- HB 2469 Establishes requirements for certain insurers to conduct own risk and solvency assessment and to file report of assessment with Department of Consumer and Business Services.
HB 3212 Makes law or rule solely for purpose of regulating previously allowed farming practice land use regulation for purposes of certain land use laws.
HB 3318 Establishes Oregon State Lottery Responsible Gambling Code of Practice.
HB 3062 Exempts prepaid transportation cards from Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act and related statutes.
HB 2281 For purposes of per-mile road usage charge, makes issuance by Department of Transportation of emblem of exemption from motor vehicle fuel taxes permissive, removes exception to requirement that seller collect use fuel taxes on motor vehicle paying per-mile road usage charge and removes requirement that Department of Transportation round metered use of subject vehicle up to next whole mile.
HB 2465 Modifies requirements related to school enrollment that person under 18 years of age must meet before being issued driving privileges.

- HB 2282 Allows Department of Transportation to accept documents received electronically related to titling, registration, odometer disclosure and other activities.
HB 2375 Requires state contracting agency to use solicitation template that Attorney General and Oregon Department of Administrative Services develop, approve and make available in advertising and soliciting procurements under Public Contracting Code and to use contract form or contract template, as appropriate, that Attorney General and department develop, approve and make available as basis for public contracts into which state contracting agency enters.
HB 2594 Requires insurer of liable party to pay actual costs of emergency response by private emergency responders.
HB 2938 Prohibits city from requiring consent to annexation of landowner's property in exchange for city providing county service as agent of county.
HB 2559 Prohibits inclusion, in instrument conveying or contracting to convey real property or in declaration or bylaws of planned community or condominium, of provisions prohibiting installation and use of solar panels for obtaining solar access.

- HB 3188 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Authorizes landowners who meet certain criteria to petition for formation of predator damage control district within county.
- HB 3315 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to recoup costs incurred in providing services to executive department agencies for advancing administration of fee-funded programs.
- HB 2453 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Requires organizer to obtain permit from State Forestry Department prior to conducting large commercial event on state forestlands.
- HB 2474 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Prohibits veterinary facility from offering services related to practice of veterinary medicine, surgery or dentistry unless veterinary facility registers with Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board.
- HB 2475 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Authorizes Oregon State Veterinary Medical Examining Board to impose \$100 fine on individual regulated by board who commits administrative or clerical violation that does not create risk of harm to public.
- HB 2910 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Repeals obsolete laws relating to agricultural experiment stations.
- HB 3068 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Directs Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study and develop recommendations for legislation to reduce woodstove smoke.
- HB 3217 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Requires Department of State Lands to adopt pilot program for providing general authorization for voluntary stream restoration and beaver recovery through construction of artificial beaver dams.

- HB 3382 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Extends sunset from January 2, 2019, to July 1, 2019, for law imposing general prohibition on growing of canola in Willamette Valley Protected District.

- HB 2723 Authorizes county or city to designate any urbanized area of county or city as urban agriculture incentive zone.

- HB 3347 Modifies definition of "person with mental illness" as used in civil commitment statutes.
