HOUSE BILLS

HB2849 By Representative SMITH – Relating to services provided to needy families; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Self-Sufficiency Program Effectiveness.

HB2850 By Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to the effectiveness of notices of lapse for certain insurance policies; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that notice of insurance policy's lapse is not effective unless insurer sends written notice to policy owner at least 25 days before date of lapse and includes explanation of reasons for lapse.

HB2851 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to public borrowing.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires public body to obtain voter approval before incurring indebtedness for which public body pledges full faith and credit and taxing power to secure repayment.

HB2852 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to state finance; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Fiscal Officer to prepare fiscal impact statement on legislative measures reported out of committee that would have financial effect on small businesses in state.

HB2853 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to a required number of instructional days; prescribing an effective date.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies minimum number of instructional days that class schedule adopted by district school board must provide.

HB2854 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to offenses committed in a motor vehicle when a person under 18 years of age is in the motor vehicle; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies offense of smoking in motor vehicle to clarify that offense applies to smoking marijuana and use of electronic cigarette to vaporize cannabinoid solutions.

HB2855 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to write-in nominations; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends period of time, from 8 days to 15 days, that individual nominated or elected to public office by write-in votes has to accept nomination or office.

HB2856 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to vacant positions in state agencies.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires state agency to report to Director of Oregon Department of Administrative Services when any budgeted position is vacant for six months.

HB2857 By Representative WILLIAMSON – Relating to provisions required in insurance policies; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that insurer may not offer or issue policy, contract or certificate of insurance that provides that insurer has sole right or right that is superior to right of insured to interpret terms and conditions of policy, contract or certificate or that specifies standard of interpretation or review that is inconsistent with laws of this state.

HB2858 By Representative WILLIAMSON (at the request of Portland Public Schools) – Relating to approved school transportation costs; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Includes transit pass costs as approved transportation costs for purpose of State School Fund distributions.

HB2859 By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION, INNOVATION, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Relating to tax implications for benefit companies; prescribing an effective date.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Reduces rate of corporate tax imposed on benefit companies.

HB2860 By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION, INNOVATION, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Relating to workforce development; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study workforce development in Oregon and to make recommendations for legislation to improve workforce development in this state.

HB2861 By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION, INNOVATION, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Relating to workforce development; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study workforce development in Oregon and to make recommendations for legislation to improve workforce development in this state.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to evaluate methods to improve effectiveness of public education at university level.

HB2874 By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION, INNOVATION, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Relating to higher education; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to evaluate methods to improve effectiveness of public education at university level.

HB2875 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to pharmacy benefit managers; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to conduct study on effectiveness of laws establishing processes and procedures for pharmacy benefit managers.

HB2876 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to the practice of surgical technology; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits health care facility from allowing person without certain qualifications to practice surgical technology.

HB2877 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to coordinated care organizations; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to contract with private entity to evaluate progress of coordinated care organizations in achieving goals of Legislative Assembly.

HB2878 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to health insurance; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to investigate barriers to health insurance coverage.

HB2879 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to health care; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study financing and delivery of health care in this state and make recommendations regarding legislative changes to ensure that residents of this state have access to high-quality health care.

HB2880 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to radiography; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that physician assistant may not practice fluoroscopy on person unless physician assistant holds certificate issued by Board of Medical Imaging authorizing such practice.

HB2881 By Representatives REARDON, PARRISH – Relating to inventory of land owned by the Department of State Lands.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of State Lands, for purpose of identifying land that could be planned and zoned for residential use, to inventory department land, determine whether land is essential, useful or excessive in relation to plans of department, and report results to Legislative Assembly.

HB2882 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to strategic investment; prescribing an effective date.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Revenue to transfer 10 percent of total annual amount of personal income tax revenue attributable to eligible projects located in counties for which cumulative amount exceeds \$5 million to Local Economic Opportunity Fund.

HB2883 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to the High Cost Disabilities Account; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases amount Department of Education transfers from State School Fund to High Cost Disabilities Account.

HB2884 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to data centers; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Data Centers.

HB2885 By Representatives LININGER, HELM; Representatives BUCKLEY, OLSON – Relating to marijuana.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that Oregon Liquor Control Commission may delay issuing licenses to applicants for processing marijuana products that are intended to be consumed as food or as potable liquid until July 1, 2016.

HB2886 By COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – Relating to vehicle dealer exemptions.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Clarifies who may participate in vehicle dealer auction or display of vehicles without holding vehicle dealer certificate.

HB2887 By COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (at the request of Travel Information Council) – Relating to the Travel Information Council; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Decreases membership of Travel Information Council.

HB2888 By Representative WITT – Relating to proceedings against nuisance properties.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows action to enjoin or restrain nuisance if place is used for certain activities involving animals.

HB2889 By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND HOUSING – Relating to savings accounts for foster children.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services, child-caring agency and foster home to ensure child receiving care or services from department, agency or home establishes savings account in child's name for child's sole use and benefit upon child reaching 12 years of age.

HB2890 By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND HOUSING – Relating to extracurricular activities for foster children.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services, child-caring agency and foster home to ensure provision of minimum of one extracurricular activity, where available at school or in community, to child receiving care or services from department, agency or home.

HB2891 By Representative BARKER – Relating to restrictions on retail sales prices for prescription contact lenses.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits person that manufactures or distributes prescription contact lenses from preventing retailer from advertising or selling prescription contact lenses at price for consumers that is less than price that person sets or specifies.

HB2892 By Representatives ESQUIVEL, EVANS, WHISNANT, WITT; Representatives BARRETO, BOONE, HACK, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, KRIEGER, LIVELY, NEARMAN, OLSON, PARRISH, PILUSO, POST, STARK, WILSON – Relating to displaying the National League of Families' POW/MIA flag on public buildings.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires that National League of Families' POW/MIA flag be displayed with Oregon State flag on public buildings in this state.

HB2893 By Representatives DAVIS, READ, KENY-GUYER – Relating to savings promotion raffles; declaring an emergency.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits financial institution to conduct savings promotion raffle, subject to specified conditions.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

HJR 20 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Proposing revision of Oregon Constitution relating to property taxation; and requiring approval by a two-thirds majority.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Proposes revision of Oregon Constitution to authorize imposition of local option ad valorem property taxes outside certain constitutional limitations and to require enactment of property tax relief program to freeze assessed value of homesteads of certain seniors and individuals with disabilities at assessed value on date claim is filed.

HJR 21 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the property tax rates of counties.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution that provides that rate of ad valorem property taxes imposed by county for any property tax year may not be less than \$2.00 per thousand dollars of assessed

value and excepts \$2.00 per thousand dollars minimum from compression under Ballot Measure 5 (1990).

HJR 22 By Representative PARRISH – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to the Oregon State Lottery.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to include providing services to veterans among public purposes for which net proceeds of Oregon State Lottery may be spent.

HJR 23 By Representative NOSSE – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to local option ad valorem property taxes imposed by school districts.

2-4(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to authorize school districts to impose local option taxes at rate not to exceed \$2 per \$1,000 of assessed value and not subject to compression under Ballot Measure 5 (1990) if approved by voters.
