SJR 1 Sponsored by Senator HAYDEN (at the request of Sweet Home City Councilor Angelita Sanchez) (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to a property tax relief program for the owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution directing the Legislative Assembly to enact a property tax relief program for the owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 2 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Finance and Revenue) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to excluding partial exemptions and property tax credits from the requirement of redetermining the maximum assessed value of property granted exemption or credit.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to exclude partial exemptions of the assessed value of property, and tax credits against property taxes on property, from the requirement that the maximum assessed value of the property be redetermined when the property is first granted or disqualified from a partial exemption or property tax credit. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 3 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Finance and Revenue) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to ad valorem property taxation.

Proposes amendments to the Oregon Constitution providing that, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, maximum assessed value shall be reassessed upon the sale of property, the ratio of maximum assessed value to real market value of property may not be less than 0.75, and the maximum number of years for which a local option tax may be passed are extended and the tax is not subject to compression under Ballot Measure 5 (1990).

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution providing that the Legislative Assembly shall provide by law for indexing the rate of any motor vehicle fuel tax to inflation. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 5 Sponsored by Senator MANNING JR; Senators GOLDEN, PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to voter registration.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require voters to be registered by the day of an election. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election.

SJR 6 Sponsored by Senator MANNING JR; Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to elections for recalling public officers.

Amends the Oregon Constitution to require that a question of whether to recall a public officer must appear on the ballot at the next regularly scheduled election. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 7 Sponsored by Senator THATCHER; Senator BONHAM, Representative RESCHKE (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to the declaration of an emergency in legislative bills.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require a twothirds majority vote in favor in each chamber of the Legislative Assembly to pass bills declaring an emergency. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 8 Sponsored by Senator GIROD (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to an independent redistricting commission.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution establishing an independent redistricting commission to adopt redistricting maps for the Senate, House of Representatives and United States House of Representatives. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next general election.

SJR 9 Sponsored by Senator GIROD (Presession filed.) -Proposing an amendment to the Oregon
Constitution relating to conflict of interest rules for
the Legislative Assembly.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to prohibit members of the Legislative Assembly from voting on legislative measures when faced with a conflict of interest. Permits a vote to occur if the legislative entity is otherwise unable to muster sufficient votes to pass or defeat the measure.

SJR 10 Sponsored by Senator GIROD (Presession filed.) -Proposing an amendment to the Oregon
Constitution relating to limits on state
governmental appropriations.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to limit the increase in state governmental appropriations for general governmental purposes in a biennium to the least of the percentage increase in projected personal income, the percentage increase in projected population growth plus inflation or the percentage increase in projected gross domestic product of Oregon. Transfers any excess revenues to a reserve fund.

SJR 11 Sponsored by Senator GIROD (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to lottery revenues.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require a certain percentage of lottery revenues to be expended for wildfire prevention, suppression or management. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 12 Sponsored by Senator GIROD (Presession filed.) -Proposing an amendment to the Oregon
Constitution relating to requiring a two-thirds vote
to pass bills during even-numbered year regular
sessions.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require a vote of at least two-thirds of all members elected to each House of the Legislative Assembly to pass bills during an even-numbered year regular session of the Legislative Assembly. Refers the proposed amendment to voters for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to place durational and other limitations on declarations of emergency by the Governor. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 19 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to executive clemency.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require approval by a majority of the Senate of any pardon or commutation. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 20 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Proposing an amendment to the Oregon
Constitution relating to executive clemency.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require approval by a majority of the Senate of any reprieve, commutation or pardon. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 21 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to redistricting.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution establishing a Citizens Redistricting Commission to adopt redistricting maps for the Senate, House of Representatives and United States House of Representatives. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 22 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to a property tax relief program for the owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution directing the Legislative Assembly to enact a property tax relief program for the owner-occupied primary residences of certain seniors. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 23 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Proposing an amendment to the Oregon
Constitution expanding the scope of the term "bills
for raising revenue."

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to establish the right of a parent to choose the school that the parent's child attends. Requires the establishment of school choice accounts for parents who choose nonpublic education.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to eliminate even-numbered year regular sessions of the Legislative Assembly. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election held throughout this state.

SJR 27 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to the right to carry concealed firearms.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution establishing a right to carry concealed firearms. Refers the proposed amendment to the people for their approval or rejection at the next regular general election.

SJR 28 Sponsored by Senators GOLDEN, Representative ANDERSEN, GAMBA, Senators MANNING JR, PROZANSKI, Representative TRAN; Senators CAMPOS, FREDERICK, JAMA, MEEK, PHAM K, REYNOLDS, TAYLOR, Representatives CHAICHI, FRAGALA, HARTMAN, HELM, HUDSON, MARSH, NELSON, NOSSE (Presession filed.) -- Proposing an

amendment to the Oregon Constitution relating to a clean, safe and healthy environment.

Proposes an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to require petition signatures for initiative amendments to the Oregon Constitution to contain at least ten percent of the total votes cast for all candidates for Governor at the last general election at which a Governor was elected divided equally among the congressional districts of this state.

This is an appropriation measure.

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Advocacy Commissions Office for biennial expenses.

SB 5502 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to the financial administration of the State Department of Agriculture; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the State Department of Agriculture for certain biennial expenses.

SB 5503 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Approves certain new or increased fees adopted by the State Department of Agriculture.

SB 5504 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to the financial administration of the Oregon Department of Aviation; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Oregon Department of Aviation.

SB 5505 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Establishes amounts authorized for issuance of general obligation bonds, revenue bonds, certificates of participation and other financing agreements for the biennium.

SB 5506 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Limits for the six-year period beginning July 1, 2025, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

SB 5507 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Oregon Department of Administrative Services) -- Relating to the financial administration of the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners; declaring an emergency.

This is an appropriation measure.

Limits biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the State Board of Chiropractic Examiners.

 -- Relating to relocating beavers.

Directs the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to include the relocation of beavers from western Oregon to central and eastern Oregon in a program for voluntarily relocating beavers.

Prohibits a gun dealer from transferring a firearm or unfinished frame or receiver until 72 hours have elapsed from the time the gun dealer requested a criminal background check, and the gun dealer has received the background check approval number from the Department of State Police.

<u>SB</u> 430 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to disclosures required in connection with online transactions; prescribing an effective date.

Specifies disclosures that a retail seller must make to a retail buyer for a transaction in goods or services that concludes online by means of a website or other electronic method.

 $\frac{SB}{}$ $\frac{431}{}$ Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to state offices.

Requires the Secretary of State to study state offices and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to general government not later than September 15, 2026.

<u>SB</u> <u>432</u> Sponsored by Senators PROZANSKI, GIROD, SMITH DB; Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) Relating to addressing wildfire originating on federal lands.

Instructs the forester, or a forest protective association or agency that is under contract or agreement with the State Board of Forestry for the protection of forestland against fire, and whose protection area is or may be affected by a fire on nearby federal lands, to take certain actions to address the fire.

SB 433 Sponsored by Senators ANDERSON, PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a self-service storage facility's sales of personal property subject to a lien.

Permits the owner of a self-service storage facility to advertise or publish a notice of sale of personal property that is subject to a lien once on a publicly accessible website that regularly advertises or offers personal property for auction or sale.

SB 434 Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Ocean Beach Fund; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes the Ocean Beach Fund.

SB 435 Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Housing Accountability and Production Office.

