HOUSE BILLS

HB3157 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to enforceability of child support judgments.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Repeals outdated law regarding enforceability of child support judgments.

HB3158 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to multiple child support judgments.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Removes time limitation on judgments subject to laws regarding multiple child support judgments.

HB3159 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to dishonored checks for support paid to the Department of Justice.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates debt in favor of state for dishonored checks for support that are presented by third party on behalf of obligor or withholder.

HB3397 By Representatives NATHANSON, DAVIS; Senators BOQUIST, GELSER – Relating to election expenditures.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Expands definition of "political committee" to include person that makes aggregate expenditures of \$500 or more that refer to candidate, measure or political party within 60 calendar days of primary or general election.

HB3398 By Representative NATHANSON – Relating to ocean power districts.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes principal Act for organization of ocean power districts to contract with Department of State Lands to carry out certain duties related to regulation of ocean renewable energy facilities.

HB3399 By Representatives NATHANSON, SMITH, BUCKLEY; Representatives BARNHART, FREDERICK – Relating to standards required of local courts; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires justice court or municipal court to record criminal proceedings.

HB3400 By Representative BUCKLEY – Relating to marijuana; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Oregon Health Authority to develop and maintain database of information related to producing and processing of marijuana by persons responsible for marijuana grow sites under Oregon Medical Marijuana Program.

HB3401 By Representatives NATHANSON, GREENLICK; Representatives BARNHART, GOMBERG, Senators EDWARDS, GELSER, MONROE, SHIELDS – Relating to rail transportation efficiency; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Transportation to study options for improving on-time performance of passenger trains and freight trains.

HB3402 By Representatives BARRETO, WEIDNER; Representatives BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, EVANS, HACK, HAYDEN, HEARD, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, KRIEGER, LIVELY, NEARMAN, PARRISH, POST, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, Senators BATES, BOQUIST, GIROD, HANSELL, KNOPP, THOMSEN, WHITSETT – Relating to highway speed.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases speed limit for certain vehicles on specified portions of certain highways.

HB3403 By Representative BARRETO; Representatives BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, HACK, HEARD, HUFFMAN, KRIEGER, PARRISH, SMITH, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, Senators BOQUIST, GIROD, HANSELL, WHITSETT – Relating to reductions in corporate excise tax rates; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Reduces corporate excise tax rates for taxpayer that increases average monthly employment for tax year from immediately preceding tax year.

HB3404 By Representatives BARRETO, HACK; Representatives BUEHLER, ESQUIVEL, GILLIAM, HEARD, HUFFMAN, KENNEMER, KRIEGER, PARRISH, WEIDNER, WHISNANT, WHITSETT, Senators BOQUIST, GIROD, HANSELL, WHITSETT – Relating to exemptions from the corporate minimum tax; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Exempts unprofitable corporation from corporate minimum tax.

HB3405 By Representative GORSEK – Relating to governance of mass transit district; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Governor to consult with Metro before appointing director to governing board of mass transit district in metropolitan statistical area with population exceeding 400,000.

HB3406 By Representative GORSEK – Relating to police officers; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires law enforcement agency that employs police officer involved in use of deadly force, or officer who is victim of violence, to provide officer with paid leave, mental health support resources and other care after incident.

HB3407 By Representative GORSEK – Relating to child care at community colleges; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Higher Education Coordinating Commission to conduct survey of community college students related to students' child care needs.

HB3408 By Representative GORSEK – Relating to law enforcement experiences for students; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of Public Safety Standards and Training to provide students with opportunity to explore careers in law enforcement and to become familiar with law enforcement.

HB3409 By Representative REARDON, Senator DEMBROW; Representatives HELM, JOHNSON – Relating to State School Fund distributions for students in career and technical education; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Allows for additional weights in State School Fund distributions for students who are enrolled in and earn three or more credits for courses that are part of approved career and technical education program.

HB3421 By COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION – Relating to funding outdoor education; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes grant program for outdoor school programs to be administered by Oregon State University Extension Service.

