## HOUSE BILLS

**HB2977** By Representatives WHISNANT, BENTZ, WITT, ESQUIVEL – Relating to civics proficiency; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires school districts and public charter schools to implement statewide assessment system in civics and require students to demonstrate level of proficiency required by naturalization test required for United States citizenship.

**HB2978** By Representatives BARKER, GORSEK, PILUSO; Representatives BARTON, DOHERTY, EVANS, FAGAN, HOLVEY, NOSSE, Senators DEMBROW, GELSER, ROSENBAUM – Relating to the employment classification of police officers.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Excludes certain police officers from meaning of supervisory employee for purposes of public employment.

**HB2979** By Representatives KENY-GUYER, GORSEK, Senator MONROE; Representative PILUSO – Relating to transit services for secondary school students; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Funds free, or reduced-fare, transit passes for students attending public secondary schools and increased transit service in vicinity of public secondary schools.

**HB2980** By Representative BENTZ; Representatives BARKER, KRIEGER, OLSON, Senator FERRIOLI (at the request of Oregon District Attorneys Association) – Relating to district attorney diversion.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes defendant to request district attorney to approve extension of stay of criminal proceedings for district attorney diversion.

**HB2981** By Representative BENTZ; Representatives GALLEGOS, HUFFMAN, LIVELY, REARDON, WHISNANT, WILSON, Senators BOQUIST, FERRIOLI (at the request of Genevieve Woydziak) - Relating to Fallen Hero roadside memorial signs; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to erect and maintain Fallen Hero roadside memorial sign for Specialist Mabry James Anders.

**HB2982** By Representative KOMP, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to proficiency-based education funding; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for purpose of funding proficiency-based teaching and learning demonstration sites.

**HB2983** By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, GILLIAM, HEARD, KRIEGER, POST, SMITH, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senators BOQUIST, FERRIOLI – Relating to restrictions on economic activities to protect fish habitat.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits passage of laws restricting economic activities to protect fish habitat that do not apply equivalent restrictions on all economic activities having negative effects on fish habitat.

**HB2984** By Representatives PARRISH, BUEHLER, WITT; Representatives BARKER, BARTON, BOONE, BUCKLEY, DAVIS, DOHERTY, ESQUIVEL, EVANS, FAGAN, GALLEGOS, GOMBERG, GORSEK, HACK, HELM, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KENNEMER, KENY-GUYER, KRIEGER, LIVELY, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, NOSSE, OLSON, READ, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, TAYLOR, WEIDNER, WHITSETT, WILLIAMSON, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, DEVLIN, EDWARDS, GIROD, HANSELL, HASS, JOHNSON, KNOPP, MONROE, OLSEN, RILEY, ROBLAN, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WINTERS – Relating to forestry product cooperatives; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Clackamas County to develop pilot program for forestry products grown on nonforest land in county to be commercially produced and marketed through forestry product cooperative.

**HB2985** By Representatives PARRISH, BUEHLER, WITT; Representatives BARKER, BARRETO, BARTON, BOONE, BUCKLEY, DAVIS, DOHERTY, ESQUIVEL, EVANS, FAGAN, GALLEGOS, GOMBERG, GORSEK, HACK, HELM, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KENNEMER, KRIEGER, LIVELY, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, NOSSE, OLSON, READ, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, TAYLOR, WEIDNER, WHITSETT, WILLIAMSON, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, DEVLIN, EDWARDS, GIROD, HANSELL, HASS, JOHNSON, KNOPP, MONROE, OLSEN, RILEY, ROBLAN, STEINER HAYWARD, THATCHER, THOMSEN, WINTERS – Relating to forestry product cooperatives.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes counties to establish programs for forestry products grown on nonforest lands in counties to be commercially produced and marketed through forestry product cooperatives.

**HB2986** By Representatives SPRENGER, WILSON – Relating to sex-selective abortions; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits performance of late-term sex-selective abortion.

**HB2987** By Representative HOLVEY – Relating to compliance with green energy technology mandates for public buildings; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes requirement for contracting agency to hold in account or otherwise reserve moneys for including green energy technology in constructing, reconstructing or performing major renovation on public building if contracting agency determines that including green energy technology is not appropriate.