Requires the Department of Land Conservation and Development to study the Housing Accountability and Production Office and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing no later than September 15, 2026.

<u>SB</u> <u>436</u> Sponsored by Senator ANDERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to constructing child care facilities within projects for affordable housing; prescribing an effective date.

Provides that constructing a nonprofit child care facility within a project for affordable housing does not subject the project for affordable housing to prevailing wage requirements if the child care facility meets specified requirements.

Expands the application of certain statutes requiring publication in a newspaper to allow publication in online news publications.

Establishes the COFA Shared Services Office to assist COFA citizens in applying for and accessing benefits and services.

<u>SB</u> <u>443</u> Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to family medicine residency training programs.

Appropriates moneys to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for distribution to the Area Health Education Center program of Oregon Health and Science University for supporting the Oregon Academy of Family Physicians.

<u>\$\$B\$\$ 444</u> Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representative NERON; Senator CAMPOS, Representative HUDSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to accessibility standards for housing; prescribing an effective date.

Requires the Director of the Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules to conform the state building code to accessibility requirements under the Fair Housing Act and to certain American National Standards Institute standards for housing accessibility.

Designates November 14 of each year as Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day.

Prohibits cost-sharing on certain health insurance coverage of cervical cancer examinations.

SB 460 Sponsored by Senator WEBER, Representative JAVADI; Senator THATCHER, Representatives LEVY B, OSBORNE, WRIGHT (Presession filed.) -- Relating to an exemption of pre-apprenticeship participants from the application of the prevailing rate of wage; prescribing an effective date.

Exempts workers on public works who are participants in a preapprenticeship program from the application of laws that determine and require payment of a prevailing rate of wage.

SB 461 Sponsored by Senator WEBER, Representatives HELFRICH, JAVADI; Representatives EDWARDS, GOMBERG, OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to documents issued under the wildlife laws.

SB 467 Sponsored by Senator WEBER; Senators CAMPOS, FREDERICK, THATCHER, WOODS, Representatives JAVADI, LEVY B, NELSON, NGUYEN H, OSBORNE, WRIGHT (Presession filed.)
-- Relating to tax credits for child care workers; prescribing an effective date.

Creates a refundable income tax credit for certain child care workers.

SB 468 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI, Representative NATHANSON, Senator MANNING JR (Presession filed.) -- Relating to employment agreements for health professionals.

Provides that a noncompetition agreement is void and unenforceable if entered into with an employee who is a health professional.

Prohibits the Department of Environmental Quality from determining, for purposes of issuing a sewage disposal construction permit, that a community or area-wide sewerage system is available unless the sewerage system is within 200 feet of the property to be served.

Requires a license to provide earned income access services in this state.

Directs an arresting officer to notify federal immigration authorities when a person is arrested for delivery or manufacture of a controlled substance.

492 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Department of State Police. SB

Establishes a division in the Department of State Police to enforce laws related to illegal marijuana cultivation.

493 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB; Representative GRAYBER (Presession filed.) -- Relating to short-SBacting opioid antagonists; declaring an emergency.

Allows an emergency medical responder and an emergency medical technician to draw up and administer one or more doses of a shortacting opioid antagonist from a container that contains multiple doses of the short-acting opioid antagonist.

494 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) SBRelating to employment of forestry workers.

Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study classification and compensation for forestry and wildland fire positions in state government.

SB 495 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to residential rent increase limits.

Exempts residential tenancies within 25 miles of the coastline from maximum limits on rent increases.

496 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) SBRelating to rent increase limits.

Repeals limits on the increases to residential rent that a landlord may charge.

SB 497 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) Relating to construction standards for energy efficiency; prescribing an effective date.

Appropriates moneys to the Housing and Community Services Department to replace manufactured dwellings in specified counties. **SB** 500 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to tax incentives for affordable housing; prescribing an effective date.

Allows a new income or corporate excise tax credit for a portion of the eligible costs of a newly constructed single-family dwelling that sells for a price that is affordable to a household with an annual income at or below 120 percent of the area median income.

<u>SB</u> 501 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -Relating to standing in land use appeal.

Limits standing in appeals of land use decisions or limited land use decisions to persons that reside or maintain a business in or within 25 miles of a boundary of local government or special district and appeared before a decision maker in person at a hearing, if available.

SB 502 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to attorney fees for appeal of quasi-judicial land use decisions.

Requires the Land Conservation and Development Commission to adopt rules by January 1, 2028, to allow soil bioengineering systems for shoreline stabilization.

505 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to county emergency management.

Directs the Oregon Department of Emergency Management to develop and implement a grant program to distribute moneys to certain counties to fund emergency preparedness coordinators.

SB 506 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.) -- Relating to prohibiting gender-affirming care at correctional facilities.

Directs the State Fish and Wildlife Commission to operate a summer steelhead fish hatchery at the Rock Creek Hatchery and release the hatchery fish into the North Umpqua River.

Requires the State Department of Fish and Wildlife to study stocking protocols for salmon and other fish.

SB 514 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative BOICE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the impacts of wildfire on water quality.

Requires the State Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Environmental Quality to study the impacts of wildfire on water quality of streams and tributaries.

SB 515 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.)
 -- Relating to the impacts of sediment on the Rogue River; prescribing an effective date.

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to the Umpqua Fishery Enhancement Derby to facilitate salmonid habitat restoration projects.

SB 516 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative OWENS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a program of state inspection by the State Department of Agriculture; declaring an emergency.

Appropriates moneys to the State Department of Agriculture for purposes related to a program of state inspection for the processing and sale of meat products from nonamenable species.

Distributes the balance of the proceeds from county sales of real property to the county general fund.

SB 518 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative BOICE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to county property tax collection; prescribing an effective date.

Authorizes a county tax collector to withhold from property tax distributions to taxing districts within the county an amount equal to three percent of the distributions.

SB 519 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.)
 Relating to a taxable income exemption for taxpayers who are a veteran.

Exempts from state income tax for a taxpayer who is a veteran all retirement pay or pension received for service in the Armed Forces of the United States.

SB 520 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representatives BOICE, OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to veterans.

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, to provide transportation services to the Roseburg Veterans Affairs Medical Center for veterans residing in Coos and Curry Counties.

SB 521 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to urban reserves.

Requires additional cities to develop urban reserves.

SB 522 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to clustered resource dwellings.

Authorizes counties to allow contiguous clustered nonresource dwellings on a clustered development tract in lieu of approval of individual nonresource dwellings on lands zoned for forest or farm

<u>523</u> Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.)
 -- Relating to the transition from an abbreviated school day program; declaring an emergency.

Allows a student with a disability to use transitional services available to students without disabilities when the student's parent or foster parent revokes consent for, or objects to, the student's placement on an abbreviated school day program.

Sp. 524 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.)
 Relating to exemptions of abbreviated school day program requirements; declaring an emergency.

Excludes certain students from the requirements of an abbreviated school day program.

SB 525 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative OSBORNE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to residential land use.

Amends expedited land division criteria and processes.

SB 526 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON; Senator SOLLMAN, Representatives ANDERSEN, GAMBA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to microfibers.

Prohibits the sale of new clothes washers that are not equipped with a microfiber filtration system, beginning January 1, 2030.

SB 527 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON; Senator FREDERICK, Representative DIEHL (Presession filed.) -- Relating to behavioral health workforce training for students; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement a grant program to distribute moneys to local workforce development boards to partner with certain entities to provide behavioral health education and training for high school students.

