- SB 439 Establishes Outdoor Education Account for purpose of providing outdoor school programs.
SB 553 Imposes limits on instances when student under 12 years of age may be suspended or expelled from school.
SB 554 Directs Department of Education to assist school districts in achieving specified goals related to school discipline.
SB 556 Prohibits use of expulsion to address truancy.

SB 898 Directs Department of Education to award grants to school districts for support service programs, education innovation programs and education intervention programs.

SB 287 Deletes provision that authorizes teachers who are licensed and properly endorsed by Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to practice speech-language pathology without obtaining license from State Board of Examiners for Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology.

SB 619 Prohibits public universities from adopting school policies with respect to noncredit academic activities, or from refusing student application to, or enrollment or participation in, noncredit academic activity, solely on basis that student was not awarded standard high school diploma or General Educational Development (GED) certificate, or because student received modified or extended diploma.
SB 709 Modifies provisions to allow students who are not residents of school district to attend school of school district.
SB 487 Directs school district to forward documentation relating to charges resulting in teacher's termination for failure to meet performance standards or goals to Teacher Standards and Practices Commission for disclosure to potential educational employers.

- HB 2589 Requires State Department of Agriculture to adopt rules prohibiting application of pesticide products containing nitro-group neonicotinoids.
HB 3428 Creates special certification requirements for pesticide applicators and public applicators who spray or otherwise apply pesticides by aircraft.
HB 3123 Prohibits application of pesticide by aircraft except under terms and conditions of pest emergency declaration issued by State Department of Agriculture or State Forestry Department.
HB 3434 Appropriates moneys to State Department of Agriculture for biennium beginning July 1, 2015, to administer performance of Pesticide Analytical and Response Center duties.
HB 3429 Requires governing board of Pesticide Analytical and Response Center to adopt rules establishing standardized operating procedures for state agencies represented on governing board to receive and investigate complaints regarding use of pesticides.
HB 3430 Requires State Department of Agriculture to establish telephone line for persons concerned about misuse or alleged misuse of pesticides.
