- SB 1547 Clarifies that term "public utility" does not include people's utility district or electric cooperative for purpose of being regulated by Public Utility Commission.
SB 1588 Allows rural county with no population growth, and other local governments in county, to adopt comprehensive land use plan without complying with statewide land use planning goals.

- SB 1542 Allows district school board to enter into written agreement with governing body of federally recognized Native American tribe to identify acceptable use of name, symbol or image of mascot that represents or is associated with Native American tribe, to identify behavior expectations at athletic events and to identify required training on cultural diversity.
SJR 203 Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution establishing State Board of Education.

- SB 1546 Prohibits tower from towing motor vehicle from parking facility without first being contacted by owner of facility or owner's agent.

- HB 4075 Replaces School Safety Hotline established by Department of Justice with statewide tip line established by Department of State Police for anonymous reporting of information concerning threats to student safety.
- HB 4093 Authorizes board of commissioners of county that has legislative authorization to receive certain funds for construction or capital improvements to courthouse to impose surcharge on certain civil court fees.
- HB 4123 Directs State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to establish by rule community service exchange program for person to enter into agreement with community-based organization to perform community service in lieu of payment for delinquent fines or debts.
- HB 4142 Prohibits person performing private security services to wear uniform or badge or utilize vehicle that would cause reasonable person to believe that private security professional is affiliated with public or private safety agency.