SB 528 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON; Senators GELSER BLOUIN, REYNOLDS, Representative CHAICHI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to regional health equity coalitions; declaring an emergency.

Appropriates moneys to be used for regional health equity coalitions.

<u>SB</u> <u>529</u> Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to community health; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations to contract directly with traditional health workers, community health registered nurses and community-based organizations to provide services to medical assistance recipients.

SB 530 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON; Senators GELSER BLOUIN, REYNOLDS, Representatives CHAICHI, MARSH (Presession filed.) -- Relating to regional health equity coalitions; declaring an emergency.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to adjust for inflation the amount of any grant awarded to a regional health equity coalition.

SB 531 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representative PHAM H; Senator CAMPOS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a wellness program for Oregon health care professionals; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to distribute moneys to the Oregon Wellness Program for specified purposes.

SB 532 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representative
 NOSSE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to dental insurers.

Requires dental insurers to follow certain rules for payment and denial of claims.

SB 533 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representative NOSSE; Senator MEEK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to restrictions on 340B covered entities.

Creates a civil penalty for drug manufacturers that interfere directly or indirectly with certain entities acquiring 340B drugs, delivering 340B drugs to certain health care providers or dispensing 340B drugs.

SB 534 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to allowable claims of equity in a property that is subject to a reverse mortgage; declaring an emergency.

Allows a lender that, in a reverse mortgage, provides a lump sum in exchange for a claim upon the equity of a property to claim as the lender's equity, and receive as proceeds in a sale of the property, not more than the percentage of the total equity in the property to which the lump sum is equivalent on the date the lender provides the lump sum.

Requires health insurance coverage of specified fertility services and treatments with exemption for certain insurers.

Provides that a licensed physician associate or nurse practitioner may be a medical examiner.

Requires the Department of Human Services to pay parents to provide attendant care services for children with developmental disabilities who have very high behavioral health or medical needs.

SB 539 Sponsored by Senator PATTERSON, Representatives MANNIX, BOWMAN; Senator GORSEK, Representatives SOSA, WALTERS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to fees charged for services provided in hospital-based facilities.

Requires a hospital or the hospital's health system to report annually to the Oregon Health Authority certain information regarding facility fees that are charged or billed for patient visits at the hospital's or health system's hospital-based facilities.

-- Relating to drug labeling requirements;
prescribing an effective date.

Requires a drug manufacturer or wholesaler to state on the label of an orally administered drug any ingredients derived from glutencontaining grains.

 -- Relating to computer science education; declaring an emergency.

Requires school district boards to ensure all schools offer computer science education in all grades.

Makes certain findings related to gluten.

SB 543 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (at the request of Centro Cultural de Washington County) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to traffic safety education.

Directs the Department of Transportation to translate student driver education curriculum and student driver instructor curriculum into the Spanish language and post the materials on the department's website.

 -- Relating to the installation of vaporizing detection devices in high schools.

Requires vaporizing detection devices to be installed in certain areas of high schools that have 1,000 or more enrolled students.

Establishes an income tax credit for volunteer firefighters.

<u>SB</u> 546 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (Presession filed.)
 Relating to signature collection for charitable checkoff participation; prescribing an effective date.

Allows the Department of Revenue to establish electronic means for the collection of elector signatures in support of inclusion of an entity on a schedule of the income tax return for the purpose of receiving contributions by means of checkoff.

SB 547 Sponsored by Senators SOLLMAN, GELSER BLOUIN; Senators BROADMAN, CAMPOS, LIEBER, MEEK, REYNOLDS, WEBER, Representatives MCLAIN, NATHANSON (at the request of Luci Moody) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to Oregon

Native Plant Appreciation Month; declaring an emergency.

Designates the month of April of each year as Oregon Native Plant Appreciation Month.

SB 548 Sponsored by Senators SOLLMAN, SMITH DB, Representative MANNIX; Senators FREDERICK, GELSER BLOUIN, GOLDEN, PATTERSON, TAYLOR, THATCHER, WEBER, Representatives BOWMAN, CHAICHI, GAMBA, GRAYBER, LIVELY, NGUYEN D, OSBORNE, RESCHKE, SOSA, TRAN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to marriage.

Increases the minimum legal marriageable age to 18 years of age.

SB 549 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN, Representative MARSH; Senators CAMPOS, MEEK, REYNOLDS, Representatives FRAGALA, GAMBA, GOMBERG, GRAYBER, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NELSON, NOSSE, SOSA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to complex rehabilitation technology.

Prohibits the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations from requiring prior authorization for the repair of complex rehabilitation technology.

SB 550 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN, Representative MARSH; Senators CAMPOS, MEEK, REYNOLDS, Representatives FRAGALA, GAMBA, GOMBERG, GRAYBER, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NELSON, NOSSE, SOSA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a right to repair consumer equipment.

Adds electric wheelchairs and complex rehabilitation technology to the type of consumer equipment for which an original equipment manufacturer must make available to an owner or independent repair provider a tool, part or other device or implement that the original equipment manufacturer makes available to an authorized service provider for the purpose of diagnosing, maintaining, repairing or updating consumer equipment.

SB 551 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN, Representatives NERON, ANDERSEN; Senators PATTERSON, REYNOLDS, Representatives FRAGALA, GAMBA, GOMBERG, HUDSON, LIVELY, NOSSE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to plastic waste.

Prohibits restaurants and retailers from providing reusable plastic checkout bags to consumers.

<u>SB</u> 552 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public defense.

Directs the Oregon Public Defense Commission to study best practices to improve the provision of public defense services within this state, and provide the results of the study to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly no later than December 31, 2026.

Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (Presession filed.)
 -- Relating to data center power usage.

Requires the State Department of Energy to study data center power usage.

<u>554</u> Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (Presession filed.)
 -- Relating to reusable packaging systems.

Requires the Department of Environmental Quality to study reusable packaging systems.

SB 555 Sponsored by Senator WAGNER (Presession filed.) - Relating to Legislative Policy and Research Office confidentiality.

Makes research requested, collected, maintained or utilized by the Legislative Policy and Research Office confidential unless it is specifically authorized to be released. SB 556 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to cannabis; prescribing an effective date.

Allows a marijuana producer, marijuana wholesaler, marijuana processor or marijuana retailer to use a motion detection camera system at a licensed premises.

<u>SB</u> <u>557</u> Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to membership requirements of the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission.

Requires at least one of the commissioners of the Oregon Liquor and Cannabis Commission to hold a marijuana processor, marijuana producer, marijuana retailer or marijuana wholesaler license.

SB 558 Sponsored by Senator PROZANSKI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to cannabis market growth; prescribing an effective date.

Replaces the phrase "men and women" with gender-neutral terms in certain statutes.

Requires filing officers in each county and city to make publicly available on the county or city website within two business days certain election documents that are filed with the filing officer.

581 Sponsored by Senator FREDERICK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to mental health care provider incentives; prescribing an effective date.

Creates the psychology provider incentive program within the Oregon Health Authority to provide financial incentives to students enrolled in approved doctoral programs in psychology who complete courses that provide cultural competency training.

Requires the Public Employees Retirement Board to study retirement

Reduces from 90 to 45 days the termination notice period that a landlord must give the tenant when selling the dwelling unit to buyers who intend to reside in the unit.

Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to study affordable housing.

SB 601 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS, Representative SOSA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to affordable housing.

Requires the Housing and Community Services Department to study affordable housing and submit findings to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to housing no later than September 15, 2026.

Establishes the Nonprofit Organization Advisory Council within the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

SB 603 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS (Presession filed.) --Relating to standards for state agencies that award grants to nonprofit organizations; prescribing an effective date. Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish guidelines for state agencies to follow in designing programs and establishing budgets for ongoing or multiyear activities that state agencies intend to fund with grant moneys.

<u>8B</u> <u>604</u> Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS; Representative CHAICHI (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Strong Start Program; declaring an emergency.

Establishes the Strong Start Program within the Higher Education Coordinating Commission for purposes of providing support to firstyear and underrepresented students at public universities in this

<u>SB</u> 605 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS, Representative SOSA; Senators FREDERICK, PATTERSON, PATTERSON, Representatives CHAICHI, GOMBERG, NELSON, PHAM H (Presession filed.) -- Relating to medical debt reporting.

Prohibits medical service providers from reporting the amount or existence of medical debt to a consumer reporting agency.

606 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS (Presession filed.) --SBRelating to occupational disease.

Adds certain health care employees to the list of workers for whom certain stress disorders give rise to a presumption that a workers' compensation claim is compensable as an occupational disease.

SB 607 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS (Presession filed.) --Relating to behavioral health services provided by federally qualified health centers.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to study alternative payment methodologies to improve access to behavioral health care in federally qualified health centers in this state.

608 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS, Representatives
PHAM H, ISADORE; Senator PHAM K,
Representatives CHOTZEN, GOMBERG,
HARTMAN, NGUYEN H (Presession filed.) --SBRelating to services for medically complex Oregonians.

Directs the Department of Human Services to establish an Exceptional Home Care Worker Certification program.

SB609 Sponsored CAMPOS; by Senator Senators PATTERSON, REYNOLDS, Representative BOWMAN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to equitable access to health care services.

Establishes minimum amounts of reimbursement for primary care, optometry, dental care and behavioral health services provided to recipients of medical assistance.

610 Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS (Presession filed.) -- \mathbf{SB} Relating to funding for substance use services.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study the funding formula under Ballot Measure 110 (2020).

<u>SB</u> <u>611</u> Sponsored by Senator CAMPOS, Representative RUIZ; Senators FREDERICK, GÉLSER BLOUIN, GOLDEN, GORSEK, MEEK, PATTERSON, PHAM K, REYNOLDS, WOODS, Representatives ANDERSEN, BOWMAN, CHAICHI, GAMBA, GRAYBER, HUDSON, ISADORE, NELSON, NOSSE, OWENS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public assistance; declaring an emergency.

Establishes the Food for All Oregonians Program in the Department of Human Services to provide nutrition assistance to residents of this state who would qualify for the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program but for their immigration status.

612 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to undocumented individuals.

Directs the Department of Corrections to establish and update a list of each undocumented individual who has been charged with or convicted of a crime in this state and each crime for which an undocumented individual has been charged or convicted.

SB 613 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -· Relating to the repeal of certain provisions related to pay equity; declaring an emergency.

Modifies pay equity requirements for employers.

SB 614 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to inherently dangerous activities; declaring an emergency. sporting

Allows an operator offering or providing facilities for an inherently dangerous sporting activity to require a patron to provide an anticipatory release from certain claims for liability, including claims arising out of the negligence of the operator and claims for unreasonable conditions created by the operator.

SB 615 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -· Relating to permanent physical injury.

Establishes a procedure for charging an aggravated version of certain assault and attempted murder offenses when the defendant causes permanent physical injury to the victim during the commission of the crime.

SB 616 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to preservation of trees for housing development.

Prohibits a local government from conditioning the development or use of property for needed housing based on the retention of trees.

<u>SB</u> <u>617</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to crime.

Provides that an admission or a finding that a crime constitutes domestic violence is not an element of the crime for merger purposes.

SB 618 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to participation in athletic competitions according to biological sex; declaring an emergency.

Requires school districts to designate athletic competitions and extracurricular sports according to biological sex.

SB 619 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to executive clemency.

Requires that all executive clemency actions by the Governor be initiated by application and follow specified procedures.

SB 620 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to settlement agreements entered into by the Department of Justice.

Requires the Attorney General to report annually to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary on settlement agreements entered into by the Department of Justice that require the state to pay over \$4 million.

<u>SB</u> <u>621</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -- Relating to approval of state agency fees by Legislative Assembly; declaring an emergency.

Provides that new or increased fees adopted by state agencies do not become effective unless approved by the Legislative Assembly by

SB 622 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) -Relating to employment subject to unemployment insurance taxes; prescribing an effective date.

Exempts employers of noncitizens in agricultural labor who are not eligible for unemployment insurance benefits from liability for contributions related to that labor.

SB 623 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to the offense of attempting to elude a police officer.

Increases sentencing guidelines for felony attempting to elude a police officer.

SB 624 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to recipients of public moneys; prescribing an effective date.

Requires certain recipients of grant or loan moneys distributed by state agencies to submit annual reports to committees of the Legislative Assembly.

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to the repeal of provisions related to requirements for agricultural overtime; prescribing an effective date.

Repeals provisions requiring employers to pay overtime to agricultural workers who work in excess of the maximum allowable hours.

SB 626 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to encouraging child sexual abuse; declaring an emergency.

Expands the crimes of encouraging child sexual abuse in the first degree, second degree and third degree to include visual depictions of child abuse that are computer-generated.

<u>SB</u> <u>627</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to vehicle registration.

Provides that vehicle registration for most vehicles will be ownership registration and owners must pay a one-time fee instead of a biennial fee.

SB 628 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Sherry Dahl) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to informed consent.

Requires a physician or physician associate to attempt to obtain a patient's informed consent for dismissal to seek emergency medical treatment or for transfer of care to another physician or physician associate.

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to the Oregon Medical Board.

Requires the Oregon Medical Board to consider a reasonable person standard in determining what constitutes unprofessional conduct.

SB 630 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to scholarships for use at participating nonpublic schools.

Establishes the Educational Scholarship Program for the purpose of assisting eligible students to pay for costs of attendance at certain nonpublic schools.

Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to instruction on the prevention of sex trafficking of children; declaring an emergency.

Directs each school district board to adopt a child sexual abuse prevention instructional program that addresses sex trafficking of children.

SB 632 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to public charter school eligibility for grants from the Student Investment Account; declaring an emergency.

Allows virtual public charter schools to be eligible for grants distributed from the Student Investment Account.

SB 633 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to enrollment in virtual public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

Removes the requirement that a student must receive approval from the student's resident school district before enrolling in a virtual public charter school that is not sponsored by the school district if a specified percentage of students in the school district already are enrolled in virtual public charter schools that are not sponsored by the school district.

SB 634 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to the use of hydroelectric energy to comply with a renewable portfolio standard; declaring an emergency.

Specifies that electricity generated by a hydroelectric facility or other equipment that generates electricity through use of hydroelectric energy may be used to comply with a renewable portfolio standard.

SB 635 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to a study on the feasibility of developing nuclear energy generation in this state; declaring an emergency.

Directs Oregon State University to conduct a feasibility study on nuclear energy generation in this state.

SB 636 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Relating to payment for use of the roads by electric motor vehicles.

