SENATE BILLS

SB 1558 Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with pre-session filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President. (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Business and Transportation) – Relating to self-insurance coverage for workers' compensation claims; declaring an emergency.

Authorizes Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services to pay compensation due to workers of members of certain decertified self-insured employer groups and to set standards by rule for proof of financial viability of self-insured employer and for insurance coverage retention and combined net worth of members of self-insured employer group.

(at the request of Governor John A. Kitzhaber, M.D.) – Relating to management service employees.
