HB 2847 Requires ASPIRE programs to annually provide financial aid instruction to high school students, including different types of loans available to students attending post-secondary institutions of education, potential use of individual development accounts and economic impact of each type of loan.
HB 2973 Establishes Affordable Baccalaureate Degree Act.

- HB 2195 Directs county with population of less than 650,000, and permits county with population of 650,000 or more, to use proceeds acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens or in exchange for land originally acquired by foreclosure of delinquent tax liens to provide to youth and families with children housing placement and retention support services, rental assistance and low income housing.
- HB 2889 Requires Department of Human Services, child-caring agency and foster home to ensure child receiving care or services from department, agency or home for at least six consecutive months is entitled to establish savings account in child's name for child's sole use and benefit upon child reaching 12 years of age.
- HB 2890 Requires Department of Human Services to ensure that substitute care providers for child or ward in care or custody of department provide opportunities to participate in at least one extracurricular activity and apply reasonable and prudent parent standard in determining participation.
- HB 3016 Modifies provisions of capital gains exemption for amounts received for sale of manufactured dwelling park.

- HB 2232 Directs Department of Human Services to appoint advisory committee to advise department regarding policies and procedures to coordinate statewide planning for delivery of services to runaway and homeless youth and their families.
- HB 2694 Allows regulated social worker employed by Department of Human Services to report suspected animal abuse or neglect involving animal or person social worker comes into contact with while acting as employee of department.

- HB 3257 Extends sunset on collection of certain moneys from electric companies or Oregon Community Power for purposes related to low-income electric bill payment assistance.