Requires the Department of Transportation to study the creation of a road usage charge to ensure that electric and hybrid motor vehicles pay their equitable share for the wear they cause to the highways in Oregon.

SB 637 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Relating to the transfer to the State Highway Fund of charges imposed to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from the use of motor vehicle fuel.

Requires state agencies that administer programs to reduce greenhouse gas emissions from the combustion of motor vehicle fuel to deposit fees, assessments or other charges imposed pursuant to the program in the State Highway Fund.

SB 638 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to small forestland owners.

Provides that a small forestland owner that planted trees under reforestation requirements may harvest the trees.

SB 639 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to low forest fuel load levels on state forestland.

Requires the State Forester to actively manage state forestlands to achieve and maintain low forest fuel load levels.

SB 640 Sponsored by Senators BONHAM, GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to crime victims who are under 18 years of age.

Modifies the types of familial relationships involved in a manner of committing rape in the first degree and sodomy in the first degree.

SB 641 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to land rights of People's Republic of China in this state.

Prohibits China or entities under the jurisdiction of China from buying or leasing farmlands.

<u>SB</u> <u>642</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Relating to state financial administration.

Appropriates moneys to the Department of State Police for the purpose of reducing the backlog of untested sexual assault forensic evidence kits.

SB 643 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to residential tenancies.

Allows landlords to terminate month-to-month residential tenancies without cause.

SB 644 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) Relating to auditing the Oregon Food Bank; declaring an emergency.

Establishes the Oregon Food Bank Audit Committee as a joint committee of the Legislative Assembly.

SB 645 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (Presession filed.) - Relating to the regulation of public property with respect to persons experiencing homelessness; declaring an emergency.

Repeals the statute enacted by House Bill 3115 (2021) that established objective reasonableness as a statewide standard for city and county laws regulating the use of public property with respect to persons experiencing homelessness, as the basis for a cause of action for injunctive and declaratory relief to challenge such laws and as an affirmative defense in the prosecution of violations of such laws.

SB 646 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to school access.

Allows a student who is a resident of this state to attend any public school of this state. $\,$

SB 647 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to virtual public charter school enrollment.

Increases to five percent the cap on the percentage of students from school districts who may attend certain virtual public charter schools without the approval of the school district.

SB 648 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to conforming estate tax to federal basic exclusion amount; prescribing an effective date.

Provides that, for the estates of decedents dying on or after January 1, 2026, Oregon estate tax is not due unless the value of the Oregon taxable estate exceeds \$13.

SB 649 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to estate tax; prescribing an effective date.

Provides that the Oregon estate tax is imposed only on the estates of decedents dying on or before January 1, 2025.

<u>SB</u> <u>650</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a specially assessed value for the residences of seniors; prescribing an effective date.

Provides, for purposes of ad valorem property taxation, a specially assessed value for the owner-occupied primary residences of individuals who are at least 65 years of age.

SB 651 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Secretary of State's business registry functions.

Requires the Secretary of State to study methods for reducing the paperwork filing burden on businesses in this state.

SB 652 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to reading instruction; declaring an emergency.

Allows a school district, an education service district or a public charter school to employ a person who is not licensed or registered with the Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to teach reading to students.

<u>SB</u> <u>653</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the abolishment of the Department of Education.

Establishes the Task Force to Abolish the Department of Education.

SB 654 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the development of student vocational skills.

Authorizes district school boards to establish a policy to encourage students to develop vocational skills by performing maintenance tasks for school districts.

<u>SB</u> <u>655</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to ballot security.

Directs the Secretary of State to establish and maintain a searchable and publicly accessible database containing a copy of every ballot cast in each election.

<u>SB</u> <u>656</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to energy; prescribing an effective date.

Creates an income tax credit for energy production in Oregon.

SB 657 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to school district budget expenditures; declaring an emergency.

Requires school district boards to ensure that a specified percentage of expenditures of the school district are paid as compensation to teachers of core academic subjects or manual skills.

<u>SB</u> <u>658</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to employment preference for veterans.

Provides that, when an interview is an element of the process of selecting a candidate for a civil service position from an eligibility list, the public employer must interview each veteran applicant who meets the qualifications for the position and shows transferable skills if the duties of the position are performed by only one person within the public employer's organization.

<u>SB</u> <u>659</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to waiver of tuition.

Prohibits the amount of tuition that is waived for qualified students from being reduced by the amount of specified student aid received by the qualified students.

SB 660 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the expenditure of state moneys based on the amount that is attributable to a student; prescribing an effective date.

Requires each school district, education service district and public charter school to ensure that state moneys received by the district or school are used to educate the student for which the moneys are received

SB 661 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to social studies standards; declaring an emergency.

Repeals the directive to the State Board of Education to review social studies standards.

<u>SB</u> <u>662</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a tax credit for political contributions; prescribing an effective date.

Increases the maximum allowable amount of political contribution personal income tax credit.

<u>SB</u> <u>663</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to fees.

Prohibits state agencies from charging fees.

<u>\$\frac{\text{SB}}{2}\$</u> \frac{\text{664}}{2} Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to gravity separation mines.

Provides that mines solely using gravity separation shall be deemed gravity separation mines.

<u>SB</u> <u>665</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to monetary penalties.

Requires public bodies to transfer moneys deriving from certain fines and civil penalties to the General Fund for general governmental nurposes.

<u>SB</u> <u>666</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to abortion restrictions; prescribing an effective date.

Prohibits an abortion unless a health care provider first determines the probable gestational age of the unborn child, except in the case of a medical emergency.

SB 667 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of former Senator Dennis Linthicum) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the militia of the state.

Prohibits the Governor from ordering out for service the militia of the state for participation in or support of an armed conflict or the conduct of war unless the United States Congress passes a declaration of war or calls forth the militia of the state to execute the laws of the United States, suppress an insurrection or repel an invasion.

<u>SB</u> <u>668</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to tuition benefits connected to disabled veterans; declaring an emergency.

Expands tuition benefits available to disabled veterans to permit veterans who are Oregon residents and are 80 percent or more disabled, and the spouse and child of disabled veterans, to have tuition waived for enrollment in a vocational program or an associate degree, baccalaureate degree or master's degree program at community colleges, public universities and the Oregon Health and Science University.

<u>SB</u> <u>669</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to procedures for the reduction of educator staff; declaring an emergency.

Requires a school district that is making reductions in educator staff positions to prioritize seniority when determining which teachers to retain

<u>SB</u> <u>670</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to possession of controlled substances; prescribing an effective date.

Restores, for possession of a controlled substance crimes, the offense level each crime had prior to the enactment of the Drug Addiction Treatment and Recovery Act of 2020 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020)).

SB 671 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to duties of the Oregon Government Ethics Commission.

Dissolves the Oregon Government Ethics Commission as of July 2, 2027

SB 672 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to prohibiting gender-affirming care at correctional facilities.

Prohibits the Department of Corrections, Oregon Youth Authority or Oregon Health Authority from paying for or providing, directly or indirectly, gender-affirming care to individuals in the custody of a correctional facility in this state.

<u>SB</u> <u>673</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Columbia River.

Instructs the Water Resources Commission to allow the appropriation of water from the mainstem of the Columbia River for use in eastern Oregon.

SB 674 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Columbia River.

Instructs the Water Resources Commission to allow the appropriation of water from the mainstem of the Columbia River at a total rate and duty of two percent of average annual flow.