HB3428 By Representatives CLEM, GILLIAM, KOMP, MCKEOWN, WITT, Senators JOHNSON, HANSELL, ROBLAN; Representatives BARKER, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, MCLANE, OLSON, PARRISH, WILLIAMSON, Senators BEYER, FERRIOLI, THOMSEN – Relating to aerial pesticide applicator certification.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates special certification requirements for pesticide applicators and public applicators who spray or otherwise apply pesticides by aircraft.

HB3429 By Representatives CLEM, GILLIAM, MCKEOWN, WITT, Senators JOHNSON, HANSELL, ROBLAN; Representatives BARKER, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, KOMP, MCLANE, OLSON, PARRISH, WILLIAMSON, Senators BEYER, FERRIOLI, THOMSEN – Relating to the Pesticide Analytical and Response Center.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires governing board of Pesticide Analytical and Response Center to adopt rules establishing standardized operating procedures for state agencies represented on governing board to receive and investigate complaints regarding use of pesticides.

HB3430 By Representatives CLEM, GILLIAM, KOMP, Senator HANSELL; Representatives BARKER, JOHNSON, MCKEOWN, MCLANE, PARRISH, WILLIAMSON, Senators BEYER, FERRIOLI, JOHNSON, THOMSEN – Relating to pesticide incidents.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires State Department of Agriculture to establish telephone line for persons concerned about misuse or alleged misuse of pesticides.

HB3431 By Representative CLEM – Relating to transferable development opportunities.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Extends deadline for owner of Metolius resort site to notify Department of Land Conservation and Development that owner has elected to seek approval of small-scale recreation community.

HB3436 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to the State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires that State Board of Parole and Post-Prison Supervision have five members.

HB3437 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to Certificates of Good Standing.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes procedures for applying for Certificate of Good Standing eligibility certification and petitioning for and issuance of Certificate of Good Standing.

HB3438 By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY – Relating to funding of legal aid; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that interest earned by Legal Aid Account shall be credited to account.

HB3443 By Representative HOYLE – Relating to investigating abuse; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates Office of Investigations in Department of Justice to conduct investigations and report on allegations of abuse committed against persons who are elderly or who have disabilities.

HB3444 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives HACK, POST – Relating to federal lands.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires United States to extinguish title to public lands and transfer title to public lands to state on or before December 13, 2018.

HB3445 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives BUEHLER, HEARD – Relating to nuclear energy; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Task Force on Nuclear Power.

HB3446 By Representative WEIDNER, Senator OLSEN – Relating to land use planning within Metro.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Eliminates role of metropolitan service district in statewide land use planning.

HB3447 By Representatives WEIDNER, LININGER; Representatives BOONE, BUEHLER, GOMBERG, HEARD, HOYLE, SMITH, STARK, Senators OLSEN, ROBLAN – Relating to land use planning for tsunami resilience.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Land Conservation and Development Commission to develop guidelines for tsunami resilience planning and to require local governments that have communities at substantial risk of experiencing severe impact from tsunami inundation to plan for tsunami resilience.

HB3448 By Representative WEIDNER – Relating to school finance; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Legislative Assembly to fund kindergarten through grade 12 public education at \$7.5 billion for biennium beginning July 1, 2015.

HB3449 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives BARRETO, HAYDEN, HEARD, POST, STARK – Relating to voter registration; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires evidence of citizenship for persons registering to vote for first time in this state.

HB 3450 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives BARRETO, ESQUIVEL, HEARD, JOHNSON, KRIEGER, PARRISH, POST, STARK, WHISNANT – Relating to ballot titles.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Limits ability of Legislative Assembly to prepare ballot title for measures to measures Legislative Assembly refers to people.

HB 3451 By Representatives WEIDNER, KENY-GUYER; Representatives BUEHLER, GILLIAM, GREENLICK, HAYDEN, HOYLE, LIVELY, NOSSE – Relating to reimbursement paid to freestanding birthing centers; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to reimburse freestanding birthing center based on median cost to birthing centers in this state of providing services.

