HOUSE BILLS

HB 2894 By COMMITTEE ON RURAL COMMUNITIES, LAND USE, AND WATER (at the request of Oregon Water Resources Congress) – Relating to review of land divisions by districts.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes district to approve or veto land division within or adjacent to boundaries of district based on whether land division interferes with operations of district.

HB 2895 By COMMITTEE ON RURAL COMMUNITIES, LAND USE, AND WATER (at the request of Special Districts Association of Oregon) – Relating to urban service agreements; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires local governments and districts to enter into urban service agreements not later than January 2, 2017.

HB 2896 By COMMITTEE ON RURAL COMMUNITIES, LAND USE, AND WATER -- Relating to transportation of persons by for-hire carriers.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Deregulates oversight of for-hire carriers of persons.

HB 2897 By Representative EVANS; Representatives BOONE, ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, PARRISH, PILUSO -- Relating to refinancing options for veterans.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Veterans' Affairs to develop program under which department, pursuant to contracts with credit unions, provides loan guarantees or credit guarantees for qualified veterans for purpose of refinancing existing purchase-money mortgages or similar mortgages of homes used primarily as principal residence by veterans.

HB 2898 By Representative EVANS -- Relating to incentives for film production or media production; prescribing an effective date.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases amount of reimbursement from Oregon Production Investment Fund that is available to local filmmaker or media production services company.

HB 2899 By Representative EVANS; Representatives BOONE, ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, PARRISH, PILUSO -- Relating to veterans' benefits.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allocates lottery moneys to further economic development by assisting veterans to apply for federal and state veterans' benefits and aid.

HB 2900 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to bail.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes commercial bail system.

HB 2901 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY (at the request of Law Enforcement Responsible Technology Work Group) -- Relating to privacy.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies definitions of "pen registers" and "trap and trace devices."

Authorizes law enforcement agency to install pen register or trap and trace device without warrant or court order in certain circumstances.

HB 2902 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to juvenile sex offenders.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates automatic reporting of person found to have committed act that would constitute felony sex crime if committed by adult.

HB 2903 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to the exemption from disclosure of public records that identify persons involved in research using animals at Oregon Health and Science University.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates sunset date on conditional exemption from disclosure of public records that set forth name, home address or professional location of person engaged in, or providing goods and services for, medical research at Oregon Health and Science University that is conducted using animals other than rodents.

HB 2904 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to detention of youth before adjudication on the merits.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands circumstances under which court may order youth held or placed in detention.

HB 2905 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to dispositional orders for custody of youth offenders.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires court to specify date in dispositional order for youth offender before which youth offender may not be released from legal custody of Oregon Youth Authority or Department of Human Services.

HB 2906 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to scientifically based research.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies definition of "scientifically based research" with respect to evidence-based programs.

HB 2907 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to youth recidivism.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes definition of "recidivism" for purposes of tracking and compiling data regarding recidivism of youth and youth offenders.

HB 2908 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY -- Relating to implementation of the Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2014; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Brings Oregon law into compliance with federal Preventing Sex Trafficking and Strengthening Families Act of 2014.

HB2909 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to unlawful trade practices; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits person from sending to consumer check, draft, payment instrument or other negotiable instrument that is with, part of or related to solicitation for or offer of credit or loan, unless the consumer previously requested or consented to receive check, draft, payment instrument or other negotiable instrument.

HB2910 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to agricultural experiment stations; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Repeals obsolete laws relating to agricultural experiment stations.

HB2911 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to courts; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Deletes obsolete references to terms of court and constables.

HB2912 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to transportation; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Deletes obsolete and outdated provisions in transportation and motor vehicle laws.

HB2913 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to human services; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Deletes outdated and obsolete provisions and updates references in laws relating to human services programs or services.

HB2914 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to analyses required before conducting a procurement for services; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits employee of contracting agency that conducts cost analysis or determines feasibility of procurement, or exclusive representative of employee's bargaining unit, to seek judicial review of cost analysis or determination.

HB2915 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to a tax credit for gun safes; prescribing an effective date.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes credit against personal income taxes for purchase of qualifying gun safes.

HB2916 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to certifications of disadvantaged business enterprises; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs public contracting agency to suspend right of certified disadvantaged minority, women or emerging small business enterprise to bid on or participate in public contract if certified disadvantaged minority, women or emerging small business enterprise fails to perform commercially useful function in public contract.

HB2917 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to paycheck discounting; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to study impacts of paycheck discounting and report to Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2015.

HB2918 By Representative OLSON; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, SPRENGER - - Relating to use of nicotine by minors.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Defines "vapor products." Amends laws related to use of tobacco products by minors to include use of vapor products by minors, including crime of endangering welfare of minor and other criminal offenses and civil penalties related to use or acquisition of tobacco products by minor.

