### SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

- SCR 15 Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Recognizing and honoring Lance Corporal Jack Ryan Ostrovsky for his service to his country.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Recognizes and honors Lance Corporal Jack Ryan Ostrovsky (1999-2020) for his service to his country.

- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

- SCR 17 Sponsored by Senators DEMBROW, RILEY, GOLDEN, Representative POWER; Senator MANNING JR, Representatives ALONSO LEON, DEXTER, HUDSON, LIVELY, MEEK, NERON, NOSSE, PHAM, SALINAS, SANCHEZ, WILDE (at the request of Beyond Toxics) -- Establishing environmental justice framework of principles for State of Oregon.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes environmental justice framework of principles for State of Oregon.

### SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

- SJR 26 Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the Fund for Student Success.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit expenditure of moneys received by Fund for Student Success for any purpose other than as appropriated in chapter 122, Oregon Laws 2019, or expended for allowable purposes but in different proportion than authorized in chapter 122, Oregon Laws 2019.

### SENATE BILLS

- SB 751 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Oregon Criminal Defense Lawyers Association) -- Relating to pretrial discovery.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires party in criminal case to provide hard copy or electronic copy of discovery material to adverse party unless copy cannot reasonably be provided.

SB 752 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Senator Floyd Prozanski) -- Relating to sexual abuse offenses.

2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that defendant's reasonable belief that victim consented constitutes affirmative defense in certain prosecutions for sexual abuse in the second degree and sexual abuse in the third degree.

- SB 753 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Division of Child Support of the Department of Justice) -- Relating to spousal support enforcement.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Repeals requirement that Division of Child Support provide certain spousal support enforcement services for obligees who receive public assistance but who are not also receiving child support enforcement services.

- SB 754 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENT (at the request of Oregon Business and Industry) -- Relating to chemicals in children's products.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions relating to regulation of chemicals in children's products.

- SB 755 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Senator Floyd Prozanski) -- Relating to substance use.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes form and style changes to provisions in Ballot Measure 110 (2020).

- <u>SB</u> <u>756</u> Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION -- Relating to student loans for incarcerated individuals; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to conduct study and develop recommendations on how to establish coordinated, statewide approach to best serve currently incarcerated individuals who are recently eligible to receive student loans under federal program.

- SB 757 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES, MENTAL HEALTH AND RECOVERY -- Relating to children; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Limits availability of conditional enrollment in Central Background Registry to individuals who have successfully completed criminal background check in Oregon and, if applicable, in state of residence.

- SB 758 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Compassionate Oregon) -- Relating to medical marijuana; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Changes "Oregon Medical Marijuana Act" to "Oregon Medical and Therapeutic Cannabis Act." Allows person designated to produce marijuana by registry identification cardholder to enter into agreement with registry identification cardholder to transfer marijuana to another registry identification cardholder or primary caregiver.

- SB 759 Sponsored by Senators DEMBROW, GORSEK, Representative WILDE; Senators FREDERICK, GELSER, GOLDEN, JAMA, LIEBER, PROZANSKI, Representatives CAMPOS, FAHEY, GRAYBER, HELM, NOSSE, PHAM, POWER, DEXTER, RILEY, **EVANŚ** HUDSON, MCLAIN, PRUSAK, REARDON, R RAYFIEĹD, RUIZ, SALINAS, WILLIAMS, SCHOUTEŃ, Relating to <sup>'</sup>bargaining collective rights  $\mathbf{of}$ legislative employees.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Legislative Administrator to represent legislative department in collective bargaining negotiations with legislative department employee bargaining units.

- SB 760 Sponsored by Senator FINDLEY; Representatives BONHAM, LEVY, MORGAN -- Relating to unemployment insurance; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Maintains unemployment insurance tax rate in effect for each employer for calendar year 2020 until first calendar year that begins after later of December 31, 2022, or date on which state of emergency declared by Governor on March 8, 2020, for COVID-19 pandemic, and any extension of state of emergency, is no longer in effect.

- SB 761 Sponsored by Senator JOHNSON -- Relating to elk.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Expands pilot program for urban deer population control to include elk.

- SB 762 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON NATURAL RESOURCES AND WILDFIRE RECOVERY --- Relating to wildfire.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Legislative Policy and Research Office to study strategies to promote wildfire response and recovery and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

- SB 763 Sponsored by Senators PATTERSON, Representatives SALINAS, Senators LINTHICUM, Representatives HUDSON; Senator GORSEK, Representatives CAMPOS, GRAYBER, NERON, NOSSE, PRUSAK, SANCHEZ, SCHOUTEN, WITT Relating to licensing pharmaceutical representatives; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that person may not engage in business as pharmaceutical representative without obtaining license from Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services.

