HOUSE BILLS

HB2533 By Representative WITT – Relating to criminal history record check exemption for concealed handgun licensees.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts certain transferors of firearms from requesting criminal history record check if purchaser or recipient has concealed handgun license.

HB2797 By Representative DOHERTY – Relating to payment of temporary disability compensation in workers' compensation claim.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires subject employer to pay first installment of temporary disability compensation in workers' compensation claim within 14 days after employer has notice or knowledge of claim or has notice or knowledge of employee's disability, whichever is later.

HB2798 By Representative DOHERTY – Relating to fees that a state licensed pawnbroker may charge a pledgor.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies percentage rate and amount of fees that pawnbroker may charge for storage and setup in connection with pledge loans.

HB2799 By Representative NATHANSON (at the request of Richard Bonse) – Relating to orders setting aside convictions.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows person convicted of certain felonies constituting delivery of controlled substance to apply for order setting aside conviction.

HB2800 By Representative BARTON – Relating to governance of county service district.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows city to assume duties and functions of county service district, directly or by transfer of duties and functions to successor entity, when majority of district residents are residents of city.

HB2801 By Representative GOMBERG – Relating to early reading programs; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to distribute moneys as strategic investment under Oregon Early Reading Program to nonprofit organizations that provide academically-aligned, evidence-based literacy programs through volunteer mentors who are 50 years of age or older to school districts for purpose of increasing delivery of reading assistance to students in kindergarten through third grade.

HB2802 By Representatives BARKER, GILLIAM; Representatives ESQUIVEL, NEARMAN, PARRISH – Relating to children who are not taught in a public school; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes certain testing requirements that apply to children who are taught by private teacher, parent or legal guardian.

HB2803 By Representative HOYLE – Relating to beverage containers.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Liquor Control Commission to include certain information in orders approving beverage container redemption centers.

HB2804 By Representative WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARKER, BARNHART, NOSSE, Senators DEMBROW, FERRIOLI, MONNES ANDERSON, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon AFSCME) – Relating to nurses employed by Department of Corrections.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Limits hours nurses employed in Department of Corrections institutions may work.

HB2805 By Representative WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARKER, BARNHART, KRIEGER, NOSSE, OLSON, Senators DEMBROW, FERRIOLI, MONNES ANDERSON, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon AFSCME) – Relating to employees of the Department of Corrections.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Includes base pay of corrections employees of certain cities as comparable factor to be considered by arbitrator in establishing base pay for employees of Department of Corrections.

HB2806 By Representative WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARKER, BARNHART, KRIEGER, NOSSE, Senators DEMBROW, FERRIOLI, MONNES ANDERSON, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon AFSCME) – Relating to corrections officers; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that Department of Public Safety Standards and Training may not deny, suspend or revoke certification of corrections officer because corrections officer seeks help with mental health issues, substance abuse or other counseling needs.

HB2807 By Representative WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARKER, KRIEGER, Senators FERRIOLI, SHIELDS, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon AFSCME) – Relating to members of the Public Employees Retirement System employed to teach in correctional institutions; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that full-time faculty member employed by community college to teach incarcerated persons within secure perimeter of correctional institution qualifies as police officer under Public Employees Retirement System.

HB2808 By Representatives PARRISH, BUEHLER – Relating to the commercial use of Western Juniper; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Business Development Department, in cooperation with Oregon State University Extension Service, to develop program to increase harvesting of Western Juniper and manufacture and distribution of products made from Western Juniper.

HB2809 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to cardiopulmonary resuscitation requirements for

school employees working with elementary school children; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires certain persons employed by school district or public charter school to have valid certification in cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

HB 2810 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to vehicle registration plates; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts certain electric vehicles from requirement to have two registration plates.

HB 2811 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to public charter schools.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows public charter school to change sponsorship if charter is terminated.

HB 2812 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to school attendance by nonresident students; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes sunset on provisions that allow students whose legal residence is not within school district to attend school in district as resident if student receives written consent.

HB 2813 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to sponsorship of public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes sunset on authority of institution of higher education to sponsor public charter school.

HB 2814 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to discipline of coaches.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires school district policy on harassment, intimidation, bullying and cyberbullying to provide that notice will be given to Teacher Standards and Practices Commission if person found to have committed act of harassment, intimidation, bullying or cyberbullying is coach who is licensed or registered by commission.

HB 2815 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to funding for talented and gifted children; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides funding for instruction of talented and gifted children based on amount per student.

HB 2816 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to underperforming schools.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows parents to submit petition to school district board to transform school that is in bottom 20 percent of schools of state.

HB 2817 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to graduation requirements; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows student to choose to satisfy one or more high school diploma credits by successful completion of one online course.

HB 2818 By Representative BOONE – Relating to charitable checkoffs; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Adds Oregon Volunteer Firefighters Association to list of entities eligible for individual income tax return checkoff contribution.