HB2919 By Representatives OLSON, BARKER -- Relating to emergency access to call location information of cellular device.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates reporting requirement related to disclosure, at request of law enforcement agency, of call location information of cellular device used to call 9-1-1 or believed to be in possession of individual who is believed to be in emergency situation.

HB2920 By Representatives BOONE, OLSON -- Relating to fire company warning lights.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits use of blue lights on private vehicles authorized to use fire company warning lights.

HB2921 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR -- Relating to expenditures from the Wage Security Fund.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes Commissioner of Bureau of Labor and Industries to expend certain moneys in Wage Security Fund to administer and enforce provisions of wage and hour and minimum wage law.

HB2922 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR -- Relating to employment practices; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study employment practices in Oregon and to make recommendations for legislation regarding employment practices in this state.

HB2923 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR -- Relating to employee compensation; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study employee compensation in Oregon and to make recommendations for legislation regarding employee compensation in this state.

HB2924 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR -- Relating to business regulation; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Business Regulation and prescribes membership of task force.

HB2925 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR -- Relating to wages that a qualified nonprofit agency

for individuals with disabilities must pay to certain employees; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities from paying less than state minimum wage to employees who are individuals with disabilities if employees perform services at facility or site other than facility or site that qualified nonprofit agency for individuals with disabilities owns or leases.

HB2926 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to capital projects eligible for tax benefits.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that developer or owner of capital project eligible for tax benefit must provide proof of certain information regarding project contractors, first-tier subcontractors and responsible managing individuals for contractors and first-tier subcontractors in order to receive tax benefit.

HB2927 By Representatives MCLAIN, KOMP, Senator GELSER; Representatives EVANS, HELM, KENY-GUYER, NOSSE, TAYLOR, Senator SHIELDS – Relating to the High Cost Disabilities Account; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases amount transferred from State School Fund to High Cost Disabilities Account each fiscal year.

HB2928 By Representatives MCLAIN, DOHERTY, PILUSO; Representatives EVANS, HELM, KENY-GUYER, KOMP, NOSSE, TAYLOR, Senators GELSER, SHIELDS – Relating to task force on class sizes; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Class Sizes to determine appropriate class sizes of students, identify methods to reduce class sizes and determine cost for methods to reduce class sizes.

HB2929 By COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION, INNOVATION, AND WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT – Relating to incentives for increasing apprentice utilization on public improvements for state contracting agencies; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires state contracting agency that awards public improvement contract with contract price of more than \$5 million to require contractor to employ apprentices to perform 10 percent of work hours on public improvement that workers in apprenticeable occupations perform.

HB2930 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, KENNEMER; Representatives FREDERICK, GREENLICK, LIVELY, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER, WEIDNER, Senators SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to nurse practitioners.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires hospital to adopt rules granting admitting privileges to licensed, certified nurse midwife nurse practitioner.

HB2931 By Representative KENY-GUYER, Senator DEMBROW – Relating to testing radon levels; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to disseminate to school districts information related to elevated levels of radon.

HB2932 By Representatives ESQUIVEL, OLSON – Relating to Department of State Police funding; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes State Police Patrol Fund, separate and distinct from General Fund.

HB2933 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to civil penalties imposed by the Oregon Medical Board; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes Oregon Medical Board to impose civil penalties on persons not licensed by board.

HB2934 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE – Relating to access to health care; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to submit blueprint for basic health plan to Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services by December 31, 2015.

HB2935 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Capitol Dental Care) – Relating to dental care organizations; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires governing body of coordinated care organization to include representative from at least one dental care organization that contracts with coordinated care organization.

HB2936 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of The Grants Pass Sobering Center) – Relating to substance abuse treatment; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Defines "sobering facility." Extends civil and criminal immunity to sobering facilities for actions taken in good faith, on probable cause and without malice.

HB2937 By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE (at the request of Joseph Lowe) – Relating to medical assistance coverage of medical equipment; prescribing an effective date.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Defines "medical equipment" and specifies criteria for coverage of medical equipment in state medical assistance program.

HB2938 By Representative CLEM – Relating to annexation; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits city from requiring consent to annexation of landowner's property in exchange for city providing county service as agent of county.

HB2939 By Representative DOHERTY; Representatives BARKER, BUCKLEY, FREDERICK, KOMP, MCLAIN, PARRISH, WHISNANT, Senators DEMBROW, DEVLIN, HASS, MONROE, THATCHER (at the request of Oregon Substitute Teachers Association) – Relating to substitute teachers; declaring an emergency.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prescribes salary calculation for substitute teachers in school district that has class schedule based on four-day week.

HB2940 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to information regarding businesses that are allowed property tax exemptions; prescribing an effective date.

2-6(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires certain information regarding businesses that are allowed property tax exemptions to be submitted to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for posting on Oregon transparency website and to Oregon Business Development Department for reporting during odd-year regular sessions to House and Senate committees related to revenue.
