- HB 3125** By Representative DAVIS; Representatives GILLIAM, HOYLE, MCLAIN, Senators EDWARDS, THOMSEN -- Relating to property tax exemption for food processing equipment; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Exempts from property taxation qualified machinery and equipment used to process grains, bakery products, milk and eggs.
- HB 3126** By Representative EVANS -- Relating to accelerated college credit programs; prescribing an effective date.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Establishes minimum education requirements for high school teachers of dual credit courses.
- HB 3127** By Representative EVANS; Representatives BARTON, DAVIS, ESQUIVEL, GILLIAM, HUFFMAN, NATHANSON, NOSSE -- Relating to expenditures from unemployment insurance-related funds; declaring an emergency.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Provides that amounts appropriated from any fund for unemployment insurance-related purposes and programs may not be expended for any purpose or program not directly related to purposes and programs authorized or required under provisions of unemployment insurance statutes.
- HB 3128** By Representative BARNHART; Representatives BUCKLEY, CLEM, EVANS, FREDERICK, HELM, KENY-GUYER, LIVELY, REARDON, TAYLOR -- Relating to Article XI-P bonds.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Authorizes State Board of Education to adopt variable ratios for local funds required to match capital grants and loans to school districts financed with Article XI-P general obligation bonds.
- HB 3129** By Representative BARNHART; Representatives FREDERICK, HELM, KENY-GUYER, LIVELY, NATHANSON, TAYLOR, WITT -- Relating to electric vehicle charging stations; declaring an emergency.

- Authorizes tenant to whom real estate has been leased by landlord to install and use electric vehicle charging station for personal, noncommercial use.
- HB 3130** By Representative MCKEOWN, Senator ROBLAN -- Relating to environmental protection.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Authorizes Environmental Quality Commission to adopt rules regarding inspection of new and existing sewage disposal systems, inspections of inland water bodies and increased access to inspector training and certification.
- HB 3131** By COMMITTEE ON HUMAN SERVICES AND HOUSING -- Relating to sexual exploitation of minors.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Creates crime of sexual exploitation of a minor.
- HB 3132** By Representatives SMITH WARNER, HELM -- Relating to public authority created to finance health-related facilities.

- Expands definition of "hospital facility" to include behavioral treatment facilities and family safety facilities in regard to local public authorities created to finance hospital facilities.

- HB 3138** By Representative NATHANSON -- Relating to justice courts.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Expands collection mechanisms that Collections Unit in Department of Revenue may use to collect judgments in criminal action assigned to unit by justice courts.
- HB 3139** By Representative HAYDEN -- Relating to mobile medical clinics; declaring an emergency.
- 2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.
- Establishes Task Force on Mobile Medical Clinics.

HB3140 By Representatives MCKEOWN, HEARD, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to predator damage control districts; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to determine feasibility of establishing local predator damage control districts.

HB3141 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to retail pet stores.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands retail pet store law to include establishment providing or offering to provide dog by lease or rental.

HB3142 By COMMITTEE ON BUSINESS AND LABOR – Relating to enforcing safeguards required for consumer personal data; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes private right of action for consumer that suffers ascertainable loss of money or property as result of person's failure to maintain reasonable safeguards to protect security, confidentiality and integrity of consumer's personal information.

HB3143 By Representative WHITSETT, Senator STEINER HAYWARD; Representatives BARKER, BENTZ, BOONE, DOHERTY, GOMBERG, GREENLICK, HUFFMAN, NOSSE, OLSON, PILUSO, SMITH, SPRENGER, VEGA PEDERSON – Relating to notices about help for victims of human trafficking; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Consumer and Business Services to develop and post on department's website model sign that provides information about help for victims of human trafficking.

HB3144 By Representative MCLANE; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, HEARD, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, POST, STARK, WHISNANT – Relating to tax credits for crop donation; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases, for purposes of tax credit allowed for crop donation, percentage of wholesale price allowed as amount of credit.

HB3145 By Representative MCLANE; Representative BUEHLER – Relating to home care workers; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires private pay home care workers registered with Home Care Commission to be subject to at least same standards as licensed in-home care agencies.

HB3146 By Representative MCLANE; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, SPRENGER, WHISNANT – Relating to the education of nonresident students; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate methods to improve ability of students to transfer to schools in other school districts.

HB3147 By Representative MCLANE; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, SPRENGER, WHISNANT – Relating to expedited development of industrial uses.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Land Conservation and Development to study and report on statewide land use planning system to identify and

evaluate opportunities to decrease time required to site and develop industrial uses.

HB3148 By Representatives MCLANE, WHITSETT, Senator COURTNEY; Representatives BENTZ, ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, SPRENGER, WHISNANT, Senator WHITSETT – Relating to financial assistance to households of lower income following a wildfire.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates Wildfire Damage Housing Relief Account within Oregon Housing Fund.

HB3149 By Representative MCLANE (at the request of Jodi Kerr) – Relating to the practice of nursing.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that registered nurse who is employed by public or private school may accept order from physician licensed to practice medicine or osteopathy in another state or territory of United States if order is related to treatment of student who has been enrolled at school for not more than 90 days.

