SB 1559 Allows qualifying off-premises sales licensee to obtain endorsement authorizing sale of distilled liquor at licensed premises.

SB 1547 Authorizes county governing bodies and small business employers to enter into agreements for reimbursement of portion of wages paid to youth employees.
