## HOUSE BILLS

**HB 2021** By Representatives HAYDEN, KENY-GUYER; Representatives BUEHLER, HACK, PILUSO, TAYLOR, Senator GIROD -- Relating to oral health; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop and implement pilot program through which authority and Department of Education provide services related to oral health education, use of fluoride varnish and daily brushing and flossing for children.

**HB 2022** By Representatives KENY-GUYER, FREDERICK, Senator GELSER; Representatives GALLEGOS, GREENLICK, NOSSE, PILUSO -- Relating to case management services to assist individuals discharged from facilities in transitioning to outpatient mental health treatment.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires hospital or provider of residential treatment that discharges individual with mental illness to provide case management services to assist individual in transitioning to outpatient mental health treatment.

**HB 2023** By Representatives KENY-GUYER, FREDERICK, GALLEGOS; Representatives BUEHLER, GREENLICK, NOSSE, OLSON -- Relating to protocols for a health care facility's discharge of a patient who presented with a behavioral health crisis.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies requirements for hospital protocol for discharge planning involving patient who is hospitalized for behavioral health crisis.

**HB 2024** By Representatives KENY-GUYER, GALLEGOS; Representatives NOSSE, PILUSO, VEGA PEDERSON, Senator STEINER HAYWARD -- Relating to basic preventive dental services; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority, in consultation with Traditional Health Workers Commission and Oregon Board of Dentistry, to certify certain health workers to provide early childhood basic preventive dental services.

**HB 2025** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE -- Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants diversion agreements.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows persons authorized to engage in medical use of marijuana to continue to use medical marijuana while participating in driving while under influence of intoxicants diversion agreement.

**HB 2026** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE -- Relating to biological products; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits pharmacist to substitute interchangeable biosimilar products for certain prescribed biological products.

**HB 2027** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE -- Relating to quality measures for oral health care provided by coordinated care organizations.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires metrics and scoring committee of Oregon Health Authority to adopt at least two outcome and quality measures for oral health care provided by coordinated care organizations.

**HB 2028** By COMMITTEE ON HEALTH CARE -- Relating to pharmacy services; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits pharmacists to engage in practice of clinical pharmacy and provide patient care services to patients.

**HB 2029** By Representative PILUSO, Senator MONNES ANDERSON; Representatives DOHERTY, KENY-GUYER, MCKEOWN, MCLAIN, Senator SHIELDS -- Relating to income limits for temporary assistance for needy families; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services to prescribe income limits for temporary assistance to needy families program that are equal to 66 percent of federal poverty guidelines.

**HB 2030** By Representative PILUSO (at the request of Kathy Ruthruff) -- Relating to refund value of beverage containers; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases refund value of beverage containers to 10 cents.

**HB 3027** By Representative JOHNSON; Representatives GORSEK, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, LININGER, Senator THOMSEN -- Relating to the Mt. Hood registration plate program; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to establish Mt.

**HB 3028** By Representative JOHNSON -- Relating to broadband access in rural areas; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Broadband Advisory Council, in consultation with local businesses in rural areas of state, to prepare report regarding broadband technology and access in rural areas of state.

**HB 3029** By Representative PARRISH; Representative EVANS -- Relating to a tax subtraction for military survivor benefits; prescribing an effective date.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates subtraction from federal taxable income for benefits paid to surviving spouse or dependent child of service member.

**HB 3031** By Representative FAGAN -- Relating to requirements for calls from automatic dialing and announcing devices.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires caller that uses automatic dialing and announcing device in prerecorded or synthesized voice message that device plays to subscriber to accurately and truthfully identify caller and to provide telephone number or other contact information that subscriber may use to notify caller that subscriber does not want to receive calls from caller.

**HB3032** By Representative NEARMAN; Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, MCLANE, WHISNANT (at the request of Stephen Mannenbach) – Relating to administration of small estates.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases limit on fair market value of estate that may be administered as small estate.

**HB3033** By Representative NEARMAN; Representative OLSON (at the request of Stephen Mannenbach) – Relating to small estates.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes affiants and claiming successors to execute instruments or documents of conveyance of real or personal property that is part of small estate under particular circumstances.

**HB3034** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to the property of nonprofit corporations that provide health services; prescribing an effective date.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides exemption for property of nonprofit corporation that provides health services occupied or used to provide health services to acutely ill patients or accident victims.

**HB3035** By Representatives HACK, WILLIAMSON; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, GORSEK, HEARD, KRIEGER, MCKEOWN, MCLANE, NEARMAN, PILUSO, POST, SMITH, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senator WINTERS – Relating to flashing lights in school zones; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows increased use of flashing lights in certain school zones.