SB 675 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to interest on unpaid property taxes; prescribing an effective date.

Lowers the interest rate imposed on unpaid property taxes to one-half of one percent per month.

SB 676 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to veterans' loans for acquisition of real property.

Limits the interest rate to no more than the prime rate plus one percent for loans advanced under the veterans' home and farm loan program.

SB 677 Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the provision of menstrual products in schools; declaring an emergency.

Removes the requirement that menstrual products be provided in public charter schools and in bathrooms designated for males.

<u>SB</u> <u>678</u> Sponsored by Senator BONHAM (at the request of Senator Noah Robinson) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to wildfire; declaring an emergency.

Undoes wildfire protection provisions adopted in Senate Bill 762 (2021).

SB 679 Sponsored by Senator GOLDEN (Presession filed.) Relating to harms associated with climate change; declaring an emergency.

Provides that parties that have caused a certain amount of greenhouse gas emissions are strictly liable to harmed parties for damages incurred as a result of extreme weather attributable to climate change or a climate disaster.

SB 680 Sponsored by Senators GOLDEN, MANNING JR;
 Senators CAMPOS, FREDERICK, GORSEK,
 PATTERSON, PROZANSKI, TAYLOR (Presession filed.) -- Relating to greenwashing; declaring an emergency.

Prohibits a person from publishing or causing to be published an environmental marketing claim, net zero claim or reputational advertising that is materially false, misleading, deceptive or fraudulent.

SB 681 Sponsored by Senator GOLDEN; Senators FREDERICK, PHAM K, TAYLOR, Representatives FRAGALA, GAMBA, HUDSON, NELSON, NOSSE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a moratorium on private investments by the State Treasurer in fossil fuel dominant funds.

Prohibits the State Treasurer from renewing investments in or making new investments in a private market fund if the managers of the fund have stated an intention to invest in fossil fuels, subject to fiduciary duties.

SB 682 Sponsored by Senators GOLDEN, Representatives ANDERSEN, GAMBA, Senators CAMPOS, PHAM K; Senators FREDERICK, MANNING JR, MEEK, TAYLOR, Representatives CHAICHI, FRAGALA, HELM, HUDSON, NELSON (Presession filed.) --Relating to greenhouse gas emissions; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes the Climate Superfund Cost Recovery Program within the Department of Environmental Quality.

<u>683</u> Sponsored by Senator GOLDEN (Presession filed.) Relating to primary care physicians; prescribing an effective date.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to conduct a study every two years to count the number of licensed and actively practicing primary care physicians in this state.

SB 684 Sponsored by Senator PHAM K; Representatives GAMBA, GOMBERG, NELSON, NERON, NOSSE, VALDERRAMA, WALTERS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to housing.

Directs the Housing and Community Services Department to establish a program to issue low-interest short-term loans for the construction of mixed income public developments.

SB 685 Sponsored by Senators PHAM K, GOLDEN; Senators CAMPOS, GORSEK, MANNING JR, TAYLOR, Representatives CHOTZEN, GAMBA, NOSSE (Presession filed.) -- Relating to hydrogen; declaring an emergency.

Requires a public utility to obtain authorization from the Public Utility Commission to develop or carry out a project that involves the production or use of hydrogen in this state.

SB 686 Sponsored by Senator PHAM K, Representative WALTERS, Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Senators CAMPOS, GOLDEN, Representatives BOWMAN, CHAICHI, GAMBA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to civic information.

Requires online platforms to pay digital journalism providers or donate to the Oregon Civic Information Consortium.

SB 687 Sponsored by Senator PHAM K; Representatives GAMBA, HUDSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to transportation.

Provides that certain local governments may enact a fuel tax or vehicle registration fee without first submitting the proposed tax or registration fee to the electors.

Creates the Oregon Rail Department.

SB 690 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON, NELSON; Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to perinatal public health.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority to study perinatal public health issues.

SB 691 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON, WALLAN; Senator GELSER BLOUIN, Representative NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to health care.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority to distribute moneys to an entity within the Oregon Health and Science University that advocates for improved maternal and neonatal outcomes.

SB 692 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON; Senator GELSER BLOUIN, Representative NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to perinatal services.

Establishes a community-based perinatal provider access program to increase access to culturally specific perinatal services and culturally competent perinatal services providers.

SB 693 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON, NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the perinatal workforce; prescribing an effective date.

Establishes the Task Force on the Perinatal Workforce.

SB 694 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON, VALDERRAMA; Senator GELSER BLOUIN, Representative NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to children; prescribing an effective date.

Modifies the child tax credit by increasing the maximum amount of the credit and increasing income limits.

SB 695 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives GRAYBER, NERON; Representatives NELSON, PHAM H (Presession filed.) -- Relating to coordinated care organizations; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Oregon Health Authority, for contracts entered into between the authority and a coordinated care organization, to establish terms and conditions designed to achieve transformational changes to maternal and infant health.

Sp. 696 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives MCDONALD, GRAYBER, KROPF; Senators BROADMAN, MANNING JR, PROZANSKI, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to rapid fire activators; declaring an emergency.

Creates the crime of unlawful transport, manufacture or transfer of a rapid fire activator.

<u>SB</u> <u>697</u> Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representative MCDONALD, GRAYBER, Senator PROZANSKI, Representative KROPF; Senator MANNING JR,

Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to firearms.

Prohibits a person under 21 years of age from possessing firearms with specified exceptions.

SB 698 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, BROADMAN, Representatives MCDONALD, Senator PROZANSKI, Representatives GRAYBER, KROPF; Senator MANNING JR, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the possession of firearms in certain public areas.

Authorizes the governing bodies of certain public entities that own or control public buildings to adopt a policy, ordinance or regulation limiting the affirmative defense for concealed handgun licensees for the crime of possessing a firearm in a public building.

SB 699 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representative PHAM H; Senators GELSER BLOUIN, SOLLMAN, WEBER, Representatives ELMER, GAMBA, GOMBERG, GRAYBER, HELM, HUDSON, LEVY B, LIVELY, NELSON, RUIZ, WALTERS, WRIGHT (Presession filed.) -- Relating to medical devices; declaring an emergency.

Expands the health insurance coverage of prosthetic and orthotic devices.

SB 700 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representative NERON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to water safety; prescribing an effective date.

Prohibits operating a boat carrying a child under 16 years of age unless the child is wearing a properly sized and secured personal flotation device.

SB 701 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representative NERON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to telehealth services for K-12 students; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Department of Education to establish a pilot project to provide telehealth services in K-12 schools in the 2025-2026 school year.

SB 702 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives PHAM H, MCLAIN, NERON, TRAN; Senators FREDERICK, GELSER BLOUIN, GOLDEN, JAMA, MANNING JR, SOLLMAN, TAYLOR, Representatives BOWMAN, GAMBA, HUDSON, ISADORE, NGUYEN H (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public health; declaring an emergency.

Prohibits distributing, selling, attempting to sell or offering to sell flavored inhalant delivery system products or flavored tobacco products in this state.

SB 703 Sponsored by Senator REYNOLDS, Representatives NERON, RUIZ, SMITH G; Senators FREDERICK, GELSER BLOUIN, MANNING JR, Representatives HUDSON, NGUYEN D, NGUYEN H (Presession filed.) -- Relating to immigration; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Department of Human Services to provide grants to nonprofit service providers to assist individuals who are noncitizens to change their immigration status or obtain lawful permanent resident status.

