HOUSE BILLS

HB 3030 By Representatives GOMBERG, MCKEOWN, Senator ROBLAN (at the request of Lincoln County Board of Commissioners) – Relating to a principal Act for sand control districts; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes creation of sand control districts for purpose of controlling drifting sand.

HB 3051 By Representative POST, Senator THATCHER – Relating to firearms.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides persons licensed to carry concealed handgun in another state with protections provided to persons with Oregon concealed handgun license.

HB 3052 By Representative FREDERICK; Representative CLEM – Relating to requirements to use biodegradable lubricants for operations related to public improvements; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires contract for public improvement to provide that contractor use biodegradable lubricant in contractor's operations related to public improvement and that contractor have similar requirement in contractor's subcontracts.

HB 3053 By Representative CLEM – Relating to taxation of products containing nicotine; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority; providing that this Act shall be referred to the people for their approval or rejection.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases rate of taxation on cigarettes and tobacco products.

HB 3054 By Representative CLEM – Relating to supervising physicians.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands definition of "supervising physician" to include persons licensed to practice osteopathy or podiatry in this state for purpose of supervising physician assistants.

HB 3055 By Representative HACK – Relating to depreciable business assets; prescribing an effective date.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Revenue Officer to report to Legislative Assembly on taxpayer use of deduction allowed for expensing of depreciable business assets and to make recommendations for improving benefit to state.

HB 3056 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to crematoriums.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that crematorium may not be certified by State Mortuary and Cemetery Board if board determines that proposed crematorium presents danger to public health and safety of children of this state.

HB 3057 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS – Relating to persons that engage in the business of purchasing certain debt for collection; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Includes person that engages in business of purchasing delinquent or charged-off debt for collection purposes in definitions of "debt collector," "collection agency" and "out-of-state collection agency" for purposes of collections laws.

HB 3058 By Representative KOMP – Relating to pensions; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits Public Employee Retirement System member who is retired to be employed by school district or education service district as teacher of career and technical education without loss of retirement benefits.

HB 3059 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR (at the request of National Association of Social Workers, Oregon Chapter) – Relating to persons that perform live entertainment.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries to establish toll-free telephone hotline to receive inquiries related to employment status of persons who perform live entertainment.

HB 3060 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR (at the request of National Association of Social Workers, Oregon Chapter) – Relating to live entertainment facilities.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires live entertainment facility to obtain license from Department of Consumer and Business Services.

HB 3061 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to preferences in public contracting for contractors that have family-friendly employment practices; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Family-Friendly Public Contracting and prescribes membership for task force.

HB 3062 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to prepaid transportation cards.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts prepaid transportation cards from Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act and related statutes.

HB 3063 By Representatives GALLEGOS, HUFFMAN, READ; Representatives BARNHART, BOONE, EVANS, FAGAN, FREDERICK, GILLIAM, GOMBERG, HELM, HOLVEY, KENY-GUYER, LININGER, MCLAIN, MCLANE, NOSSE, OLSON, PILUSO, RAYFIELD, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, VEGA PEDERSON, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILLIAMSON, WITT – Relating to assistance for community college students; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys to Department of Community Colleges and Workforce Development to be expended for grant program that

distributes moneys to community colleges to increase number of underserved, low-income and first-generation college-bound students who enroll in community college and make progress toward degree or certificate.

HB 3064 By Representative MCLANE – Relating to lists of electors.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits distribution of list of electors that indicates whether elector cast ballot in election until day after date of election.

HB 3065 By Representative JOHNSON – Relating to energy efficiency rating systems for energy conservation projects; prescribing an effective date.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Department of Energy to approve energy efficiency rating system for use by certain applicants seeking tax credit certification.

HB 3066 By Representative JOHNSON – Relating to degree programs at Eastern Oregon University; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Eastern Oregon University to develop pilot program for fixed cost bachelor's degrees.

HB 3067 By Representative JOHNSON – Relating to partnerships with private entities for career and technical education; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to distribute strategic investment moneys to regional partnerships dedicated to improving educational outcomes to expand upon existing partnerships with private sector entities and develop new partnerships with private sector entities to increase opportunities in career and technical education.

HB 3068 By Representative JOHNSON – Relating to energy source conversion programs; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study and develop recommendations for legislation to encourage transition to cleaner burning woodstoves or other cleaner home heating options.

HB 3069 By Representative JOHNSON – Relating to standards for teacher education; prescribing an effective date.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires teacher education institutions and teacher education programs to provide applicants with training related to teaching and testing reading as condition of being approved.

HB 3070 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to reduction in period of supervision.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies that reduction of period of supervision for certain convicted persons applies to probation or local control post-prison supervision.

HB 3071 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to school curriculum; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve effectiveness of curriculum of public schools.

HB 3072 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to education; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve effectiveness of public education for kindergarten through grade 12.

HB 3073 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to assessments; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve effectiveness of statewide assessments.

HB 3074 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to the education of nonresident students; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve ability of student to attend school in school district in which student is not resident.

HB 3075 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to career and technical education; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve delivery of career and technical education.

HB 3076 By Representative BARTON, Senator GELSER – Relating to ground water that is used for domestic purposes.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires landlord of rental property with well that supplies ground water for domestic purposes to test well for contaminants at specified times.

HB 3077 By Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, WITT; Representatives HACK, HAYDEN, KENNEMER, NEARMAN, POST, SMITH – Relating to assistance animals.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates exemption from pet restriction in food establishments for assistance animal with assistance animal tag issued by local jurisdiction.

HB 3078 By Representative ESQUIVEL, Senator THATCHER; Representative NEARMAN – Relating to English as the official language of Oregon.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Makes English official language of state.

HB 3079 By Representative ESQUIVEL – Relating to audit of election expenses.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Secretary of State to conduct comprehensive independent audit of expenses associated with general elections.

HB 3080 By Representative ESQUIVEL – Relating to assessments that association of unit owners imposes on foreclosed residential real property.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires owner of foreclosed residential real property to provide owner's name and contact information to homeowners association, condominium board or other association of unit owners.

HB 3081 By Representative NATHANSON – Relating to regulation of manufactured structure dealers; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Consumer and Business Services to adopt by rule standards to address conflicts of interest of manufactured structure dealers that are also residential landlords.

HB3082 By Representative FREDERICK; Senator SHIELDS – Relating to nonprofit corporation low income housing; prescribing an effective date.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates alternative definition of "low income" for purposes of nonprofit corporation low income housing.

HB3083 By Representatives VEGA PEDERSON, KENY-GUYER, Senator DEMBROW; Representatives BARNHART, GREENLICK, LIVELY, REARDON, SMITH WARNER, Senator BEYER – Relating to regulation of employment.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Defines "wages" for certain wage claims.

HB3084 By Representative FAGAN -- Relating to withdrawal of property from newly incorporated city; declaring an emergency.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies authority for withdrawal of tract from City of Damascus if city did not adopt, and cause to be acknowledged, comprehensive plan and land use regulations within four years after incorporation of city.

HB3085 By Representative FAGAN -- Relating to the disincorporation of the City of Damascus.

2-20(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that City of Damascus shall surrender its charter, disincorporate and cease to exist.

HB3086 By Representative FAGAN -- Relating to the distribution of excess moneys in the funds of the City of Damascus; declaring an emergency.

Requires City of Damascus to distribute to ad valorem property taxpayers all excess moneys remaining in city funds after satisfying all outstanding legal debts and obligations of city.
