SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

SCR 18 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representative MOORE-GREEN -- Recognizing and honoring Alfreda Bales for her service to Department of Revenue and State of Oregon.

Recognizes and honors Alfreda Bales for her service to Department of Revenue and State of Oregon.

SCR 19 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Requiring committee chairs to conduct public hearings on legislative measures so that witnesses testify in specified order.

Requires committee chairs to conduct public hearings on legislative measures so that, to greatest extent practicable, witnesses alternate between those in favor of measure and those opposed to measure, except that witnesses who have traveled more than 100 miles to testify must be given priority.

SCR 20 Sponsored by Senator GELSER -- Designating April 7, 2022, as Action for Peace Day to honor memory of Edward Reginald "Ed" Epley.

Designates April 7, 2022, as Action for Peace Day to honor memory of Edward Reginald "Ed" Epley (1937-2021).

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

SJR 27 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the declaration of an emergency in bills.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require bills declaring emergency to receive at least two-thirds majority vote in each House of Legislative Assembly for passage.

SJR 28 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to conflict of interest rules for the Legislative Assembly.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to prohibit members of Legislative Assembly from voting on legislative measures when faced with conflict of interest.

SJR 29 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to public access to legislative measures.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to require bills, amendments and other legislative measures to be published and accessible by public at least 24 hours before legislative committee or joint committee takes action on bill, amendment or other measure.

SENATE BILLS

SB 8 Sponsored by Senator COURTNEY -- Relating to land use planning for housing.

Limits standards and conditions of approval that local governments may apply to certain affordable housing.

SB 781 Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON (at the request of Samaritan Health) -- Relating to clinical laboratories.

Modifies provisions relating to providing results of tests to patients.

SB 782 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON -- Relating to mental health screenings for public school students; declaring an emergency.

Directs Department of Education to establish and administer pilot program that enables school districts to deliver mental health screenings to students in grades 9 through 12.

SB 783 Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON -- Relating to a frozen assessed value for the homesteads of certain individuals; prescribing an effective date.

Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, frozen assessed value for homestead of individual at least 70 years old.

SB 784 Sponsored by Senator BEYER -- Relating to energy.

Authorizes public utility to seek rate recovery for operating expenses and capital costs associated with resiliency measures.

SB 785 Sponsored by Senator BEYER (at the request of Dwight Purdy) -- Relating to statutory dates.

Changes date of certain elections in presidential election years from third Tuesday in May to first Tuesday in March.

SB 786 Sponsored by Senator HANSELL -- Relating to targeted grazing; declaring an emergency.

Directs Department of State Lands to establish program that authorizes targeted grazing of livestock on state lands for purpose of reducing wildfire fuel loads.

SB 787 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Relating to the elimination of the corporate activity tax; prescribing an effective date.

Repeals corporate activity tax.

SB 788 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Relating to tax credits for homeschooling of children; prescribing an effective date.

Creates income tax credit for education of taxpayer dependent by means of home school.

SB 789 Sponsored by Senator GIROD -- Relating to durational limits on Governor's emergency powers.

Establishes durational limits for states of emergency declared under certain statutes.

SB 790 Sponsored by Senator KNOPP (at the request of LTC Dick Tobiasson) -- Relating to memorial highways; prescribing an effective date.

Provides that portion of U.S. Highway 30 in Oregon shall also be known as Oregon Veterans Memorial Highway.

SB 791 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative RAYFIELD -- Relating to ranked choice voting.

Establishes ranked choice voting as voting method for selecting winner of nomination for and election to nonpartisan state offices and county and city offices except where home rule charter applies.

SB 792 Sponsored by Senator GELSER -- Relating to information about children; declaring an emergency.

Exempts from disclosure as public record personally identifiable information about child under age of 16 years that is submitted to State Fish and Wildlife Commission or agent of commission to obtain license, tag or permit under wildlife laws.

SB 793 Sponsored by Senator GELSER -- Relating to district school board directors.

Requires that directors of district school boards be nominated for, and elected to, office based on zones of school district.

SB 794 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to parks user fees; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes fee differential for nonresident users of areas established and maintained by State Parks and Recreation Department and relating to recreational vehicles.

SB 795 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to nonresident user fees; prescribing an effective date.

Confers authority on State Parks and Recreation Commission to adopt fee differential for nonresident users of areas established and maintained by State Parks and Recreation Department.