HB 2819 By Representative KOMP – Relating to documents issued by the Department of Transportation.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires persons 75 years of age or older to renew driver licenses every four years and to take driving test or submit certificate from medical professional.

HB 2820 By Representative WHISNANT, Senator EDWARDS; Representatives BARKER, HUFFMAN, LIVELY, OLSON, Senator HANSELL – Relating to authority to proceed at a stop light.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits motorcycle driver to proceed at stop light under certain conditions.

HB 2821 By Representative BUCKLEY – Relating to marijuana; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands definition of "debilitating medical condition" for purposes of Oregon Medical Marijuana Act.

HB 2822 By Representative DAVIS – Relating to capital improvements income tax credit; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income tax credit for capital improvements to business facilities or homes that are commenced prior to October 1, 2015, or effective date of Act, whichever is later.

HB 2823 By Representative DAVIS – Relating to STEM loans.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon's Best and Brightest STEM Loan Forgiveness Program for certain students in science, technology, engineering or mathematics programs that are willing to commit to working in Oregon after graduation.

HB 2824 By Representatives BARTON, GOMBERG; Senator HASS – Relating to landlord-tenant law.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits landlord from requiring applicant or tenant to declaw or devocalize animal otherwise allowed on premises or to advertise in manner that discourages application from potential applicant with otherwise allowed animal that has not been declawed or devocalized.

HB 2825 By Representative KENY-GUYER, Senator STEINER HAYWARD; Representatives BOONE, FREDERICK, OLSON, WILLIAMSON, Senator GELSER – Relating to services for individuals with mental illness; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to seek out and apply for funding for, and appropriates moneys from General Fund to pay for, crisis intervention services and residential care for individuals with mental illness.

HB 2826 By Representative FREDERICK – Relating to interfering with public transportation.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes entering or remaining unlawfully in public transit vehicle or public transit station as manner of committing crime of interfering with public transportation.

HB2827 By Representative DAVIS – Relating to transportation.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Transportation to study addition of express lanes to certain highways in this state.

HB2828 By Representative SMITH WARNER, Senator DEMBROW; Representatives KENY-GUYER, KOMP, NOSSE, WILLIAMSON, Senators BATES, EDWARDS, GELSER, MONNES ANDERSON, ROSENBAUM, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to a study on financing health care in this state.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends, for two years, sunset of provisions requiring Oregon Health Authority to study and make recommendations to Legislative Assembly on best option for financing health care in this state.

HB2829 By Representative HELM – Relating to private parks in exclusive farm use zones.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies provisions authorizing private parks in exclusive farm use zones.

HB2830 By Representative HELM – Relating to remand of local land use decision.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies time period for local government to take action on application for permit, limited land use decision or zone change after remand based on final order of Land Use Board of Appeals.

HB2831 By Representative HELM – Relating to use of property line adjustments in resource zones.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies authority to use property line adjustments in resource zones.

HB2832 By Representative NATHANSON; Representatives BARNHART, GOMBERG, GREENLICK, LININGER, LIVELY, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, WITT, Senator GELSER – Relating to contracts for student financial aid services.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires public university or community college that contracts with financial institution, organization or other institution for student financial aid services to make contract publicly available.

HB2833 By Representative WITT, Senator GIROD; Representatives BARKER, BOONE, DOHERTY, ESQUIVEL, EVANS, GILLIAM, GORSEK, HOYLE, JOHNSON, KRIEGER, LIVELY, REARDON, WHISNANT, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, DEMBROW, FERRIOLI, HASS, KNOPP, ROBLAN – Relating to green energy technology for public buildings; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Adds woody biomass to types of green energy technology for which contracting agency must set aside 1.5 percent of contract price to include in public building.

HB2834 By Representative WILSON; Representatives NEARMAN, POST, STARK, Senator KNOPP – Relating to treatment of human fetuses.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires human fetuses in infectious waste stream to be incinerated, cremated or buried.

HB2835 By Representative WILSON; Representative NEARMAN, Senator KNOPP – Relating to common core state standards; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits Department of Education from requiring school districts to align instruction or assessments with common core state standards and from penalizing school districts for failure to align instruction or assessments with common core state standards.

HB2836 By Representative DOHERTY – Relating to credit for periods of disability under the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides hours of service credit for vesting purposes and retirement credit to member of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan who receives workers' compensation disability payments and later returns to employment with participating public employer.

HB2837 By Representative GOMBERG – Relating to certificates of exemption issued by the Director of Transportation.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Director of Transportation to issue certificate of exemption from requirement to use child safety system, safety belt or safety harness if statement is submitted by nurse practitioner or physician assistant on behalf of person requesting exemption.