HB3150 By Representative EVANS – Relating to tax incentives for investment in community food resources; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income tax credit for investment in community gardens and food banks.

HB3151 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to the sponsorship of a virtual public charter school.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires transfer of sponsorship for virtual public charter school to State Board of Education if average daily membership of virtual public charter school exceeds difference between average daily membership of school district that is sponsor of school and average daily membership of virtual public charter school.

HB3152 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to high occupancy vehicle lanes; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Transportation to remove high occupancy vehicle lane restrictions on Interstate 5 in Portland.

HB3153 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to state finance; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits Legislative Assembly from appropriating, allocating or otherwise authorizing expenditure of General Fund moneys, or moneys collected or received by Department of Transportation, for highway maintenance or sidewalk development within incorporated cities.

HB3154 By Representative HOLVEY – Relating to the consent required from a consumer with respect to the consumer's nonpublic personal information.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits person from collecting and disclosing, selling, sharing, giving, distributing or otherwise transferring consumer's nonpublic personal information unless person obtains informed and affirmative consent from consumer.

HB3155 By Representative HOLVEY – Relating to cancellation provisions in consumer contracts for services; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that consumer may cancel consumer contract for services and as consequence of cancellation pay only amount of subsidy, discount or other incentive offered as inducement to enter into contract and avoid future payments for services consumer does not receive as result of cancellation.

HB3156 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to enforcement of child support orders.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Changes circumstances under which enforcement of child support order may be suspended.

HB3160 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to drones.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Fish and Wildlife Commission to adopt rules prohibiting use of drones for hunting, tracking as aid to hunting, harassing, locating, scouting for or viewing certain animals.

HB3161 By Representative FAGAN – Relating to strategic industry partnerships; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Oregon EARN Program within Bureau of Labor and Industries.

HB3162 By Representative FAGAN – Relating to franchisees; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Franchisees to study relationships among franchisors, subfranchisors and franchisees to determine whether, for purposes of applying this state's tax laws and other laws, franchisee or subfranchisor is employee of franchisor.

HB3163 By Representatives WEIDNER, OLSON, BOONE, Senator ROBLAN – Relating to the dispensing of prescription drugs.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits prescription drug benefit program and health benefit plan from providing for reimbursement of quantity or supply of prescription drug dispensed by mail order pharmacy if prescription drug benefit program or health benefit plan does not provide for reimbursement of equivalent quantity or supply of prescription drug when prescription drug is dispensed by community pharmacy.

HB3164 By Representatives BENTZ, HOYLE; Representatives CLEM, EVANS, GILLIAM, HUFFMAN, KOMP, OLSON (at the request of Pacific Northwest Hardware and Implement Association) - Relating to retailer agreements for farm implement purchasing.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Specifies conditions under which farm implement supplier has good cause to terminate, cancel or not renew retailer agreement, or to change retailer's competitive circumstances.

HB3165 By Representative BENTZ – Relating to urban growth boundaries.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates statutory assignment of priority to certain land for purpose of inclusion of land within urban growth boundary.

HB3166 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, WHISNANT – Relating to teacher licensing.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to establish standards that allow certain persons to teach noncore courses.

HB3167 By Representative BENTZ; Representative OLSON - Relating to alcohol server permits.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Changes grounds for Oregon Liquor Control Commission to deny, suspend or revoke alcohol service permit.

HB3168 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives OLSON, POST – Relating to monetary obligations of defendants.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes court to waive previously imposed criminal fine if defendant demonstrates completion of drug treatment program.

HB3169 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER, WHISNANT – Relating to water; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Water Resources Department to conduct study to determine certain information regarding aquifers in this state.

HB3170 By Representatives BENTZ, OLSON; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, KRIEGER, STARK – Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows for blood to be taken to determine presence of controlled substances for purpose of Motorist Implied Consent Law.

HB3171 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives ESQUIVEL, KRIEGER – Relating to employee stock ownership plans.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows subtraction of amount of contributions to employee stock ownership plan from federal taxable income to extent includable in gross income for federal income tax purposes.

HB3172 By Representative BENTZ – Relating to collection of tax from elderly taxpayers; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Revenue to suspend collection of unpaid tax from elderly taxpayer, if certain conditions exist.

HB3173 By Representatives BENTZ, JOHNSON; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, KRIEGER, SMITH, WEIDNER, WHISNANT – Relating to research at public universities.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Higher Education Coordinating Commission to determine if any public universities have interest and ability to effectively conduct research and development on carbon reduction technologies.

HB3174 By Representative BENTZ; Representatives HEARD, NEARMAN, SMITH – Relating to discipline of pharmacists.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Board of Pharmacy to notify person subject to investigation for violation of proposed disciplinary action, to advise person to retain counsel and to impose penalties commensurate with offense.

HB3175 By Representatives WHISNANT, BARKER, OLSON, PILUSO – Relating to a task force on police officer safety; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Safety of Police Officers to study officer safety.