SB 796 Sponsored by Senator HEARD -- Relating to predator damage control districts; prescribing an effective date.

Repeals sunset of predator damage control district program.

SB 797 Sponsored by Senator HEARD -- Relating to verification of age of majority as a condition of resident individual's access to pornography; prescribing an effective date.

Requires person that provides public access to pornography to verify that resident individual is 18 years of age or older before granting access.

SB 798 Sponsored by Senator HEARD -- Relating to campaign contribution limits.

Establishes \$100 limit on campaign contributions that may be accepted by candidates.

SB 799 Sponsored by Senator HEARD -- Relating to student medical history.

Prohibits school districts from requiring disclosure of student's medical history as condition of student attending school.

SB 800 Sponsored by Senator WAGNER (at the request of Oregon Health Care Association) -- Relating to health care.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations to interim committees of Legislative Assembly, no later than September 15, 2022, for legislative changes needed to increase access to health care for all Oregonians.

SB 801 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK -- Relating to processing procedures for workers' compensation claims.

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to study issues relating to workers' compensation claims processing and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

SB 802 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK -- Relating to workers' compensation for secondary effects of COVID-19.

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to study issues relating to workers' compensation for secondary effects of infection by SARS-CoV-2 or diagnosis with coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.

SB 803 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (at the request of Multnomah County District Attorney Mike Schmidt) -- Relating to catalytic converters.

Prohibits scrap metal business from purchasing or receiving catalytic converters, except from commercial seller.

SB 804 Sponsored by Senator ROBINSON -- Relating to school district budget expenditures; prescribing an effective date.

Requires school district boards to ensure that specified percentage of expenditures of school district are paid as compensation to teachers of core academic subjects or manual skills.

SB 805 Sponsored by Senator LIEBER -- Relating to vertical homeownership structures; prescribing an effective date.

Specifies length of period within which person or public body may bring action for construction defect in vertical homeownership structures as six years.

SB 806 Sponsored by Senator BEYER -- Relating to alcoholic beverages; prescribing an effective date.

Modifies definition of "malt beverage" for purpose of regulation and taxation of alcoholic beverages to align more closely with federal statutory definition of "beer." Increases alcohol by volume threshold percentage requiring additional privilege tax imposed on wine to match federal tax classification percentage.

SB 807 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to behavioral health.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to research, study and compare behavioral health treatments in other states and report findings and conclusions to interim judiciary committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 20, 2022.

SB 808 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to cannabis; declaring an emergency.

Directs Oregon Liquor Control Commission to study cannabis.

SB 809 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to fees; declaring an emergency.

Directs State Court Administrator to study fees.

SB 810 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to fines; prescribing an effective date.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study recidivism rates of persons ordered to pay fine as part of sentence and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

SB 811 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to community corrections; prescribing an effective date.

Directs Department of Corrections to study issues relating to community corrections financial grants to counties and to provide results of study to Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

SB 812 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to child support.

Directs Department of Justice to study and make recommendations on provisions of state law related to child support.

SB 813 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to civil proceedings; declaring an emergency.

Directs State Court Administrator to study civil proceedings.

SB 814 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to public safety standards; declaring an emergency.

Directs Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study public safety standards.

SB 815 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to pardons; prescribing an effective date.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study recidivism rates of persons granted pardon and to provide results of study to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2021.

SB 816 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to firearms in school zones; declaring an emergency.

Defines "school zone." Provides that person who knowingly possesses or discharges firearm in school zone commits Class C felony punishable by maximum of five years' imprisonment, \$125,000 fine, or both.

SB 817 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to monetary obligations arising out of juvenile delinquency matters; prescribing an effective date.

Eliminates fees, court costs and fines associated with juvenile delinquency matters.

SB 818 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to ratification of advance directive form adopted by Advance Directive Adoption Committee.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations regarding ratification of advance directive form adopted by Advance Directive Adoption Committee.

SB 819 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION (at the request of Criminal Justice Reform Clinic, Lewis and Clark Law School) -- Relating to petitions for conviction reconsideration.

Establishes procedure by which district attorney and incarcerated person may jointly petition sentencing court for reconsideration of conviction and sentence.

SB 820 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to sexual offense treatment.

