HB4009 By Representatives CLEM, GILLIAM; Representatives DOHERTY, FREDERICK, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, MCLAIN, MCLANE, NOSSE (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to a day to honor Minoru Yasui; declaring an emergency.

Permits pawnbroker to keep register or record in electronic form and to deliver register or record kept in electronic form to local police agency in electronic form.

HB4082 By Representatives TAYLOR, HUFFMAN, STARK, GALLEGOS, Senators GELSER, KNOPP; Representatives BARNHART, FAGAN, GOMBERG, GREENLICK, HOLVEY, KENY-GUYER, KOMP, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, MCLANE, NOSSE, OLSON, PARRISH, PILUSO, READ, VEGA PEDERSON, WHISNANT, WILLIAMSON, Senators PROZANSKI, WHITSETT (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to promoting prostitution.

Expands crime of promoting prostitution to include receiving goods, services or other things of value derived from prostitution activity in certain circumstances.

HB4104 By Representative NOSSE; Representative HUFFMAN (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to exclusion of specified types of health insurance

from statutory health insurance coverage requirements.

HB4126 By Representatives LIVELY, WHISNANT; Representative BARNHART, Senator BEYER (Pre-session filed.) – Relating to evaluation and amendment of urban growth boundaries outside Metro initiated prior to January 1, 2016; declaring an emergency.

Permits cities outside Metro to complete evaluations and amendments of urban growth boundaries under statutes and administrative rules in effect on June 30, 2013.