HB 3452 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives JOHNSON, MCLANE, NEARMAN, SMITH, STARK, WHISNANT – Relating to indemnification; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that contract to allow use of property or facilities by nonprofit organization providing services to youths may not require individual participant to indemnify property owner for damages not caused by individual participant.

HB 3453 By Representatives WEIDNER, LIVELY; Representatives BARRETO, POST – Relating to capital investment tax credits; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates tax credit for investment in business that manufactures three-dimensional printers, medical equipment or medical devices.

HB 3454 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives GALLEGOS, GOMBERG, HEARD, POST – Relating to property taxes due on the homestead of certain seniors; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Sets limit on taxes due on homesteads of seniors with federal adjusted gross income not exceeding 300 percent of federal poverty level equal to total amount of taxes due for property tax year preceding first property tax year for which relief allowed.

HB 3455 By Representative WEIDNER, Senator ROBLAN; Representatives BARRETO, BARTON, BOONE, GOMBERG, KENNEMER, MCKEOWN, WITT – Relating to all-terrain vehicles.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases membership of All-Terrain Vehicle Grant Subcommittee.

HB 3456 By Representative WEIDNER – Relating to reimbursement for cost of care provided by direct entry midwife.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires health benefit plan to reimburse cost of care provided by licensed direct entry midwife at freestanding birthing center if care would be reimbursed if provided by licensed physician or certified nurse practitioner in hospital setting.

HB 3457 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives BARRETO, HAYDEN, HEARD, POST – Relating to a tax credit for rural employment; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates income tax credit for investment in business that hires employees in rural area.

HB 3458 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives BARRETO, HAYDEN, HEARD, STARK – Relating to sex-selective abortions; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Prohibits performance of late-term sex-selective abortion.

HB 3459 By Representative HELM; Representatives BARNHART, DOHERTY, FREDERICK, LININGER, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER, TAYLOR, WITT – Relating to outdoor recreation.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases frequency of days for which State Fish and Wildlife Commission may authorize persons to angle for fish or take shellfish without licenses or tags.

HB 3460 By Representative HOYLE – Relating to persons with disabilities; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Department of Human Services to adopt rules for licensing of stabilization and crisis units that house persons with developmental disabilities.

HB 3461 By Representative EVANS – Relating to the staffing level of the Office of Emergency Management; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Office of Emergency Management of Oregon Military Department to increase staffing level of office to better coordinate and facilitate private sector and governmental response to, and recovery from, natural and human-caused emergencies.

HB 3462 By Representative EVANS – Relating to a tax credit for wine marketing activity; prescribing an effective date.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies credit against wine privilege tax for marketing activity by allowing credit for promotion of specific brands of wine or wine products and by increasing percentage of costs allowed as credit.

HB 3463 By Representative EVANS – Relating to state financial administration; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Authorizes issuance of Article XI-Q bonds for Oregon Military Department headquarters facilities.

HB 3464 By Representative HAYDEN – Relating to health care; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes task force to study financing and delivery of health care in this state and make recommendations regarding legislative changes to ensure that quality health care is delivered in cost-effective manner.

HB 3465 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to State School Fund distributions for English as a second language programs; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Modifies distributions of State School Fund moneys to school districts for student enrolled in English as second language program.

HB3466 By Representative WILLIAMSON – Relating to contact with crime victims.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Provides that release decision for defendant charged with sex crime or crime constituting domestic violence must include order prohibiting attempted contact with victim and third-party contact with victim while defendant is in custody.

HB3467 By Representative WILLIAMSON – Relating to crime.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Creates hearsay exception for certain audio recordings of certified interpreter translating witness statement in criminal matter.

HB3468 By Representative WILLIAMSON – Relating to crime.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Adds threatening to cause physical injury to animal to induce other person to engage in conduct as manner of committing crime of coercion.

HB3469 By Representative WILLIAMSON – Relating to crime.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Increases penalty for crime of strangulation when committed knowing victim was pregnant.

