- SB 619 CARRIED OVER FROM 3/31/2015 AGENDA: Prohibits public universities from adopting school policies with respect to noncredit academic activities, or from refusing student application to, or enrollment or participation in, noncredit academic activity, solely on basis that student was not awarded standard high school diploma or General Educational Development (GED) certificate, or because student received modified or extended diploma.

SB 667 Removes sunset related to grants distributed to small school districts with one or more small high schools.
SB 932 Extends eligibility for receiving Oregon financial aid scholarships and grants to certain students who qualify for exemption from paying nonresident tuition.
SB 187 Establishes task force to make recommendations regarding protection of privacy of students using education software.

HB 3459 Increases frequency of days for which State Fish and Wildlife Commission may authorize persons to angle for fish or take shellfish without licenses or tags.