SB 704 Sponsored by Senator TAYLOR (Presession filed.) -- Relating to worker classification.

Directs those agencies that administer certain state laws to use specific criteria to determine whether an individual is an employee or independent contractor and to cooperate in adopting rules to facilitate consistency in the application of the statutory provisions concerning independent contractors and the provisions of the Act.

<u>SB</u> <u>705</u> Sponsored by Senators TAYLOR, MANNING JR; Senator GORSEK, Representatives HUDSON,

MUNOZ, NOSSE, RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to temporary total disability.

Provides an alternative weekly minimum amount of workers' compensation benefits for temporary total disability.

<u>SB</u> 706 Sponsored by Senators TAYLOR, MANNING JR; Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to wages; declaring an emergency.

Requires the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to study methods for detecting paycheck errors.

SB 707 Sponsored by Senator MEEK; Senator MCLANE, Representatives DIEHL, ELMER, GOMBERG, MANNIX, NGUYEN D, OSBORNE, SCHARF, WRIGHT (Presession filed.) -- Relating to exemption of prescription drug sales; prescribing an effective date.

Expands the exemption for receipts from the sale of prescription drugs from commercial activity subject to the corporate activity tax to include critical access pharmacies.

SB 708 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB, Representative LEWIS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public safety.

Requires the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to study the effect of different types of sentences on rates of recidivism.

SB 709 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN, Representative SMITH G (Presession filed.) -- Relating to a tax credit for apprenticeships; prescribing an effective date

Creates income tax credit for taxpayers that provide apprenticeship opportunities.

<u>SB</u> 710 Sponsored by Senator SOLLMAN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to judicial training.

Requires the Judicial Department to study options for domestic and sexual violence training for judges.

SB 711 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative NERON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to photo radar in highway work zones.

Makes changes to the highway worker photo radar laws.

SB 712 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --Relating to maximum assessed value; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Higher Education Coordinating Commission to establish a pilot program to provide stipends for student teachers and the educators who mentor student teachers for licensure.

Establishes the Parkinson's disease registry.

SB 720 Sponsored by Senators GORSEK, MANNING JR,
Representative RUIZ; Representative ISADORE
(Presession filed.) -- Relating to funding for a
cultural workforce center; declaring an emergency.

Appropriates moneys to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services for distribution to the Portland Opportunities Industrialization Center to construct and operate the Sunrise Campus Cultural Workforce Center.

<u>SB</u> 721 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the suppression of evidence.

Repeals the provision prohibiting a court, except in specified circumstances, from excluding admissible evidence on grounds that the evidence was obtained in violation of a statute.

SB 722 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representatives RUIZ, HARTMAN, Senator CAMPOS; Senators GELSER BLOUIN, PATTERSON, Representatives CHAICHI, CHOTZEN, GAMBA, HUDSON, NATHANSON, NELSON, VALDERRAMA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to residential tenancies.

Prohibits residential landlords from using certain software to set rents or occupancy rates.

SB 723 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative NATHANSON; Senator PHAM K, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to two-person crew member requirements on trains.

Requires that trains have a minimum of two crew members.

SB 724 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Corrections Ombudsman.

Requires the Department of Corrections to study the Corrections Ombudsman.

<u>SB</u> 725 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK; Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to case management services for individuals with developmental disabilities; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Department of Human Services to adopt by rule a minimum staffing ratio of 30 to 1 for service coordinators and personal agents serving individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities.

SB 726 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, TAYLOR, MANNING JR; Senator PATTERSON, Representatives ANDERSEN, FRAGALA, GAMBA, MCDONALD (Presession filed.) -- Relating to landfill emissions monitoring; prescribing an effective date.

Requires the owner or operator of a municipal solid waste landfill to conduct surface emissions monitoring and report data as specified in the Act.

SB 727 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (at the request of Oregon Chiropractic Association) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the definition of "health care provider" for purposes of certain jobprotected leave laws; prescribing an effective date.

Modifies the definition of "health care provider" for purposes of laws concerning job-protected leave.

SB 728 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, HAYDEN; Senators FREDERICK, WEBER, Representatives GAMBA, MANNIX (Presession filed.) -- Relating to abuse of vulnerable persons.

Modifies the definition of "vulnerable person" for purposes of civil action for abuse of a vulnerable person to include individuals under 18 years of age.

SB 729 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Senators PATTERSON, REYNOLDS, Representative NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to mental health services for individuals with disabilities; prescribing an effective date.

Extends to all public bodies the prohibition against denying mental health services to individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities.

<u>SB</u> 730 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to rights of recipients of child welfare services.

Modifies provisions regarding subsidies for adoptive parents and guardians.

SB 731 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Senator PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to public employer policies regarding language pay differentials.

Requires public employer employment policies to provide for a pay differential for sign language skills in the same manner that pay differentials are provided for other bilingual or multilingual skills.

SB 732 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, MEEK; Senators BONHAM, GOLDEN, SOLLMAN, WEBER (Presession filed.) -- Relating to executive appointments.

Directs the Governor to appoint a new head of certain agencies within three months after the Senate fails to confirm the reappointment of the head of the agency.

SB 733 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to dogs harming livestock.

Expands the definition of the term "potentially dangerous dog," for dog control purposes, to include a dog that inflicts serious injury on or kills livestock.

SB 734 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, MANNING JR; Senators FREDERICK, GORSEK, SOLLMAN, Representatives NELSON, RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the use of mechanical restraints on certain young people; declaring an emergency.

Prohibits the use of certain mechanical restraints on youth, adjudicated youth or young persons in detention facilities or youth correction facilities.

SB 735 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the application of abbreviated school day program requirements to students who are enrolled in a public charter school; declaring an emergency.

Provides that abbreviated school day program requirements do not apply to students in public charter schools if certain conditions are met

SB 736 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, MANNING JR, HAYDEN; Senators GORSEK, PATTERSON, REYNOLDS, SOLLMAN, THATCHER, Representative NELSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to investigations of child abuse involving the child's parent.

Creates an exception to abuse of a child in care provisions when the suspected abuse was committed by the parent of the child in care.

SB 737 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Senators JAMA, MEEK, Representative FRAGALA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to middle housing land division; declaring an emergency.

Expands the radius for giving notices of proposed middle housing land division and requires additional content in the notices.

SB 738 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN, Representative RUIZ; Senators PATTERSON, REYNOLDS, Representatives MCINTIRE, SCHARF, SOSA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to waiver of tuition for qualified students.

Changes the age limit and the required period during which certain foster children were in care to be eligible to receive tuition waivers.

SB 739 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, PATTERSON (Presession filed.) -- Relating to long term care oversight.

Modifies the requirements for investigations of a residential care facility following a complaint of a licensing violation.

SB 740 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, WEBER; Senator REYNOLDS (Presession filed.) -- Relating to persons from whom assets were seized by the state when the persons were under 21 years of age; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Department of Human Services to establish and administer the Youth Support and Repayment Grant Program to provide financial support to specified persons from whom, while in the care or custody of the department, resources to which the persons were entitled were seized and used to pay for certain services provided.

SB 741 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN; Senators CAMPOS, WEBER, Representatives RUIZ, SCHARF (Presession filed.) -- Relating to foster parent compensation; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Department of Human Services to adopt a rate structure for foster parent compensation.