HB3470 By Representative BARNHART – Relating to greenhouse gas emissions.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Environmental Quality Commission to adopt by rule statewide greenhouse gas emissions limits for years 2020 and 2050 and to adopt interim statewide greenhouse gas emissions limits consistent with 2050 limit every five years.

HB3471 By Representatives BARNHART, LININGER; Representatives GALLEGOS, NOSSE, SMITH WARNER – Relating to payment of wages by certain employers; providing for revenue raising that requires approval by a three-fifths majority.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Imposes fee on certain large employers who pay employees less than specified amount.

HB3472 By Representative PARRISH – Relating to land reserve designations in Hamlet of Stafford.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Directs Clackamas County and Metro to review adequacy of lands in Hamlet of Stafford that are designated as urban reserves and rural reserves and to report finding to Legislative Assembly.

HB3473 By Representative KENY-GUYER, Senators EDWARDS, GELSER – Relating to high priority chemicals of concern for children's health; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to establish and maintain list of designated high priority chemicals of concern for children's health used in children's products and to periodically review and revise list.

HB3474 By Representative READ – Relating to state trust lands.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes Trust Lands Transfer Commission.

HB3475 By Representatives DAVIS, READ; Representatives BARKER, BARTON, CLEM, DOHERTY, EVANS, GOMBERG, HOYLE, HUFFMAN, KOMP, NOSSE, RAYFIELD, REARDON, TAYLOR, WILLIAMSON, Senators BATES, BOQUIST, DEMBROW, EDWARDS, GELSER, HASS, MONNES ANDERSON, MONROE, PROZANSKI, RILEY, SHIELDS, STEINER HAYWARD, THOMSEN – Relating to Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Enacts Interstate Compact for Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote.

HB3476 By Representatives LININGER, SPRENGER, OLSON, Senators GELSER, WINTERS, PROZANSKI; Representatives BARKER, GILLIAM, HUFFMAN, JOHNSON, PILUSO, READ, TAYLOR, VEGA PEDERSON, WILLIAMSON, Senators BOQUIST, DEVLIN, HANSELL, KRUSE, ROBLAN – Relating to confidential communications; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Establishes privilege in civil, criminal, administrative and school proceedings for certain communications between persons seeking services related to domestic violence, sexual assault or stalking and victim services programs and advocates.

HB3477 By Representative FREDERICK – Relating to pilot projects for the delivery of mental health services; declaring an emergency.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Requires Oregon Health Authority to operate pilot projects in no fewer than six counties to test effectiveness of having coordinated care organizations contract with mental health providers to provide mental health services.

HB3478 By Representatives PILUSO, PARRISH, REARDON, Senator ROBLAN; Representatives BARKER, BOONE, CLEM, DAVIS, EVANS, GOMBERG, HOLVEY, KOMP, RAYFIELD, WEIDNER, WILSON, WITT, Senators BOQUIST, JOHNSON, THOMSEN – Relating to products that contain synthetic plastic microbeads.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Phases in prohibition on manufacture and sale of personal care products and over-the-counter drugs that contain synthetic plastic microbeads.

HJM 16 By Representatives WEIDNER, HOYLE, WILLIAMSON; Representatives BARRETO, BOONE, GILLIAM, HACK, HELM, KENNEMER, KENY-GUYER, MCLANE, NOSSE, POST, READ, VEGA PEDERSON, WITT – Urging Congress to work with Turkish diplomats, the European Union and NATO allies to stop mass arrests and detainment of journalists in Turkey.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Urges Congress to work with Turkish diplomats, European Union and NATO allies to stop mass arrests and detainment of journalists in Turkey.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTIONS

HJR 30 By Representative WEIDNER; Representatives ESQUIVEL, HAYDEN, KRIEGER, NEARMAN, STARK, WHISNANT – Proposing amendment to Oregon Constitution relating to individuals' rights to harvest wildlife.

3-2(H) First reading. Referred to Speaker's desk.

Proposes amendment to Oregon Constitution to preserve individuals' rights to hunt or fish, including through use of traditional methods.