Removes exception from regulation by Sexual Offense Treatment Board for certain persons.

SB 821 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to support orders.

Creates process to rebut presumption of inability to pay support order after support order is suspended and procedure upon reinstatement following rebuttal of presumption.

SB 822 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to child support.

Consolidates unpaid child support accruing under superseded child support order into amounts payable under later-issued court order.

SB 823 Sponsored by COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION -- Relating to firearm notifications.

Specifies procedures for providing notice to defendant in charging instrument and at arraignment when conviction would result in firearm prohibition.

SB 824 Sponsored by Senator ROBINSON -- Relating to ballot security.

Directs Secretary of State to establish and maintain searchable and publicly accessible database containing copy of every ballot cast in each election.

SB 825 Sponsored by Senator ROBINSON -- Relating to energy; prescribing an effective date.

Creates income tax credit for energy production in Oregon.

SB 826 Sponsored by Senator BOQUIST -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to Salvage Chief (LSM380) Foundation for purpose of repairing and upgrading salvage vessel.

SB 827 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to ballot measures.

Requires Secretary of State to submit to Legislative Assembly, by November 1 of each odd-numbered year, list of each prospective statewide initiative petition that has been filed for upcoming general election.

SB 828 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to forest health.

Makes certain findings concerning effects of poor forest management.

SB 829 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Oregon State Bar) -- Relating to possession of real property following execution sales.

Clarifies rights of possession of real property following execution sales.

SB 830 Sponsored by Senators PROZANSKI, MANNING JR, Representative PHAM; Senator FREDERICK -- Relating to legislator compensation; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes annual salary of members of Legislative Assembly at estimated average income of individual residents of Oregon.

SB 831 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Travis Glover) -- Relating to communications crimes.

Prohibits person from obtaining or attempting to obtain telecommunication or radio communication unless consent is given by all participants.

SB 832 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Animal Wellness Action, Center for a Humane Economy) -- Relating to mink farms; declaring an emergency.

Prohibits person, on or after effective date of Act, from breeding mink, transporting mink to or from mink farm or working at mink farm unless person has tested negative for COVID-19 within previous 10 days.

SB 833 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (at the request of Karen Austin) -- Relating to natural gas pipelines.

Authorizes Public Utility Commission to initiate proceeding to increase certainty concerning cost recovery for actions taken by natural gas utilities to reduce hazardous leaks and nonhazardous fugitive emissions from natural gas utility's gas pipeline system in this state.

SB 834 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to engine emissions; prescribing an effective date.

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to study impacts of engine emissions on environment and provide results of study in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

SB 835 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative REYNOLDS; Senator MANNING JR -- Relating to early medical release from prison; declaring an emergency; providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

Modifies procedures for early medical release of adult in custody from prison.

SB 836 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to the administration of alternative incarceration programs; declaring an emergency.

Directs Department of Corrections to consider all other alternatives before suspending, terminating or taking other specified action concerning alternative incarceration program.

SB 837 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to alcohol; prescribing an effective date.

Creates limited wholesale license to be issued to eligible applicant to store, transport, sell at wholesale and distribute certain cider and malt beverages.

SB 838 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to a real property ownership registry; prescribing an effective date.

Directs Secretary of State to establish real property ownership registry.

SB 839 Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW, Representative HOLVEY -- Relating to workforce standards for energy projects.

Prohibits Public Utility Commission from acknowledging in integrated resource plan, or allowing in customer rates, costs of investment in or upgrade of renewable energy facility, or certain contracts to acquire electricity, unless energy proposed to be acquired is generated by renewable energy facility constructed in compliance with certain labor standards.

SB 840 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR -- Relating to small watercraft registration fees.

Authorizes counties to establish county boating registration fee for purpose of disposing of derelict vessels.

SB 841 Sponsored by Senator MANNING JR -- Relating to the Department of Justice; declaring an emergency.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Justice for purposes of funding Environmental Crimes and Cultural Resources Enforcement Unit of department.

SB 842 Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON -- Relating to a subtraction for recovery rebates received by taxpayers; prescribing an effective date.

Creates income tax subtraction for recovery rebates paid to personal income taxpayers.

SB 843 Sponsored by Senator GELSER, Representative RAYFIELD -- Relating to the post-graduate scholar program; declaring an emergency.

Removes sunset on post-graduate scholar program.
