HOUSE BILLS

HB 3015 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KOMP – Relating to names after entering into certain legal relationships; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Adds options for name after marriage or after entering into registered domestic partnership.

HB 3016 By Representatives NATHANSON, KENNEMER; Representatives GILLIAM, GOMBERG – Relating to manufactured structures; prescribing an effective date.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies provisions of capital gains exemption for amounts received for sale of manufactured dwelling park.

HB 3017 By Representatives WHISNANT, PILUSO, STARK; Representative KENY-GUYER – Relating to mental health courts.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Criminal Justice Commission to conduct study on mental health courts and present report on findings to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to judiciary on or before September 15, 2016.

HB 3018 By Representative MCKEOWN, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to health care.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits insurer from imposing cost sharing or similar requirements for services provided by out-of-network providers that are greater than requirements for services provided by in-network providers.

HB 3019 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to connection to federal tax law; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to prepare and submit annual report to committee of Legislative Assembly on revenue impact of connection of Oregon statutes to federal tax law.

HB 3020 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to timber taxes.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Legislative Revenue Officer to study changes necessary to make timber tax revenue in Oregon equivalent to timber tax revenue in neighboring states.

HB 3021 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, BUEHLER, Senator BATES; Representatives EVANS, HOLVEY, LIVELY, OLSON, WEIDNER, Senators KNOPP, KRUSE, MONNES ANDERSON, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to payment of insurance claims.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires insurer or third party administrator to reimburse health care provider for fees charged to provider by credit card company that processes payments.

HB 3022 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to misdemeanor sentencing.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Reduces maximum term of imprisonment for Class A misdemeanor crime from one year to 364 days.

HB 3023 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, SMITH WARNER, Senators STEINER HAYWARD, GELSER; Representatives BUEHLER, GALLEGOS, HAYDEN, NOSSE, PARRISH, PILUSO, SPRENGER, VEGA PEDERSON – Relating to referrals to dental specialists; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires that referrals to dental specialists, of medical assistance recipients who are pregnant, occur within 60 days.

HB 3024 By Representatives NATHANSON, BUEHLER, Senator STEINER HAYWARD; Representative HUFFMAN, Senator FERRIOLI – Relating to incentives for recruiting medical professionals to underserved locations; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Medical Professional Recruitment and Retention.

HB 3025 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR (at the request of Oregon AFL-CIO and the Urban League of Portland) – Relating to use of information related to certain criminal matters; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes unlawful employment practice related to misuse of information about criminal charges and convictions of applicant for employment.

HB 3026 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to counseling services for injured workers; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study need for and processes for providing counseling services for injured workers and to make recommendations for legislation regarding counseling services for injured workers.

HB 3100 By Representatives GREENLICK, WHISNANT, Senator MONNES ANDERSON; Representatives BUEHLER, HAYDEN, KENNEMER, KENY-GUYER, LIVELY, NATHANSON, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER, WEIDNER, Senators BATES, HANSELL, KNOPP, KRUSE, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD – Relating to public health; declaring an emergency.

2-16(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Changes governmental framework for conducting public health activities in this state and for providing public health services to residents of this state.
