HOUSE BILLS

HB 3087 By Representative GREENLICK, Senator SHIELDS – Relating to health practitioner referrals; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes requirement for Oregon Health Authority to prescribe rules regarding health practitioner referrals.

HB 3088 By Representative BOONE (at the request of Sarah Nebeker) – Relating to personal injury protection benefits.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases minimum length of time that personal injury protection benefits are available after motor vehicle accident.

HB 3089 By Representatives BENTZ, WITT -- Relating to mining.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to conduct study on increasing local revenues from mining operations and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before September 15, 2016.

HB 3090 By Representatives BENTZ, WITT -- Relating to mining.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to conduct study on consolidating permit processes for mining and present report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly related to environment and natural resources on or before September 15, 2016.

HB 3091 By Representatives BENTZ, JOHNSON; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, NEARMAN, SMITH, WHISNANT -- Relating to carbon emission reduction programs; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Environmental Quality to conduct study of State of Oregon's return on investments, for period beginning July 1, 2005, and ending June 30, 2014, in programs adopted by state to reduce carbon emissions.

HB 3092 By Representatives BENTZ, HACK; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HEARD, KRIEGER, POST, SMITH, WHISNANT, Senator FERRIOLI -- Relating to online impersonation.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates crime of online impersonation.

HB 3093 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, OLSON, POST, STARK, WHISNANT -- Relating to firearms.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides persons licensed to carry concealed handgun in another state with protections provided to persons with Oregon concealed handgun license if other state has no less stringent handgun competency requirement than Oregon.

HB 3094 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, POST, STARK, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senator FERRIOLI -- Relating to highway speed.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases speed limit to 75 miles per hour for certain vehicles on interstate highways.

HB 3095 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, WHISNANT -- Relating to reports of death; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Registrar of Center for Health Statistics to adopt rules requiring each report of death submitted to Center for Health Statistics to identify whether known cause of death is related to using marijuana or product into which cannabinoids have been incorporated.

HB 3096 By Representatives BENTZ, SMITH; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, KRIEGER, MCKEOWN, NEARMAN, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, WILSON, WITT, Senator FERRIOLI -- Relating to study of mineral resource potential in Oregon.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Department of Geology and Mineral Industries to conduct study of mineral resource potential in Oregon and present report to Legislative Assembly by February 1 of each odd-numbered year.

HB 3097 By Representative BENTZ -- Relating to a prospective employee's criminal information; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Makes inquiring after applicant's conviction history and certain activities related to conducting criminal records check on prospective employee unlawful employment practice.

HB 3098 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS -- Relating to domestic violence; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires law enforcement units to adopt written policies relating to domestic violence by police officers.

HB 3099 By COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PROTECTION AND GOVERNMENT EFFECTIVENESS -- Relating to state information technology; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Transfers duties, functions, powers and responsibilities related to information technology, information resources, information systems, geographic information systems, geographic data, telecommunications and related services from Oregon Department of Administrative Services to State Chief Information Officer.

HB 3101 By Representative POST, Senator THATCHER -- Relating to a health care provider's debt collection activities while a claim is pending; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits individual who has filed claim with insurer for benefits under insurance policy or brought action to seek compensation or damages for injury individual suffered as result of accident or crime to send written notice to health care provider to which individual owes debt for medical care or medical services stating that claim or action is pending.

HB3102 By Representatives KENY-GUYER, GREENLICK – Relating to studded tires.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits use of studded tires.

HB3103 By Representative MCKEOWN, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to qualified equity investments; prescribing an effective date.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands conditions necessary for qualified community development entity to earn tax credit for qualified equity investment.

HB3104 By Representative MCKEOWN, Senator ROBLAN; Representatives BOONE, GOMBERG, Senator WHITSETT – Relating to authority of ports.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes ports to acquire and operate telecommunications infrastructure and facilities.

HB3105 By COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT – Relating to transportation; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Transportation for passenger rail programs and for transportation programs and services for elderly individuals and individuals with disabilities.

