Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- SB 45 Extends sunset for tax credit for qualified equity investment.
SB 52 Extends sunset of corporate tax offset of insurer assessment.
SB 801 Creates credit against income tax for taxpayers that create 10 or more new jobs during tax year.
SB 935 Provides that insurer does not require certificate of authority to transact wet marine and transportation insurance.
SB 713 Prohibits motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor or importer from requiring dealer to advertise, promote, offer or sell extended service contracts, extended maintenance plans, or similar products or services that manufacturer, distributor or importer provides, originates, sponsors or endorses.
SB 714 Prevents motor vehicle manufacturer, distributor or importer from taking certain adverse actions against motor vehicle dealer because dealer sold motor vehicle to customer that exported motor vehicle or resold motor vehicle for export.
SB 488 Requires Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to establish uniform standards for hand dryers installed in public restrooms, including standards that impose limit on decibel level of operating hand dryer.
SB 317 Provides that insurer may not offer or issue policy, contract or certificate of insurance that provides that insurer has sole right or right that is superior to right of insured to interpret terms and conditions of policy, contract or certificate or that specifies standard of interpretation or review that is inconsistent with laws of this state.

- SB 872 Increases amount of maximum total tax credits for certified film production development contributions for fiscal year.
SB 922 Provides that reimbursement to member of legal expense organization for charges that member incurs for legal services does not include nominal fee for operating expenses that legal expense organization incurs or pays to providing attorney.
SB 675 Removes requirement that bidder or proposer for public contract demonstrate responsibility by submitting signed affidavit that attests that bidder or proposer complied with tax laws of this state.

- SJM 1 Expresses support for Federal Aviation Administration initiative to certify safe unleaded aviation fuel.
SB 459 Increases interstate highway speed limit to 70 miles per hour for most vehicles.
SB 136 Provides that franchisee or subfranchisor is not employee of franchisor if franchise is subject to state or federal law, if franchisee or subfranchisor obtains license, registration or other authorization required under federal, state or local law to operate franchise and if franchisee or subfranchisor is business entity formed under laws of, or authorized to do business in, this state or is sole proprietor of business in, and resident of, this state.
SB 580 Allows State Landscape Contractors Board to assess contested case proceeding costs to person requesting that claim filed against board licensee be resolved through contested case proceeding.
SB 515 Requires provision of method for users to offer suggestions on form and content of Oregon transparency website.
SB 943 Prohibits counties and districts from imposing vehicle registration fee on vehicles registered to employment address when registered owner's residence address is not in same county as employment address.

- SB 948 Permits Department of Transportation to issue vehicle registration plates from regular series for use on county-owned vehicle rather than plates from specially designed government series.
SB 237 Clarifies authority of certain designees of Oregon State Athletic Commission in conduct of boxing and mixed martial arts events.
SB 463 Permits persons who have certain physical condition to use window tinting that is darker than otherwise allowed if person shows police officer prescription or letter on letterhead from physician or optometrist.
SB 668 Provides that right and privilege to construct, maintain or operate water, gas, electric or communication service line, fixture or other facility along public roads, free of charge, does not extend to county roads.
SB 879 Exempts attorneys and real estate licensees from requirement to obtain mortgage loan originator's license in order to perform activities of mortgage loan originator.

- SB 860 Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to select University of Oregon or Oregon State University to design and develop career advising and mentorship pilot program.
SB 953 Establishes process by which future interests in specified properties in Klamath County may be extinguished.
SB 954 Requires each school obtaining approval from Higher Education Coordinating Commission to offer academic degree to biennially obtain bond or letter of credit demonstrating school is financially sound and capable of fulfilling commitments to students.
SB 955 Provides that student whose legal residency is not in school district is considered resident of school district if student attended public charter school located in school district for at least four years and completed highest grade offered by public charter school located in school district.
SB 957 Prohibits State Board of Education from establishing certain standards for instructional time unless moneys available for state's system of kindergarten through grade 12 public education meet specified percentage of amount of moneys determined to be sufficient by Quality Education Commission.
SJR 18 Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution directing Legislative Assembly to establish education support fund consisting of revenues from sales tax imposed at rate not to exceed ___ percent.

- SB 186 Authorizes entity that Oregon Health Authority identifies as presenting risk of harm to individuals who have severe allergic response to allergens to acquire epinephrine and necessary paraphernalia for administration.
- SB 301 Specifies which services to be performed by expanded practice dental hygienist must be included in agreement between expanded practice dental hygienist and dentist.
- SB 469 Makes changes to laws governing hospital nursing staff, including laws setting forth composition of hospital nurse staffing committees and laws governing content of written hospital-wide staffing plans.
- SB 608 Creates Palliative Care and Quality of Life Interdisciplinary Advisory Council in Oregon Health Authority.
- SB 905 Adds physician assistant to Oregon Medical Board membership.

- SB 660 Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop program for screening students in this state who are susceptible to tooth decay and providing dental sealants for those students.
- SB 672 Establishes office of oral health within Oregon Health Authority to study and support oral health of citizens of this state.
- SB 692 Removes sunset on ability of Oregon Health Authority to approve dental pilot projects.

- SB 147 Changes communication requirements for pharmacy or pharmacist that substitutes biological product.
- SB 523 Requires insurer to provide specified notifications to health care providers regarding coverage under qualified health plan offered by insurer through health insurance exchange.
- SB 626 Shortens timeframe within which pharmacies must electronically report to Oregon Health Authority information under prescription monitoring program.
- SB 661 Requires health benefit plan that covers opioid analgesic drug products to cover abuse-deterrent opioid analgesic drug products, at no greater cost to insured than other preferred drugs under plan, and specifies other requirements regarding coverage.
- SB 696 Directs Oregon Health Authority to study need for changes in licensure of health care practitioners that treat individuals diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health care on or before September 15, 2015.

- SB 841 Modifies requirements for health plan coverage of prescription drugs dispensed in accordance with synchronization policy.
- SB 874 Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide or contract for provision of training on adrenal insufficiency for certain health care professionals.
- SB 880 Exempts for-profit or nonprofit business entity, if business entity provides only palliative care or operates rural health clinic, from requirement that licensed physicians hold majority of voting stock in professional corporation organized for purpose of practicing medicine or be majority of directors of professional corporation.
- SB 891 Requires health care facilities to publish, in manner prescribed by Oregon Health Authority, price data regarding health care services offered.
- SB 920 Makes legislative findings regarding provision of antibiotics and its relation to public health.
- HB 2546 Defines "inhalant delivery system." Amends laws concerning sale of tobacco products to, and use of tobacco products by, minors so those laws equally apply to inhalant delivery systems.

SB 700 Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Health Authority for Senior Farm Direct Nutrition Program and Women, Infants and Children Farm Direct Nutrition Program.
SB 741 Directs Department of Human Services to adopt administrative rules for home studies and placement reports in adoption proceedings that require that equal consideration be given to relatives and current caretakers as prospective adoptive parents, and that greater consideration be given to relatives and current caretakers as compared to other persons who are not relatives or current caretakers.

- SB 409 Repeals \$500,000 limit on noneconomic damages recoverable in wrongful death actions and other statutorily created causes of action.
- SB 462 Provides that record of mortgage is effective as financing statement if record satisfies requirements for financing statement and sufficiently provides name of debtor.
- SB 601 Expands definition of "personal information" for purposes of Oregon Consumer Identity Theft Protection Act.
- SB 670 Directs Department of Justice to develop training curriculum and provide training to public employees, community providers and others on confidentiality requirements, privacy laws and sharing of information in order to consistently facilitate sharing of information between programs and entities wherever feasible.
