Public Hearing and Possible Work Session

- HB 2282 Allows Department of Transportation to accept documents received electronically related to titling, registration, odometer disclosure and other activities.
HB 2375 Requires state contracting agency to use solicitation template that Attorney General and Oregon Department of Administrative Services develop, approve and make available in advertising and soliciting procurements under Public Contracting Code and to use contract form or contract template, as appropriate, that Attorney General and department develop, approve and make available as basis for public contracts into which state contracting agency enters.
HB 2594 Requires insurer of liable party to pay actual costs of emergency response by private emergency responders.
HB 2938 Prohibits city from requiring consent to annexation of landowner's property in exchange for city providing county service as agent of county.
HB 2559 Prohibits inclusion, in instrument conveying or contracting to convey real property or in declaration or bylaws of planned community or condominium, of provisions prohibiting installation and use of solar panels for obtaining solar access.
HB 3212 Makes law or rule solely for purpose of regulating previously allowed farming practice land use regulation for purposes of certain land use laws.
HB 3062 CARRIED OVER FROM 06/01/2015 AGENDA: Exempts prepaid transportation cards from Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act and related statutes.

- HB 2281 CARRIED OVER FROM 06/01/2015 AGENDA: For purposes of per-mile road usage charge, makes issuance by Department of Transportation of emblem of exemption from motor vehicle fuel taxes permissive, removes exception to requirement that seller collect use fuel taxes on motor vehicle paying per-mile road usage charge and removes requirement that Department of Transportation round metered use of subject vehicle up to next whole mile.
HB 2941 CARRIED OVER FROM 06/01/2015 AGENDA: Authorizes electric company to offer residential electricity consumer rate option for electricity associated with specific energy resource.

- HB 3206 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 6/1/2015 AGENDA: Permits any person convicted of aggravated murder or felony with relevant DNA evidence to file motion for DNA testing.
- HB 3365 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 6/1/2015 AGENDA: Modifies crime of displaying obscene materials to minors.
- HB 3399 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 6/1/2015 AGENDA: Requires justice court or municipal court to record criminal proceedings.
- HB 3452 CARRIED OVER FROM THE 6/1/2015 AGENDA: Provides that contract to allow use of property or facilities by nonprofit organization providing services to youths or by educational provider may not require individual participant to indemnify property owner for damages not caused by individual participant.
- HB 3468 Adds threatening to cause physical injury to animal to induce other person to engage in conduct as manner of committing crime of coercion.