HB2838 By Representative EVANS; Representatives BARKER, CLEM, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, HELM, HUFFMAN, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NOSSE, RAYFIELD, WITT – Relating to incarcerated veterans.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Incarcerated Veterans Outreach Program in Department of Veterans' Affairs to conduct outreach and provide assistance to incarcerated veterans and spouses and dependents of incarcerated veterans.

HB2839 By Representative EVANS; Representatives BARKER, CLEM, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, HELM, HUFFMAN, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NOSSE, RAYFIELD, WITT – Relating to tax credits for employment of qualified military veterans; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows credit against income taxes for employment of qualified military veterans.

HB2840 By Representative EVANS; Representatives BARKER, CLEM, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, HELM, HUFFMAN, LIVELY, MCLAIN, NOSSE, RAYFIELD, WITT – Relating to loans to certain veterans enrolled in higher education.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Educational and Workforce Development Bridge Loan Program in Department of Veterans' Affairs to conduct outreach and provide loans to veterans and disabled veterans who are enrolled in approved course of study, approved professional training or approved workforce development program in connection with institution of higher education, and who are eligible to receive federal educational aid or other financial assistance that is temporarily unavailable.

HB2841 By Representative EVANS, Senator STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to vehicle headlight use.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires use of headlights when windshield wipers are on or there is fog.

HB2842 By Representative EVANS – Relating to a tax credit for political contributions; prescribing an effective date.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases maximum allowable amount of political contribution income tax credit.

HB2843 By Representatives SMITH WARNER, FAGAN, Senators OLSEN, ROBLAN; Representatives HUFFMAN, JOHNSON – Relating to interagency agreements for performing duties related to construction; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes Department of Consumer and Business Services to enter into interagency agreements for Construction Contractors Board to perform duties on behalf of department related to state building code.

HB2844 By Representatives OLSON, BARKER, Senators WINTERS, MONNES ANDERSON; Representatives GILLIAM, HUFFMAN, KENY-GUYER, LININGER, Senator BURDICK (at the request of Saving Grace, Domestic Violence Resource Center, Safe Harbors, Bridges2 Safety DVIP, NAYA Family Center's Healing Circle, Bradley Angle, Choices DVIP, Oregon Sexual Assault Task Force, Abuse Recovery Ministry & Services, Raphael House of Portland, Salvation Army West Women's and Children's Center, Clackamas Women's Services, Liberty House, KIDS Center, Russian Oregon Social Services Central City Concern-Eastside Concern, Allies in Change, YWCA of Greater Portland, Impact NW, Modus Vivendi, LLC, Oregon District Attorneys Association, Oregon Association of Chiefs of Police, Oregon State Sheriffs' Association, Portland Police Bureau -Domestic Violence Reduction Unit, Multnomah County Department of Community Justice) – Relating to crime.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases penalty for crime of strangulation when committed knowing victim was pregnant.

HB2845 By Representative CLEM – Relating to guaranteed asset protection waivers.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes conditions under which person may sell guaranteed asset protection waiver in connection with sale or lease of motor vehicle.

HB2846 By Representative DOHERTY – Relating to instructional time; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that time spent by students consuming breakfast is considered instructional time in certain circumstances.

HB2847 By Representative JOHNSON; Representative DOHERTY – Relating to financial aid instruction.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires ASPIRE programs to annually provide financial aid instruction to high school students and their families, including different types of loans available to students attending post-secondary institutions of education and economic impact of each type of loan.

HB2848 By Representatives JOHNSON, DOHERTY – Relating to school calendars; declaring an emergency.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires that school calendars allow for makeup of instructional days during same instructional period in which days were lost due to weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances.

HCR 14 By Representative KENY-GUYER, Senator WINTERS – Designating March 26, 2015, as Purple Day to raise awareness of epilepsy.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Designates March 26, 2015, as Purple Day to raise awareness of epilepsy.

HOUSE JOINT MEMORIALS

HJM 7 By Representative KENNEMER (at the request of Clackamas County Commissioner Tootie Smith) – Urging President and Congress to transfer federal lands within Oregon to State of Oregon.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Urges President and Congress to transfer federal lands within Oregon to State of Oregon.

HJM 8 By Representative KOMP – Requesting amendment to federal law regarding student testing.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requests President, Congress and United States Secretary of Education to amend federal law to replace annual computer-based multiple choice tests with limited essay-based assessments.

HJM 9 By Representative PARRISH – Urging Congress to recognize presumption of service connection for all Vietnam War veterans exposed to Agent Orange.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Urges Congress to recognize presumption of service connection for Blue Water Vietnam War veterans exposed to Agent Orange.

HJM 10 By Representatives WHISNANT, GOMBERG – Urging federal government to strengthen economic relationship with government of India by encouraging free market principles.

2-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Urges federal government to strengthen economic relationship with government of India by encouraging free market principles and enforcement of intellectual property rights.