**HB2988** By Representative HOLVEY – Relating to qualifying renewable fuel subsidies.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands Oregon's Heat Smart Program to provide wood pellet subsidies.

**HB2989** By Representative VEGA PEDERSON, Senators JOHNSON, KRUSE; Representatives CLEM, EVANS, HUFFMAN, OLSON, POST, WEIDNER, Senators FERRIOLI, GIROD, THATCHER, WHITSETT – Relating to motorcycles.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits person 18 years of age or older to operate motorcycle without wearing approved motorcycle helmet if person has motor vehicle liability insurance that provides personal injury protection benefits.

**HB2990** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to periods of applicability of corporate tax credits; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Limits number of tax years for which corporate excise and income tax credits may be claimed, including periods of carryforward.

**HB2991** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to a tax credit for fire insurance premiums.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends sunset for tax credit for fire insurance premiums.

**HB2992** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to construction taxes imposed by school districts; prescribing an effective date.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes exemption from construction taxes imposed by school districts for private school improvements and private hospital improvements.

**HB2993** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to the valuation of new property located in a city; prescribing an effective date.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes city to adopt ordinance or resolution providing that average maximum assessed value and average real market value of new property or new improvements to property located in city shall be determined using property of same property class located in city rather than in county.

**HB2994** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to the exemption of FCC licenses from property taxation; prescribing an effective date.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Repeals exemption of Federal Communications Commission licenses from property taxation.

**HB2995** By Representative DOHERTY; Representatives FAGAN, FREDERICK, HELM, HUFFMAN, KOMP, MCLAIN, OLSON, TAYLOR – Relating to insurance coverage for motor vehicles used in connection with transportation network companies.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires transportation network company to maintain insurance policy to cover private passenger motor vehicle when vehicle's registered owner or designated operator actively participates as driver with transportation network company.

**HB2996** By Representatives HOLVEY, DAVIS, HELM, BARKER, Senator RILEY; Representatives BOONE, EVANS, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, PARRISH, READ, REARDON, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, BOQUIST, HANSELL, PROZANSKI, ROBLAN, SHIELDS (at the request of Technology Association of Oregon) – Relating to the Oregon Center of Cyber-Excellence; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Center of Cyber-Excellence.

**HB2997** By Representatives READ, HOYLE, PARRISH, SMITH, Senators HANSELL, ROBLAN; Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, BUCKLEY, CLEM, DAVIS, FREDERICK, GOMBERG, GORSEK, HACK, HELM, HOLVEY, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KENNEMER, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, NEARMAN, OLSON, POST, REARDON, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILSON, WITT, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, DEMBROW, EDWARDS, FERRIOLI, GIROD, KNOPP, KRUSE, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Business Development Department to support cooperative effort to assist western juniper harvesting and related manufacturing businesses and promote liaison efforts regarding concerns and interests of western juniper harvesting and related manufacturing businesses and wildlife management concerns and interests.

**HB2998** By Representatives READ, HOYLE, PARRISH, SMITH, Senators HANSELL, ROBLAN; Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, BUEHLER, CLEM, DAVIS, FREDERICK, GOMBERG, GORSEK, HACK, HELM, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, NEARMAN, OLSON, POST, REARDON, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILSON, WITT, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, DEMBROW, EDWARDS, FERRIOLI, GIROD, KNOPP, KRUSE, THOMSEN, WHITSETT, WINTERS – Relating to western juniper; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Business Development Department to establish programs for providing economic development assistance to persons engaged in business of western juniper harvesting or of manufacturing products from western juniper, for providing technical business assistance to western juniper harvesting and related manufacturing businesses, for providing or funding workforce training assistance for potential western juniper harvesting and related manufacturing business workers and for mapping and i

**HB2999** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to the Oregon Tort Claims Act.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts claims based on conduct that constitutes child abuse, or conduct that constitutes knowingly allowing, permitting or encouraging child abuse, from notice requirement of Oregon Tort Claims Act.