HB3106 By Representative MCKEOWN – Relating to the licensing of manufactured structure dealers.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates requirement that person licensed to sell manufactured structures deliver bond or letter of credit to Director of Department of Consumer and Business Services if person is real estate licensee in good standing and in compliance with requirement to acquire and maintain errors and omissions insurance.

HB3107 By Representative NEARMAN; Representatives BARRETO, BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, KRIEGER, POST, SMITH, SPRENGER, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WHITSETT – Relating to assistance animals in residential rental units.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows landlord to charge pet security deposit to tenant with disability for service animal or companion animal if landlord requests, and tenant does not provide, documentation that physician has recommended use of service animal or companion animal to mitigate symptoms or effects of disability.

HB3108 By Representative NEARMAN; Representatives BARRETO, ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, POST, SMITH, WEIDNER – Relating to use of the E-Verify employment verification system in public employment.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires state agencies and persons that contract with state agencies to use federal E-Verify employment verification system to verify employment eligibility of job applicants.

HB3109 By Representative WHISNANT – Relating to sex offender information.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires that information concerning sex offenders convicted of certain offenses be released on website maintained by Department of State Police.

HB3110 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to public employee retirement; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits public employer from agreeing to pay or provide retirement benefit to member of Public Employees Retirement System other than payments required or provided for in statutes governing retirement benefits of members of system.

HB3111 By Representative EVANS (at the request of Jeff Julum) – Relating to domestic terrorism.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates crime of domestic terrorism.

HB3112 By Representatives EVANS, PARRISH; Representatives BARKER, BOONE, ESQUIVEL, PILUSO, REARDON – Relating to tax credits for veterans services; prescribing an effective date.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income tax credit for member of military organization that contributes financial resources to Veterans' Educational Aid Account prior to dissolution.

HB3113 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to requirement of bond from employer.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires employer, including successor, lessee or purchaser, to post bond in certain wage claim cases.

HB3114 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to payment of claims made by injured workers.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows injured worker one year from date health benefit plan rejects claim for benefits to file workers' compensation claim.

HB3115 By Representative WITT (at the request of Eric McGuire) – Relating to guardians ad litem for children in family law proceedings.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits court in family law proceeding involving custody, parenting time or visitation to appoint guardian ad litem for minor child to protect child's best interests.

HB3116 By Representative WITT – Relating to Task Force on Including Disabled Veterans in the Preferred Worker Program; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study how to provide benefits for disabled veterans through preferred worker program and to make recommendations for legislation to include disabled veterans in preferred worker program.

HB3117 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to campaign finance disclosure; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates \$100 transaction limit before details of expenditures or contributions must be reported and made public.

HB 3118 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to community college attendance by high school students; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows certain students who have not received high school diploma to attend community college and to use moneys that would have paid for public school to be paid for books, tuition and fees.

HB 3119 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to work release programs; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Permits person in custody of Department of Corrections to enroll or participate in work release program for attendance at community college or private or public post-secondary institution of education, internships and apprenticeship programs.

HB 3120 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to defendants on supervision.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to create program by which certain persons may apply for reduction or waiver of moneys owed to department.

HB 3121 By Representatives HOLVEY, BUCKLEY – Relating to genetically engineered food; providing that this Act shall be referred to the people for their approval or rejection.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Makes legislative findings and declarations regarding genetically engineered food.

HB 3122 By Representative HOLVEY; Representative BUCKLEY – Relating to fish; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits farming, cultivation, incubation or inducement to spawn in this state of Atlantic salmon or genetically engineered fish that may come into contact with or spread contagious diseases to native anadromous fish.

HB 3123 By Representative HOLVEY; Representative BUCKLEY – Relating to the application of pesticides by aircraft.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits application of pesticide by aircraft except under terms and conditions of pest emergency declaration issued by State Department of Agriculture or State Forestry Department.

HB 3124 By Representative HOLVEY – Relating to consumer contracts that purport to limit a consumer's right to make certain statements; declaring an emergency.

2-23(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits consumer contract that limits consumer's right to make statement about company, product or service.