HB3176 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to climate protection; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Imposes fee on fossil fuel or fossil fuel-generated electricity to be paid by vendors.

HB3177 By COMMITTEE ON REVENUE – Relating to definition of revenue raising bill.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that bill that raises revenue solely by eliminating tax expenditure may pass with simple majority of both chambers.

HB3178 By Representatives SMITH, BENTZ – Relating to prescription drugs.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies requirements for pharmacy benefit managers with respect to maximum allowable cost lists.

HB3179 By Representatives SMITH, BENTZ – Relating to prescription drugs.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits pharmacy benefit manager from creating administrative or financial incentives to encourage insureds to obtain prescription drugs from mail order pharmacy instead of retail pharmacy.

HB3180 By Representative KOMP – Relating to assistance with attaining certification through the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows Teacher Standards and Practices Commission to use moneys in National Board Certification Fund to assist candidates with expenses related to attaining certification through National Board for Professional Teaching Standards.

HB3181 By Representative BOONE (at the request of Cannon Beach Academy) – Relating to public charter schools; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to evaluate effectiveness of laws regulating public charter schools.

HB3182 By Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to intergovernmental entities created to perform transportation-related functions; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands functions and authority of intergovernmental entities created to operate, maintain, repair and modernize transportation facilities to include management of ongoing transit operations and acquisition, operation, maintenance, repair and modernization of capital property used in transit operations.

HB3183 By Representative NOSSE – Relating to retirement credit under the Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows members of Oregon Public Service Retirement Plan to purchase retirement credit under plan for periods of service in uniformed services and seasonal and temporary employment with participating public employer.

HB3184 By Representative NATHANSON – Relating to contracts for student financial aid services; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Treasurer, in consultation with Higher Education Coordinating Commission, to negotiate contract to permit financial institution to provide student financial aid services to students enrolled at public universities or community colleges.

HB3185 By Representative KENNEMER – Relating to requirements for obtaining a mortgage loan originator's license; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts from requirement to obtain mortgage loan originator's license corporations, governments, governmental subdivisions or agencies, trusts, estates, partnerships, cooperatives or associations that, as sellers during any 12-month period, offer or negotiate terms for not more than three residential mortgage loans.

HB3186 By Representative WILLIAMSON; Representative HUFFMAN – Relating to outdoor mass gatherings; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Deletes language prohibiting advertising or promoting outdoor mass gathering without permit.

HB3187 By Representative KOMP – Relating to the Commission for the Blind; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends terms of office of members of Commission for the Blind.

HB3188 By Representative HEARD; Representatives KRIEGER, OLSON, Senator GIROD – Relating to a principal Act for predator control districts.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs State Department of Agriculture and State Forestry Department to jointly study and report on need for authority to create predator control districts for purpose of controlling harm to resource uses from predator depredation.

HB3189 By Representatives HACK, SMITH; Representatives BARRETO, BOONE, HAYDEN, JOHNSON, LIVELY, NEARMAN, PARRISH, SPRENGER, WEIDNER – Relating to income tax credits for individuals who provide volunteer emergency services; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Grants income tax credit to firefighters who provide volunteer services to rural fire protection districts or fire departments.

HB3190 By Representatives PARRISH, WHISNANT, WILLIAMSON, Senator DEVLIN; Representatives FREDERICK, GORSEK, GREENLICK, HUFFMAN, Senators GELSER, WINTERS (at the request of Oregon Lions Sight and Hearing Foundation) – Relating to vision screenings; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Department of Education to reimburse school districts for costs incurred in providing certain vision screenings.

HB3191 By Representative PARRISH, Senator BATES; Representative BUEHLER – Relating to incentives

for providing clinical training to medical students; prescribing an effective date.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income tax credit for physician providing clinical training to medical students during tax year.

HB3192 By Representative GREENLICK -- Relating to driving while under the influence of intoxicants.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires person arrested for driving while under influence of intoxicants to submit to fingerprinting within five days of arrest.

HB3193 By Representative GREENLICK -- Relating to leaded aircraft fuel; prescribing an effective date; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases license tax on leaded aircraft fuel.

HB3194 By Representative GREENLICK -- Relating to third party payments toward insurance premiums.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires insurers to accept third party payments for health insurance premiums.

HB3195 By Representative GREENLICK (at the request of Virginia Bruce) -- Relating to repairs required to be made by property owners; declaring an emergency.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that owner of abutting real property may not be required to maintain or repair sidewalks or curbs, and no lien for assessment for repairs may attach to abutting real property, if abutting real property does not have direct access to sidewalks or curbs.

HB3196 By Representative GREENLICK -- Relating to conflicts of interest.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits members of Legislative Assembly from participating in discussion or debate if actual conflict of interest exists.

HB3197 By Representative ESQUIVEL; Representatives KRIEGER, NEARMAN, Senators BAERTSCHIGER JR, THOMSEN -- Relating to state fish and wildlife commission appointments.

2-25(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes State Fish and Wildlife Commission Nominating Committee to assist Governor in appointing members to State Fish and Wildlife Commission.
