- HB 2832 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/2015 AGENDA: Directs governing entity of public or private post-secondary institution of education that contracts with third party financial firm for student financial aid services to consider federal policies for contracting.

Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2469 Establishes requirements for certain insurers to conduct own risk and solvency assessment and to file report of assessment with Department of Consumer and Business Services.
HB 3318 Establishes Oregon State Lottery Responsible Gambling Code of Practice.
HB 3062 Exempts prepaid transportation cards from Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act and related statutes.
HB 2281 For purposes of per-mile road usage charge, makes issuance by Department of Transportation of emblem of exemption from motor vehicle fuel taxes permissive, removes exception to requirement that seller collect use fuel taxes on motor vehicle paying per-mile road usage charge and removes requirement that Department of Transportation round metered use of subject vehicle up to next whole mile.
HB 2465 Modifies requirements related to school enrollment that person under 18 years of age must meet before being issued driving privileges.
HB 2941 Authorizes electric company to offer residential electricity consumer rate option for electricity associated with specific energy resource.
HB 3414 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/2015 AGENDA: Requires certain persons to not drive in far left lane unless passing.

- HB 2567 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/2015 AGENDA: Allows direct purchase and sale of bulk distilled liquor between distillery licensees for blending and manufacturing purposes.
HB 3056 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/2015 AGENDA: Specifies that crematorium may not be certified by State Mortuary and Cemetery Board if board determines that proposed crematorium presents danger to public health and safety as determined in consideration of standards for training and equipment used in practice of cremation that are based on national industry standards.
HB 3317 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/2015 AGENDA: Directs Oregon State Lottery Commission, in coordination with Oregon Liquor Control Commission, to submit report biennially on distribution and concentration of video lottery game terminals in relation to measures of socioeconomic status represented at census tract level of neighborhoods or communities in which premises of video lottery retailers are located.

- HB 3315 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Requires State Department of Fish and Wildlife to recoup costs incurred in providing services to executive department agencies for advancing administration of fee-funded programs.

- HB 2910 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Repeals obsolete laws relating to agricultural experiment stations.
- HB 3068 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Directs Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study and develop recommendations for legislation to reduce woodstove smoke.
- HB 3217 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Requires Department of State Lands to adopt pilot program for providing general authorization for voluntary stream restoration and beaver recovery through construction of artificial beaver dams.
- HB 3382 CARRIED OVER FROM 5/27/15 AGENDA: Extends sunset from January 2, 2019, to July 1, 2019, for law imposing general prohibition on growing of canola in Willamette Valley Protected District.

HB 3025 Establishes unlawful employment practice of inquiring into or considering applicant's conviction history on application form or prior to interview or, if no interview is conducted, prior to conditional offer of employment.

HB 2544 Requires issue subject to collective bargaining during term of collective bargaining agreement that is not resolved through negotiation or mediation to be resolved through binding arbitration.

HB 3058 Permits certain Public Employee Retirement System members who are retired to be employed by school district or education service district as teachers of career and technical education without loss of retirement benefits.

HB 3303 Permits Certification Office for Business Inclusion and Diversity to certify business that service-disabled veteran owns as disadvantaged business enterprise that is eligible for certain preferences in public contracting.