**HB3000** By Representatives SPRENGER, MCLAIN; Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HOYLE, JOHNSON, KENNEMER, MCKEOWN, SMITH – Relating to cougars; providing for criminal sentence reduction that requires approval by a two-thirds majority.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Department of Fish and Wildlife to create pilot program that allows persons hunting or pursuing cougars to use dogs.

**HB3001** By Representative ESQUIVEL – Relating to the valuation of destroyed property; prescribing an effective date.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows application for determination of real market value and assessed value of property destroyed or damaged between January 1 and July 1 to be filed on or before December 31.

**HB 3002** By Representative ESQUIVEL -- Relating to voluntary sterilization.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to provide medical assistance for cost of voluntary sterilization for woman whose parental rights are terminated and who is unable to afford cost of procedure.

**HB 3003** By Representative ESQUIVEL -- Relating to remedial action costs of the state.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that state may not require certain persons to pay certain remedial action costs.

**HB 3004** By Representative ESQUIVEL -- Relating to sage grouse hunting.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates five-year moratorium on sage grouse hunting.

**HB 3005** By Representative WILSON; Representatives BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, KENNEMER, NEARMAN, POST, SPRENGER, STARK, WHISNANT -- Relating to persons volunteering outside of the United States.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends expiration date of driver license for persons volunteering outside of United States.

**HB 3006** By Representative BENTZ (at the request of Charlotte Fugate) -- Relating to criminal street gangs.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires imposition of sentencing enhancement of 36 to 60 months upon conviction of gang-related felony.

**HB 3007** By Representative BENTZ -- Relating to sage grouse habitat mitigation.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires governing board of State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to adopt by rule expedited consolidated application process time limits for proposed mining operations that make certain reports and receive certain approval from State Department of Fish and Wildlife related to sage grouse habitat mitigation.

**HB 3008** By Representative BENTZ -- Relating to attorney fees; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides for award of attorney fees to prevailing state agency in civil action in which party asserts claim relating to environment against state agency.

**HB 3009** By Representative BENTZ -- Relating to human services; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Department of Administrative Services to commission study and report by qualified private entity to investigate possible existence of codependent relationship between Department of Human Services and clients of Department of Human Services.

**HB 3010** By Representative BENTZ -- Relating to career training education; declaring an emergency.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Education for purpose of awarding grants under Career and Technical Education Revitalization Grant Program.

**HB 3011** By Representative BENTZ; Senators BOQUIST, FERRIOLI (at the request of David Dickerson) -- Relating to the operation of devices for dispensing Class 1 flammable liquids.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows dispensary for Class 1 flammable liquids located in low-population area to permit self-dispensing of liquids when no owner, operator or employee of dispensary is present.

**HB 3012** By Representatives KRIEGER, WITT, Senator ROBLAN; Representatives BENTZ, BOONE, ESQUIVEL, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, HEARD, MCKEOWN, MCLANE, PARRISH, POST, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senator KRUSE -- Relating to fish hatchery funding.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon Hatchery Research Center Fund.

**HB 3013** By Representatives KRIEGER, HOYLE, PARRISH, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, ROBLAN; Representatives BOONE, ESQUIVEL, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, HEARD, MCKEOWN, MCLANE, POST, SMITH, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WITT, Senator KRUSE -- Relating to wildlife food plots.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows establishment of wildlife food plots on small tract forestland subject to reforestation requirements without affecting small tract forestland assessment.

**HB 3014** By Representatives KRIEGER, WILLIAMSON, Senator KRUSE; Representatives BARTON, BENTZ, BOONE, ESQUIVEL, GOMBERG, HAYDEN, HEARD, MCKEOWN, MCLANE, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST, SMITH, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senator BAERTSCHIGER JR -- Relating to grandparent rights.

2-13(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Changes definition of "grandparent" in laws pertaining to notice to grandparents of juvenile dependency hearings regarding grandchildren, and that authorize grandparents to request visitation or other contact or communication with grandchildren when grandchildren are in legal custody of Department of Human Services.
