to modification of method of return of surplus kicker amounts to individual taxpayers from tax credit to refund payment; prescribing an effective date.

4-13(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes method by which surplus "kicker" refunds are made to personal income taxpayers from tax credit to refund payment.

**SB 962** By Senator THATCHER – Relating to ballot measures.

Permits elector or chief petitioner to file action in circuit court to challenge determination by Secretary of State or elections official to reject elector's signature on initiative or referendum petition during signature verification process.