**HB3036** By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision hearings.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision to request appearance by representative of office of prosecuting attorney at hearing setting or resetting release date of person.

**HB3037** By COMMITTEE ON RULES – Relating to public records; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies public records law exemption from required disclosure of certain personal information of public employees and public body volunteers to remove mandated disclosure upon showing that public interest would require disclosure in particular instance.

**HB3038** By Representatives HACK, WHISNANT; Representatives ESQUIVEL, GILLIAM, HEARD, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, POST, SMITH, WEIDNER – Relating to estate tax exclusion; prescribing an effective date.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts estates below current federal estate tax exclusion amount from imposition of Oregon estate tax and Oregon estate tax filing requirement.

**HB3039** By Representative FREDERICK, Senator SHIELDS – Relating to district school board powers for real property; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows district school board to enter into partnership for purpose of acquiring, leasing or improving real property for educational purposes.

**HB3040** By Representatives HUFFMAN, TAYLOR – Relating to admissibility of hearsay statements; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that certain hearsay statements related to certain sex crimes are not inadmissible in evidence even though declarant is available as witness.

**HB3041** By Representatives GREENLICK, BUEHLER, KENY-GUYER, JOHNSON, Senators MONNES ANDERSON, STEINER HAYWARD; Representatives BUCKLEY, KENNEMER, KOMP, LIVELY, NOSSE, REARDON, Senators BURDICK, GELSER, ROBLAN – Relating to sun protection for students; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs school districts to allow students to use sun-protective clothing and sunscreen.

**HB3042** By Representative BOONE, Senator JOHNSON (at the request of Hailey Rollins) – Relating to a day to celebrate the arts.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Designates April 14 of each year as Honorary Artists of Oregon Day.

**HB3043** By Representative PARRISH – Relating to the Governor of the State of Oregon; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that upon being sworn into office, or for other stated reasons, Governor shall file declaration with Oregon Government Ethics Commission declaring identity of First Spouse and identifying official policy-making or agenda-setting duties of First Spouse, if any.

**HB3044** By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to use of real property by public charter schools.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires public charter school to obtain written permission from district school board of other school district if public charter school uses real property in other school district for school or for facility to provide instruction.

**HB3045** By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to funding for public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes requirement that school district transfer moneys to other school district for student who attends public charter school in school district and is resident of other school district.

**HB3046** By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to application process for public charter schools.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows State Board of Education to grant waiver related to public charter school application process if school district board meets specified criteria.

**HB3047** By Representative WILLIAMSON, Senator BURDICK (at the request of Portland Japanese Garden) – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for expansion of Portland Japanese Garden.

**HB3048** By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE -- Relating to disaster resiliency; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires two percent of gross proceeds of certain bonds to be set aside to fund disaster resiliency projects.

**HB3049** By Representative GORSEK; Representatives EVANS, GALLEGOS, HELM, LININGER, LIVELY, NOSSE, PILUSO, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, WHISNANT, Senator DEMBROW -- Relating to staffing ratios at public universities; declaring an emergency.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to develop plan for public universities to have ratio of at least 7 to 1 of public employees to supervisory employees.

**HB3050** By Representative LIVELY, Senator PROZANSKI -- Relating to boards of directors of regional air quality control authorities.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies requirements for composition of boards of directors of regional air quality control authorities.

**HCR 16** By COMMITTEE ON RULES (at the request of Richard Lake) -- Recognizing and honoring the Una Tribe of Mixed-Bloods.

2-18(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Recognizes and honors Una Tribe of Mixed-Bloods for service to Native Americans of mixed blood throughout United States of America and State of Oregon.

**SB 324** By Senators BEYER, GELSER, DEMBROW, EDWARDS; Senators BATES, BURDICK, MONNES ANDERSON, PROZANSKI, RILEY, ROBLAN, ROSENBAUM, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD (Pre-session filed.) -- Relating to reducing greenhouse gas emissions from transportation fuels; declaring an emergency.

1-12(S) Introduction and first reading. Referred to President's desk.

1-20 Referred to Environment and Natural Resources.

2-2 Public Hearing held.

2-4 Public Hearing and Work Session held.

2-11 Recommendation: Do pass with amendments. (Printed A-Eng)(not concurring Olsen, Thomsen.)

Minority Recommendation: Do pass with different amendments. (Printed A-Eng. Minority)

2-12 Second reading.

2-17 Motion to substitute Minority Report for Committee Report failed.
