- SB 275 Requires mortgage loan servicers to obtain license or endorsement and requires other persons that engage in business as mortgage loan servicers to obtain endorsement.
SB 271 Increases maximum rate of assessment paid by freight railroads operating in Oregon.
SB 751 Establishes Organ Donor Registry and Public Awareness Fund.
SB 886 Transfers authority over health care facility structure plan review and inspections for fire and life safety from State Fire Marshal to Department of Consumer and Business Services or to municipalities having building inspection programs.
SB 934 Makes limitation on state liability for nonproperty claims applicable to State Fair Council.
SB 596 Requires person employing, contracting with or leasing services of construction flagger to obtain construction flagging contractor license.
SB 878 Changes requirements for operating moped or motorcycle.
SB 495 Eliminates exception to safety belt laws that allows person to not use safety belt if all seating positions in vehicle are occupied.
SB 459 Increases interstate highway speed limit to 70 miles per hour for most vehicles.
SB 948 Permits Department of Transportation to issue vehicle registration plates from regular series for use on county-owned vehicle rather than plates from specially designed government series.

- SB 879 Exempts attorneys and real estate licensees from requirement to obtain mortgage loan originator's license in order to perform activities of mortgage loan originator.
SB 45 Extends sunset for tax credit for qualified equity investment.
SB 52 Extends sunset of corporate tax offset of insurer assessment.
SB 801 Creates credit against income tax for taxpayers that create 10 or more new jobs during tax year.
SB 872 Increases amount of maximum total tax credits for certified film production development contributions for fiscal year.

SB 860 CARRIED OVER FROM 4/17/2015 AGENDA: Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to select University of Oregon or Oregon State University to design and develop career advising and mentorship pilot program.
SB 895 CARRIED OVER FROM 4/17/2015 AGENDA: Requires schools and children's facilities to make available certain information related to immunizations.
SB 957 CARRIED OVER FROM 4/17/2015 AGENDA: Prohibits State Board of Education from establishing certain standards for instructional time unless moneys available for state's system of kindergarten through grade 12 public education meet specified percentage of amount of moneys determined to be sufficient by Quality Education Commission.
SB 80 Clarifies that governing boards of universities with governing board are included in list of entities that must continue to provide and improve upon effective articulation and transfer framework for students in Oregon's post-secondary sectors.
SB 418 Directs State Board of Education to adopt specified standards related to student education records.
SB 560 Establishes timelines by which evaluations must be completed to determine eligibility for special education.
SB 702 Specifies that aggregate total of hours worked by part-time faculty member at more than one public institution of higher education shall be considered in determination of full-time status of faculty member for health care coverage.
SB 819 Modifies percentage of amounts school districts must pay from State School Fund to public charter schools that are not virtual public charter schools.
SB 820 Allows public charter school to give priority to students who are from historically underserved student groups.
SB 950 Appropriates moneys for biennium beginning July 1, 2015, to Higher Education Coordinating Commission for Oregon State University operation of center for manufacturing and design of advanced wood products.

SB 163 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Provides that requirement to sell or offer for sale diesel fuel that contains specified percentage of biodiesel or other renewable fuel does not apply to sale of diesel fuel that is exempt from excise tax in counties east of summit of Cascade Mountains during period from October 1 of each year to February 28 of following year.
SB 164 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Provides that requirement to sell or offer for sale diesel fuel that contains specified percentage of biodiesel or other renewable diesel does not apply to sales in counties east of summit of Cascade Mountains during period from November 1 of any year to February 28 of following year.
SB 206 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Allows temporary lease or temporary transfer of upper Klamath Basin water right established by Water Resources Director in order of determination during period while judicial review of order is pending.
SB 264 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Authorizes Water Resources Director to participate in activities related to joint management entity for carrying out Upper Klamath Basin Comprehensive Agreement.
SB 361 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Requires certain statement by local government to accompany application for operating permit for surface mining.
SB 412 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Defines conditions when rock, gravel, sand, silt and other similar material removed from waters of state are and are not solid waste.
SB 712 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Changes water management and conservation plan approval condition for extension of time to develop permit for municipal use of water.
SB 716 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Authorizes Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties each to designate one large-lot industrial reserve of 150 to 500 acres.
SB 829 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule methodology for Department of Environmental Quality to apply certain water quality standards in assessing waters of state.
SB 830 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 4/16/15 AGENDA: Directs Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule consolidated permitting program for motorized in-stream placer mining and motorized upland placer mining.

- SB 147 Changes communication requirements for pharmacy or pharmacist that substitutes biological product.
- SB 231 Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt rules for participation of prominent carriers in Primary Care Transformation Initiative implemented by Oregon Health Authority.
- SB 469 Makes changes to laws governing hospital nursing staff, including laws setting forth composition of hospital nurse staffing committees and laws governing content of written hospital-wide staffing plans.

- SB 663 Changes governmental framework for conducting public health activities in this state and for providing public health services to residents of this state.
- SB 672 Establishes office of oral health within Oregon Health Authority to study and support oral health of citizens of this state.
- SB 679 Creates Medicaid Management Information System Oversight Committee to monitor progress of improvements to Oregon's mechanized claim processing system for Medicaid claims.
- SB 692 Removes sunset on ability of Oregon Health Authority to approve dental pilot projects.
- SB 696 Directs Oregon Health Authority to study need for changes in licensure of health care practitioners that treat individuals diagnosed with autism spectrum disorders and report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to health care on or before September 15, 2015.

- SB 705 Directs Oregon Health Authority to study and report on demolition of residential structures that have been painted with lead-based paint or insulated with asbestos and risks to public health associated with such demolitions.
- SB 838 Requires Health Evidence Review Commission to develop prioritized list of prescription drugs.
- SB 841 Modifies requirements for health plan coverage of prescription drugs dispensed in accordance with synchronization policy.
- SB 874 Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide or contract for provision of training on adrenal insufficiency for certain health care professionals.
- SB 880 Exempts for-profit or nonprofit business entity, if business entity provides only palliative care or operates rural health clinic, from requirement that licensed physicians hold majority of voting stock in professional corporation organized for purpose of practicing medicine or be majority of directors of professional corporation.
- SB 891 Requires health care facilities to publish, in manner prescribed by Oregon Health Authority, price data regarding health care services offered.
- SB 916 Directs Oregon Medical Board and Oregon State Board of Nursing to adopt rules regarding diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease.
- SB 920 Makes legislative findings regarding provision of antibiotics and its relation to public health.

- SB 601 Expands definition of "personal information" for purposes of Oregon Consumer Identity Theft Protection Act.
- SB 639 Restricts use of motor vehicle registration plate surveillance cameras.
- SB 670 Directs Department of Justice to develop training curriculum and provide training to public employees, community providers and others on confidentiality requirements, privacy laws and sharing of information in order to consistently facilitate sharing of information between programs and entities wherever feasible.
- SB 694 Allows operators of motorcycles and mopeds to pass vehicles in same lane during traffic jams or slowdowns.