SB 742 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to electronic meetings to discuss an abbreviated school day program placement; declaring an emergency.

Allows a student's parent or foster parent to consent to attending an initial meeting regarding an abbreviated school day program placement by telephone or other electronic means.

<u>SB</u> 743 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, MANNING JR, Representative NELSON; Senators

GORSEK, SOLLMAN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to records of interviews in child abuse investigations.

Requires the Department of Human Services or a law enforcement agency to electronically record certain interviews in child abuse investigations.

<u>SB</u> <u>744</u> Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to intestate estates.

Requires the petitioner in an intestate estate to make a reasonable effort to find persons of a higher priority of appointment before the court may appoint a personal representative.

SB 745 Sponsored by Senator GELSER BLOUIN (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the frequency of meetings regarding abbreviated school day programs for students who are terminally ill; declaring an emergency.

Allows the parent or foster parent of a terminally ill student to consent to meeting once every year to review the student's abbreviated school day program.

SB 746 Sponsored by Senators GELSER BLOUIN, BONHAM, GOLDEN; Senator WEBER (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the use of outside counsel by the Department of Justice; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Department of Justice to report annually to the Joint Committee on Ways and Means and the committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the judiciary on the use of outside counsel to defend state agencies in lawsuits.

SB 747 Sponsored by Senator PHAM K; Senators GOLDEN, MANNING JR, PATTERSON, TAYLOR, Representatives GAMBA, NERON, RUIZ, VALDERRAMA (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the application of fertilizer.

Requires persons with ownership interests in at least 200 acres of irrigated land used for agriculture to annually report information about fertilizer application to the State Department of Agriculture.

SB 748 Sponsored by Senator SMITH DB (Presession filed.)
-- Relating to unemployment insurance.

Authorizes the Employment Department to require drug testing for an initial claim for unemployment benefits if the claimant was fired by the claimant's most recent employer for unlawful drug use or suitable work is available for the claimant only in an occupation that regularly conducts drug testing.

SB 749 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK; Representatives NGUYEN H, RUIZ (at the request of Participatory Budgeting Oregon) (Presession filed.) -- Relating to participatory budgeting when preparing a school district budget; declaring an emergency.

Directs the Department of Education to establish and administer a pilot program that provides for participatory budgeting by students in the preparation of a school district budget.

SB 750 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the payment schedule for state employees; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Oregon Department of Administrative Services to establish a pilot project to pay employees of the Department of State Police biweekly.

SB 751 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) -- Relating to retirement of public safety workers; prescribing an effective date.

Directs the Public Employees Retirement Board to establish definitions of "police officer" and "firefighter" for the sole purpose of

determining which police officer and firefighter members of the Public Employees Retirement System are entitled to increased benefits.

752 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --SBRelating to statewide economic development plans.

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to review statewide economic development plans and strategies implemented in the other states and submit a report to the Legislative Assembly that includes recommendations for the creation of a statewide economic development plan for Oregon.

754 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --SBRelating to penalties for failure to comply with certain requirements under the laws governing public employee collective bargaining.

Permits a labor organization to file a civil action against a public employer for failing to timely provide the labor organization with certain information regarding public employees.

755 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --Relating to security in schools.

Requires the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to study possibilities for placing police officers or security guards in schools.

SB 756 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to blood pressure cuffs for medical assistance recipients.

Requires the Oregon Health Authority and coordinated care organizations to reimburse the cost of clinically validated blood pressure cuffs prescribed to medical assistance recipients.

757 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK (Presession filed.) --Relating to the salary of chaplains under the Public **Employees Retirement System.**

Requires the Public Employees Retirement Board to study the treatment of the salary of chaplains under the Public Employees Retirement System.

<u>SB</u> <u>758</u> Sponsored by Senator GORSEK, Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the application of a prevailing rate of wage to offsite custom work for use in public works; prescribing an effective date.

Applies the prevailing rate of wage to certain off-site custom work fabricated, assembled or produced in accordance with specifications for a particular public works.

SB 759 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK; Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the funding of infrastructure projects.

Requires the Oregon Business Development Department to study the use of a loan loss reserve fund to support infrastructure improvement projects by underserved communities in Oregon and submit a report to the legislature by September 15, 2026.

SB760 Sponsored by Senator GORSEK; Representative RUIZ (Presession filed.) -- Relating to fire safety systems in public buildings; prescribing an effective

Requires the owner of a public building to periodically conduct inspections and testing of fire dampers, smoke dampers, combination fire and smoke dampers and smoke control systems in the public building.

SB 761 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the Walla Walla

Appropriates moneys from the General Fund to the Water Resources Department to implement projects that benefit water demands in the Walla Walla basin.

 SB 762 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representatives LEVY
 B, MANNIX (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the repeal of the corporate activity tax; prescribing an effective date.

Repeals the corporate activity tax.

SB 763 Sponsored by Senator NASH (Presession filed.) --Relating to the unlawful disclosure of information about crime victims.

Creates the crime of unlawful disclosure of information about a victim of sexual assault or sex trafficking.

764 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to estate tax treatment of family-owned business; prescribing an effective date.

Allows an exclusion from a taxable estate for the value of the interest in a family-owned business.

Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY
 B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the use of meat.

Allows a person taking certain nuisance game mammals to offer the meat to a charitable organization, retain the meat or make any disposition authorized by rule.

766 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to minimum wage.

Imposes a cap on the percentage increase that the minimum wage rate may be adjusted for inflation.

SB 767 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to instruction on the prevention of sex trafficking of children; declaring an emergency.

Directs each school district board to adopt a prevention curriculum that addresses child sex trafficking.

SB 768 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to agricultural research.

Requires the State of Oregon to contribute a 50 percent match for every donation of \$10,000 or more made to the Oregon State University Foundation for the express purpose of supporting agricultural research with emphasis on cereal grains, to the extent moneys are available.

<u>SB</u> 769 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to county elections concerning methods of taking wildlife; providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

Provides that a county is exempt from the applicability of a statute banning the use of dogs to hunt or pursue cougars if voters approve a county measure proposed by initiative petition or referred to the people by the governing body of the county.

770 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representatives LEVY B, MANNIX (Presession filed.) -- Relating to estate tax; prescribing an effective date.

Provides that the Oregon estate tax is imposed only on the estates of decedents dying on or before January $1,\,2025.$

SB 771 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B; Representative LIVELY (Presession filed.) -- Relating to funding for rodeo repairs. Directs the Oregon Business Development Department to develop and administer a program for awarding grants to rodeo organizations based in communities with a population of 12,000 or less to fund certain capital projects on existing rodeo property.

Sp. 772 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to tribal health.

Establishes the Indian Health Scholarship Program to provide free tuition and fees for qualifying Indian health profession students in exchange for the student's commitment to work at a tribal service site after graduation.

SB 773 Sponsored by Senator NASH (Presession filed.) -- Relating to assaults committed against corrections officers.

Establishes a mandatory minimum sentence of 48 months' imprisonment for assault committed by a correctional facility inmate against a corrections officer.

SB 774 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to the release of booking photos.

Authorizes a law enforcement agency to release a booking photo upon the second or subsequent arrest of the person depicted in the photo within a 12-month period, or when the person depicted in the photo is a missing person.

SB 775 Sponsored by Senator NASH, Representative LEVY B (Presession filed.) -- Relating to ground water data accountability.