SB 764 Sponsored by Senators PATTERSON,
Representatives WALLAN, Senators LINTHICUM,
Representatives HUDSON; Senators GORSEK,
LIEBER, Representatives CAMPOS, GRAYBER,
LEVY, NERON, NOSSE, PRUSAK, SALINAS,
SANCHEZ, SCHOUTEN, WITT -- Relating to
agreements that lead to anticompetitive behavior in
the market for pharmaceutical drugs; prescribing
an effective date.

2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's

Provides that Attorney General and court must presume that resolution agreement that ends dispute over alleged infringement of patent or violation of other protection for protected drug has anticompetitive effects if alleged infringer receives item of value as part of or in connection with resolution agreement or if alleged infringer agrees to limit or stop researching, developing, manufacturing, marketing or selling competing drug.

- SB 765 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Oregon Law Commission) -- Relating to notaries; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Makes permanent provisions allowing notary public to perform notarial act using communication technology for remotely located individual under certain circumstances.

- **SB** 766 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Oregon Law Center) -- Relating to sexual abuse restraining orders; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies date of expiration of sexual abuse restraining order for orders entered when petitioner was under 18 years of age.

- SB 767 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Oregon Justice of the Peace Association)
  -- Relating to courts.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Allows signature of judgment creditor or attorney signing satisfaction document to be notarized or accompanied by declaration under penalty of perjury.

- SB 768 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Oregon State Bar) -- Relating to the Oregon State Bar; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Modifies provisions relating to attorneys.

- SB 769 Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Relating to a frozen assessed value for the homesteads of certain individuals; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, frozen assessed value for homestead of individual at least 68 years of age, or person with disability, if homestead and individual would be eligible for homestead property tax deferral program but for fact that homestead is pledged as security for reverse mortgage.

- <u>SB</u> <u>770</u> Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Relating to private indecency; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Provides that crime of private indecency includes circumstances in which defendant's conduct occurs in immediate presence of other person.

<u>SB</u> <u>771</u> Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Relating to employment discrimination related to vaccinations.

2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's

Makes discrimination against individual based on vaccination history, individual's refusal to obtain vaccination or individual's failure to provide proof of immunity to communicable disease unlawful employment practice.

- SB 772 Sponsored by Senator KNOPP -- Relating to naturopathic physicians; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Requires individual and group health insurance policies to reimburse services provided by naturopathic physicians within scope of their practice if services are reimbursed when provided by licensed physicians.

- <u>SB</u> 773 Sponsored by Senators KNOPP, TAYLOR; Representative ZIKA -- Relating to lobbyists; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Prohibits lobbyist from serving as chairperson of interim committee, legislative work group or legislative task force.

- SB 774 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to the criminal justice system; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs division of Oregon Department of Administrative Services that serves as department's office of economic analysis to estimate savings to General Fund in biennium beginning July 1, 2023, resulting from certain prison closures.

- SB 775 Sponsored by Senator THOMSEN (at the request of Family Farm Association) -- Relating to a cooperative member's ability to rescind a contract with the cooperative under certain circumstances; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk

Permits member of cooperative to rescind contract with cooperative if member relies on information about financial condition of cooperative that cooperative, or director or officer of cooperative, provides and member later discovers that cooperative, or director or officer of cooperative, concealed material information, provided inaccurate, misleading or false information or otherwise acted to deceive member.

- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Permits individual who is 16 or 17 years of age and registered to vote to cast ballot in school district elections.

- **SB** 777 Sponsored by Senator GOLDEN -- Relating to vaccines; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to study vaccines.

SB 778 Sponsored by Senators JAMA, WAGNER, DEMBROW, Representatives CAMPOS, MEEK, PHAM, RUIZ -- Relating to the Office of Immigrant and Refugee Advancement; declaring an emergency.

2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Office of Immigrant and Refugee Advancement to implement and oversee statewide immigrant and refugee integration strategy.

- SB 779 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW; Representative WILDE -- Relating to reform of protective proceedings; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Guardianship and Conservatorship Reform.

- SB 780 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Senator Floyd Prozanski) -- Relating to civil claims arising during the COVID-19 emergency period; declaring an emergency.
- 2-18(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

Limits liability of health care providers, health maintenance organizations and hospitals for certain claims arising during COVID-19 emergency period.
